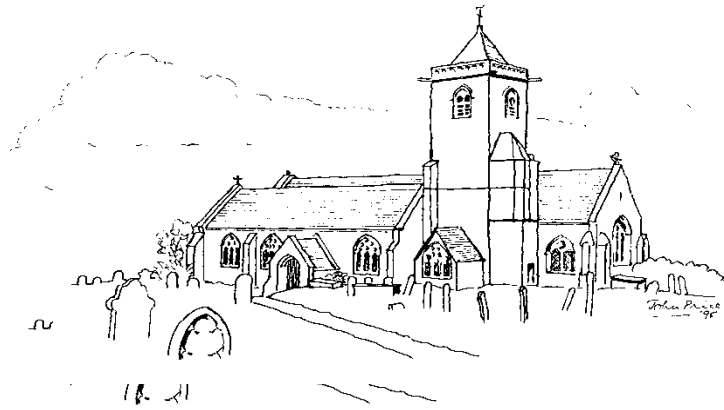

Dear friends
