Dear friends,

As we get older and more set in our ways it gets increasingly harder to “turn over a new leaf” and determine to do better. To do so, we have always needed examples to inspire us and people have always elevated ordinary people to the level of heroes and heroines, put them on pedestals, and sought to be more like them.

There are many who revere politicians, businessmen and women, sportsmen and women, philosophers, writers, anyone who has overcome great handicaps in life. It is the same reason why Christians revere the Saints, seeing them as primarily an example to be followed, however imperfectly.

Hers was a life well lived. A Christian life that serves as an example to us all.
