

OTTERTON PARISH COUNCIL

The next meeting of Otterton Parish Council will take place on **11th September** in Otterton Village Hall. The meeting will be preceded at 7pm by a presentation by Dr Sam Bridgewater of Clinton Devon Estates on a Landscape Recovery bid that Clinton Devon Estates are making to DEFRA.

In September 2023, Clinton Devon Estates plans to submit a Landscape Recovery proposal to Defra for funding under the government's new Environmental Land Management Schemes (ELMS). Landscape Recovery Round Two (www.gov.uk): Since Brexit, ELMS is the primary route for government to support environmental enhancement in farmed landscapes. Landscape Recovery projects will contribute to national priorities including net zero, biodiversity and water quality. All residents are welcome to attend and ask questions.

The usual Parish Council meeting will continue at 7.30pm. If you have any items for the agenda, please contact the Clerk by 4th September.
