

2019 Statistics

We recently submitted our "2019 Statistics for Mission Return" to Exeter Diocese and share some of this information:
On average, 32 people (>16 years old) attend Church on a usual Sunday.
76 people attended on Easter Day.

76 people attended on Easter Day. 310 came to the Christmas Eve service and 32 on Christmas Day.

There were 3 baptisms, 4 marriages and 5 funeral services held in the Church in 2019.

East Budleigh The Friends' 2019 target

was to raise £10,000 towards the costs of necessary repairs to the Church Tower and, having done all the financial calculations, we met this target – this is the highest amount raised in a year by the Friends since the it was formed in about 2007. The Friends is transferring £10,000 to cover the cost of the Tower works: this sum covers the Tower works completed in 2019 and covers/contributes to the Tower works in 2020.

University of Exeter Choir – Christmas Concert December 2019

The Chapel Choir's Christmas Concert in the Church was a superb evening - the photo below gives you a flavour of the event. The Chapel Choir's singing was amazing encompassing a wide range of pieces from the spine-tingling "O Magnum Mysterium" to the very lively "The Twelve Days of Christmas".



Tony Venning gave a reading of Sir John Betjeman's poem "Christmas"; Paul Kurowski read Godfrey Rust's modern take on the angel's discussion with the shepherds in "The (goodwill) of the people". The Friends Committee members served the refreshments in the interval and people had a chance to stretch their legs and chat with friends.

We sold 170 tickets and took a retiring collection. After expenses, the final contribution to the Friends funds for the evening amounted to just over £1,570.

Our Churchyard

Tuesday 2nd June - "Bioblitz" in the Churchyard

Our Bioblitz will be an attempt to record all the living species within the Churchyards: grasses, flowers, sedges, lichens, ferns, trees, birds, mammals, insects, reptiles ... the details are being finalised but we will probably be monitoring from 10.00 to 16.00. Anyone can come along to help.

Working with Clinton Devon Estates, we hope to have specialists, Drake's School, the Exmouth U3A Natural History and Botany groups, and volunteers conduct the field study during the day. We expect to have the Church Hall available for refreshments and reference books/points.

We are hoping to organise an evening walk and talk covering moths and bats around this time.

The reasons for doing the Bioblitz are: we can improve what we do in the Churchyards if we know what we have (the last survey was completed in 1997); and to work with Drake's School and the wider community.

We will provide more details in the March Parish News.

The next stage is a walk along the path below Houndton Ridge to arrive at Holn Brake where we enter Yarner Wood again. After a short walk through the wood we reach the car park. CALING ALL MEMBERS!

We look forward to seeing as many members as possible to present our accounts and report on another very successful year. There will also be an opportunity for members to ask any questions and contribute to the development of the shop.

If you are not a member, do consider joining for a one-off payment of only £5. You can join through the shop or on the evening of the AGM.

The meeting is also an opportunity to thank all our wonderful volunteers at the heart of our great community. We are always keen to attract new people. If you have wondered about joining our team, please do call in and see Mel, Anne or Liz and we would be very happy to show you around and welcome you to the team!

GREEN NEWS

We have now installed a compost bin at the shop for all our garden waste, as well as the odd few items of wastage from our fruit and veg range. Our loose fruit and veg were popular, but our wastage rates were enormous. We hope that we will soon be producing useful compost.

We are making great strides with minimising our packaging and ensuring that it can all be recycled.

We already recycle all our cardboard, thanks to our volunteers, and will now be recycling all our plastic waste and bottles.

Don't forget that we also offer free refills of tap water to our customers.

WHAT'S IN THE SHOP?

Valentine's Day: The shop will be stocking our usual Valentine's fare of chocolates, wine, bubbles and a few flowers for your Valentines gifts. We also have cards for this and all other occasions. For a special occasion such as Valentine's Day, why not buy one of our handmade cards — made in the village, they can even be pre-ordered and Lynda will make every effort to make them to your personal requirements. A real one-off!

New Year sniffles? It seems like everyone is struggling to keep the bugs at bay this year — so a timely reminder that we have a selection of medicines and remedies for your coughs and colds, sore throats, aches and pains.

So whether its cough medicine, paracetamol, Lemsips or just boxes of tissues and throat sweets you are in need of — we have a plentiful supply. For your little ones we also have Calpol, Tixylix, Sudocrem and Vaseline.

WINE SALES BOOMING!

Last year our sales of alcohol exceeded £20,000. This is up more than 17% on last year and is double the annual sales of a few years ago.

Wine sales were particularly buoyant, but spirits and our local beers and ciders also showed an increase. We are stocking a wide variety of wines, from different grapes and countries. We believe our prices are very competitive ranging from under £5 to over £10 a bottle. Perhaps not surprisingly the bulk of our sales are the lower priced ones, although our Argentinean Malbec and New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc are very popular.

We try to introduce new wines from time to time and we are always open to new suggestions from our customers.

Before and after photos of 122metre section of mixed hedge, which was planted by East Budleigh villagers in 1984 and recently laid, with help from volunteers and Bicton College students.

Laying hedges is a traditional method of hedgerow management. Mature trees are retained and hedge species like hazel laid down at ground level



which encourages a denser stock proof hedge. New growth will be seen from

the laid sections (pleachers) this spring. Thicker hedges provide better habitat for a range of species and can improve biodiversity.

Many people have commented on how the work has let more light in as well as opening up far reaching views. Timber for firewood was stacked for villagers to collect and the

smaller material burned. Thank you to Peter and Di Wastenage for providing access to the rear of the hedge for a bonfire site. The cost of a professional hedge layer was supported through generous donations from East Budleigh

with Bicton Parish Council and Clinton Devon Estates. Please do take a look and continue to enjoy the recreation ground and public footpath. However, until the hedgerow grows up, we would ask all dog owners to ensure their pets do not cross the laid hedge into the field beyond. Thank you.

Giving The property of the Heaths: as I write this the wind is howling around the cabin and rain is smashing horizontally at the windows! a home So what a season, we have struggled along with our winter management in the most appalling conditions, hats off, (no pun intended) to our residential volunteers who have battled on all in the spirit of nature conservation, we have been clearing encroaching scrub from the reserve in many locations, most recently we have been opening up the tracks on one of our butterfly transect routes, here we hope to allow more light to the track edges and improve the floristic diversity of the area, hopefully improving the conditions for many of the butterfly species.

Just before Christmas we had a local contractor on site with his swing shovel digger creating areas of bare ground, we have some very rare invertebrates which require the open sandy areas and patches of pioneer heath, this is one way that we are able to create and maintain this particular type of habitat, we hope to do more soon.

Our grazing animals have also been keeping us busy with moving groups between different areas on the site, we have recently brought the Dartmoor ponies back from Killerton Estate, a National Trust site close to Exeter. These have ended up back on the reserve at Aylesbeare. We have moved a few of the other groups of ponies about to help target management in particular spots, this also helps with lookering the animals over the Christmas period as you could otherwise spend hours looking for livestock over the whole reserve!!

We welcome Megan who joins us for six months and to Leo who is coming out several days a week, Aaron has moved on to Forestry England and Becky has stepped up to help keep the wheels turning with both our daily and residential volunteers, so we are having a few staff changes on the reserve, as the nights start to shorten we look forward to a little less rain and some warmer temperatures. Update on the Lower Otter Restoration Project

In January, a significant milestone was achieved in the delivery of the Lower Otter Restoration Project (LORP).

Planning approval was granted for the construction of a new cricket ground to the north of South Farm Cottages Budleigh Salterton. The long-term future of the cricket club's current home at Ottermouth has been under threat due to the impacts of flooding and poor drainage, with the club flooded as recently as December. The planning decision means that should the wider restoration project go ahead as planned, an important sporting, recreational and social focal point for the community will not be lost.

This restoration project is being developed by the *Environment Agency* and *Clinton Devon Estates*. It has broad and ambitious aims, attempting to attain more sustainable management of the River Otter, its estuary and its immediate surroundings in the face of rapid climate changes and rising sea levels. Key aims of the project include: maintaining and securing existing public footpaths; securing vehicle access to the residents and businesses at South Farm, along South Farm Road; reconnecting the river to its floodplain, allowing it to flood and drain naturally; stabilising the former domestic refuse tip to protect against future erosion; finding a more sustainable site for Budleigh Salterton Cricket Club; increasing the area of rare inter-tidal habitat with significant biodiversity benefits, including for birdlife. Details on the project can be found at www.lowerotterrestortionproject.co.uk

Although the planning decision on the cricket club's relocation is very welcome, before LORP can proceed, planning approval is also required for the broader scheme. Detailed plans are being developed for submission to the planning authorities for consideration in the first half of this year. Prior to submission, some technical issues still need to be resolved. Most critical is ensuring that South West Water infrastructure is protected, including an important freshwater borehole south of Otterton. Detailed plans for the scheme will be shared with the public once these have been developed. This is unlikely to be before Easter.

January is also a very significant month, as together with an allied partner scheme in the Saâne Valley, Normandy, France, we will hear the outcome of a funding application to the Interreg VA Programme (a European Funding stream) to support some of the project delivery costs. The final delivery of the project, including the relocation of *Budleigh Salterton Cricket Club*, will depend on both us and our French partners attaining planning approval for the whole scheme and securing funding. Other funding partners include the *Environment Agency* and *Clinton Devon Estates*.

East Budleigh with Bicton WI meet on the 2nd Tuesday each month (except August) 7-9pm in the Village Hall. New members are always welcome to join us.



Roger Conant 400

A steering group has been formed, known as the RC 400, which is looking to give Roger Conant wider recognition for what he achieved in his lifetime. This begs the question..... Who was Roger Conant?

Roger Conant was born in the Mill House, East Budleigh, on 9th April 1592 (since demolished but was situated just above Hill Farm). He was the youngest son of Richard Conant, a miller, who had married into one of the leading merchant families of Colyton.

As the youngest son of a family of eight, Roger realised he had to make his own way in the world and so left East Budleigh for London around 1610, (following his brother Christopher, who belonged to the Grocers' Guild) where he became a salter, a trade concerned with the preserving of meat and fish. In 1618 he married Sarah Horton and they had a son, Caleb, in 1622. In the following year the family made the choice to move to America where Roger led a small group of settlers to an abandoned native Indian settlement called Naumkeag. To sustain the settlement funding and provisions were raised in England and in 1626, at a Thanksgiving ceremony Naumkeag was renamed Salem, (now a city in the US state of Massachusetts).

Conant was chosen as the first governor of these settlers and was one of the first two Salem representatives elected to the colony's general court of legislature. Notably he was renowned and respected for his altruism, particularly towards the native Indian communities. He died in Beverly, Massachusetts 1679. Roger Conant was active in the affairs of Salem throughout his life and his profound contributions to the foundation of Salem has been honoured by the city, not least by a statue erected and situated near the city hall.

The aim of the RC 400 Group is to reflect the life and achievements of Roger Conant, another famous person born in East Budleigh, (Sir Walter Raleigh is better known of course). The target date for a celebration is 2023, the 400th anniversary of his departure from England. Various ideas for the event are mooted and those which seem to be the most viable will be floated in later editions of this magazine. Pleasingly, executives from Salem City Hall have expressed a keen interest in joining our initiative.
