
Thank you to the church Spring cleaners!

The Church Matters

Parochial Church Council (PCC) members

At the time of writing this article (Wednesday 10th April), the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) have not taken place (Wednesday 24th April); however, we will have a new PCC. The list of the PCC members will be posted on the Church porch notice board.

Thanks go to Sue Pyne and Richard Eglin for all their years and work on the PCC.

Lent Lunch

Thanks to Marilyn Hobbs, Maria Malinowska, Jane Buckland-Wright, Penny Kurowski and Hanneke Coates for providing five very tasty soups when All Saints hosted the Lent Lunch on Wednesday 10th April in the Church Hall. The turnout of about 16-20 was disappointing but we recognised that many other events were happening at the same time, eg, St. Peter's had a "Loaves and Fishes" event!!!

North Aisle Ceiling

The Church Architect made the final inspection visit on Wednesday 10th April and was very satisfied with the work completed. This meant that the scaffolding could come down, our two contractors clean-up on Friday 12th all in time for our Church Spring Clean on Saturday 13th April. We completed on schedule before Easter and await the final invoices to close-out the work.

Thank you for your patience with the scaffolding over the last 23 weeks (I think).

Maintenance Visit and Tower Inspection

We have employed West Access
Conservation (WAC) to undertake two
maintenance visits per year and a tower
inspection – this happened on 2nd and 3rd
April. You may have seen two men abseiling
down the tower ... if not, see the photos.

As standard, during the maintenance visit, WAC will undertake cleaning and clearance and fix any issues on the day, eg, slipped slates and small issues where WAC has the appropriate materials with them, and provide reports for our logbooks.

All the rainwater gutters, downpipes and drains were cleared as far as possible in the case of some of the soakaway drains

The areas of the Church requiring immediate attention are:

- The four stays of the flagpole
- Broken slate on the Nave south central pitch
- Missing ridging tile above the Nave
- The Nave North dormer window is rotten allowing water ingress
- Slipped slates on the North Aisle roof in two places
- Punctured lead valley above the North Aisle (probably as a result of previous repair work on the roof)
- Punctured lead valley above the Vestry two temporary resin repairs stopped the immediate ingress of water into the Vestry but more work is needed

The areas requiring attention within 12 months are:

- The Nave South dormer window
- Fractured masonry of the cross finial at the east end of the Nave ridge
- Loose mortar around the outlet at the west end of the North Aisle
- South Aisle valley lead creep
- Spalling masonry on the east-side copings of the Vestry
- Some of the copper flashing is missing over the Vestry
- The west end of the Vestry, there has been some masonry movement

There are other areas requiring attention in 2 and 5 years listed and these will be included in our long-term planning. continued...

continued from page 4... We have asked WAC to provide quotations for all the works – potentially these works will provide suitable targets for the Friends of All Saints Church.

During the Tower survey a number of issues were identified and we have asked WAC to confirm the priority of the works and provide quotations.

"East Budleigh's Got Talent"

Wow - East Budleigh has got talent - what a very entertaining afternoon and evening! The acts ranged from a brass fanfare, horn guartet and solo trumpet, through hand bells and singers ranging from a Handel aria and a Song from Les Miserables to emotional, self-penned guitar and songs, via amazing performances on the piano and a poetry recital, to a barbershop octet and two chances for audience participation courtesy of the Open the Book team and Paul Painter. Paul had written the East Budleigh Song which cleverly covered most of East Budleigh's famous sons, most of the roads and events historical and current with a catchy chorus that we sang six times!

We welcome any feedback from you about the event and any ideas how to improve it as people are already planning next year's event! The event raised over £560 for our much needed funds.

Spring Talk: 'Kandahar, Afghanistan: Life, Death and Things in Between' by Andrew Canning OBE at 19.30 on Tuesday 21st May in the Village Hall. A former Royal Marines officer, Andrew spent 4 years as a civilian managing and delivering a training/mentoring programme for the Afghan Police and Army in the Taliban hotbed of southern Afghanistan (Kandahar) from 2010 to 2014. Kandahar Province is the 'birthplace' of the Taliban and their spiritual home: it is their crucial battleground that has seen some of the fiercest fighting since 2001. Andrew's illustrated talk will deliver a frank and noholds barred account of life in Kandahar,

including the daily challenges encountered. It will focus on the considerable role played by civilians in conflict zones, in support of the military.

Pulling together...

Every year, around this time I write about invasive plants, especially Himalayan balsam, Impatiens glandulifera and what Clinton Devon Estate and dedicated local volunteers are doing to manage the spread of alien invaders. But are we making a difference and is there any point in even trying to control this beautiful but harmful riverbank thug?

Himalayan balsam spreads very quickly along watercourses. Growing up to three metres tall it outcompetes native wildflowers, and when it dies back in winter, leaves banks prone to erosion by flood water. Undoubtably its pink flowers, seen from June to October are a good nectar source for bees who enjoy its abundant nectar but at the expense of our native plants. Himalayan balsam is listed on Schedule 9 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act in England and Wales which makes it an offence to plant or allow to spread onto neighbouring land. Balsam can be controlled by spraying with weed killer, brush cutting or by pulling out whole plants by hand. Staff and contractors employ all these methods.

The River Otter, like water bodies across the region is heavily infested with Himalayan balsam. Each plant can produce 800 seeds which when ripe will be launched over several metres from explosive seed pods. Lying at the end of 32 kilometres of river, the banks and flood plains of the lower Otter will always be susceptible to seed washing down from any up-stream plants. Clearing the flood plain of balsam, before upstream areas are balsam free is almost impossible, as these areas are un-defendable. Instead a more productive

strategy is to focus on eradicating balsam from the top of the tributaries down. Although away from public knowledge progress here is positive but takes time.

From the middle of next month scores of volunteers will set out again to reduce Himalayan balsam's impact on the environment. Work will continue on the brooks which flow easterly from the commons before joining the river. Village volunteers at Newton Poppleford do a great job on the Back Brook in a challenging environment. The Otter Valley Association (OVA) mobilise their volunteer efforts twice weekly and after many years are seeing balsam on the brook in Colaton Raleigh reach an easily manageable state even in the swampy sections. Pebblebed Heath Conservation Trust volunteers sweep the Budleigh Brook focussing on a boggy, wooded stretch at Yettington and target hotspots to stop the spread to SSSI heathland and hedgerows near public rights of way.

Himalayan balsam arrived in Britain in 1839 around the same time as John Rolle and Lady Louisa, like other Victorian gardeners were developing their own impressive plant collection for their garden at Bicton (now open to public as Bicton Park botanic gardens). Today, the Bicton estate falls into three separate ownerships; Bicton Arena, Bicton Park and across the Great Lake covering just under half of the parish's 1184 acres, lies the main house and its grounds which are owned and managed by Bicton College.

Local people are encouraged to get involved, pull what they can before plants produce seed, leaving stems to dry out and to report any balsam 'hot spots' they see in the lower Otter valley to their parish councils, the OVA or Clinton Devon Estates. Pulling is hugely satisfying and easy for....

.... almost anyone. On Wednesday 19 June, many volunteer pullers will meet to tackle a new area of wet woodland at Bicton College, where local landowners, environmental experts and volunteers are keen to share experience from nearly a decade of management in the lower Otter valley to help the next generation of farmers, horticulturalists and conservationists tackle their invasive

plants. To find out more or to get involved in this or other areas, contact 443881 or kate.ponting@clintondevon.com. Although whatever we do, won't be enough to irradiate balsam yet... if all the landowners and organisations in one place combine and pull together with a dedicated volunteer team for this season and for many to come, then in the future a Balsam Free Bicton is very possible!
