The Parish and District Council elections have taken place. Our re-elected Parish Councillors are John Tresidder, Louis Allan, Jim Carter, Jim Ferrers, Derek Wensley and Kathy Moyle BEM. We currently have four vacancies. The new District Councillors are Charlotte Fitzgerald (Independent), Melanie Martin (Independent) and Henry Riddell (Conservative). Christine Channon remains our County Councillor.

Pot holes continue to be an issue, and residents should continue to report them online. We escaped much flood damage mainly due to residents keeping the Brook clear and drains being cleared, following a request to EDDC from Councillor Tresidder. Councillor Tresidder continues to make sandbags available from the store by the Community Shop, when required.

We have received a grant from County Councillor Channon's locality budget, for the purchase of two additional salt/grit bins. These will be sited near The Pound and near the Community Shop. Our thanks to Councillor Channon for her generosity.

Our AGM took place on 23rd May when Councillor Derek Wensley (Chair) presented his report for the past year. Our Churchyards...

Churchyard Working Party

Something different:

The following article gives a different perspective about churchyards. The words are reprinted in full with permission from Zoe White:

Liminal Life (the art of graveyard photography)

Passing through the gates of a graveyard, you are invited to leave the noise and bustle of daily life behind; and it may take a while to feel your way into this new, liminal landscape.

At first you are aware of surface features only: the communal areas, green lawns and benches, the shrubs, trees, chapels, sculptures, and public memorials. But gradually, as the quietness seeps into you, your steps slow down, and your attention deepens. The closer you look, the more you see: tendrils curl over the tops of gravestones, creeping plants wind their way through carved inscriptions, bright green algae colonize grey granite walls.

Peering into creeper-covered sepulchres, cobwebbed vaults and cracked crypts, your edges soften, you breathe more easily, and your heart opens. Time and the elements work together in haphazard, co-incidental ways. Mould, mildew, yeast and fungus, merge their colours, etch, erode, corrode. There's treasure to be found in 'dead matter'.

Life unfolds here according to its own laws. The raw material is everywhere: mosses, lichens, peeling paint, random markings left by micro-organisms on stone and rock. It's the seamlessness and complexity of these processes that wants to be photographed. Wandering the silent, winding pathways, sun warm on your back, birdsong filling the air, you become a more easeful self; a more spacious awareness. Open to chance, and to change, your lens searches out the design within the design. Nature is a conundrum. A stone is a stilled dynamic, reaching out towards the abstract. There is no plan now. The camera is simply an instrument through which an alchemical process is happening.

There's nothing here remotely concerned with 'death'. Death is only an idea now, a static thing. If there is any 'death' here, it is only the death of the idea that things have a separate, fixed identity. But there is nothing fixed here. Sunlight glints through the stained glass of a sepulchre window, splashing the crumbling paint work crimson and gold. Spider webs glisten.

Our Churchyards....

A chord is struck; a string plucked.

Here! What actually is here?

Millions of cells, morphing and germinating. Prolific. Powerful. A sudden intensification of happiness. Immense good fortune.

And you? You are a fusion of elements; a blended aesthetic, a being-in-kinship with life. You are immersed in the continuum: the de-generating, re-generating, intimate landscape. Your gaze falls where the sun points. This is what brings you to life.

Here, there is nothing but deep contentment, and palpable peace. Here you are timelessly alive, pleasure-pervaded, coalescing with delight. Take the plunge! Dive into the metamorphosis; become absorbed!

National Love Your Burial Ground Week

Roger Conant Club

The Club organised two events in mid-May. A Blue Plaque on the wall of the Church Hall was unveiled by Simon Jupp MP aided by Luli and Zette Emmons, two descendants of Roger Conant who had travelled over from the USA to attend this event.

The Plaque commemorates the 400 th anniversary of Roger Conant leaving these shores for America. In a short speech Simon emphasised the importance of Roger Conant in the history of America and the fact that he was a 'local East Budleigh boy who made good'. These events mark the first initiatives organised by the Roger Conant Club.





RSPB Aylesbeare Common

Well I was poised to write another article full of the usual whatever takes our fancy that we think is useful or interesting (the endless bank holidays, the summer return of our nightjars, the unusual case of bright yellow graffiti appearing on our main Aylesbeare Common sign). But I want to devote this instead to the floods. The terrific rainfall on Tuesday 9th May because it really was the most incredible event. As a matter of fact, that morning, we'd just been doing some filming for a BBC Breakfast feature on our smooth snakes reintroduction 14 years ago, but by the end of the day, Newton Poppleford and Tipton St John were on the national BBC news! Our rain gauge had 35mm of rain in 2 hours but we heard others had far more. We were indoors as the rain began and we were in awe as the thunderstorm struck above us, the hail deafening on the roof and turning our hard surfaces to ponds. Trying to get home to or via Newton Poppleford later that afternoon, we were first aware of the extent of the floods and the damage. We've been very moved by it all, some of us personally affected by the flooding, as well as seeing and hearing stories of the wreckage to people's homes as well as to roads, bridges, hedges, walls...

It's also a personal matter for us because Aylesbeare and Harpford Commons sit above Newton Poppleford, and the Back brook comes off this heathland. What strikes me is how fast this rain fell; and how it just goes to show that landscapes don't stand much of a chance of preventing flooding with rainfall events like this. It's the sort of extreme weather we may expect more of with climate change but it's very likely that things could have been much worse downstream in the village. The heath will have acted as a big sponge: it's covered in scrubby shrub and grassland, mires, ponds and bogs and wet heath, adept at holding at absorbing water. As I wandered down the stream that runs through the middle of Harpford common on Wednesday (we spent the day assessing the damage), which is shrouded in wet woodland, I thought to myself, what better flood-alleviating habitat could you look for than this? The meandering, indecisive channels of the river, the water often running several streams at once through dense vegetation and oak, ash and willow, full of mosses, liverworts, dead wood, natural and also (our own) man-made "leaky dams." We've done a lot of work with the likes of Upstream Thinking, which gives grants and advice on land management in river catchments (eg benefitting water quality and flooding) and water is one of conservationists' key focuses, particularly on the Otter where we have beavers now.

When it comes to the damage we found on Aylesbeare and Harpford commons, well, it was interesting to see. In some cases, the erosion and evidence was less than expected, in others it was a rather intimidating sight the next day. I went first to our string of "five ponds," all in a row and separated by dams. I wondered if the dams might have given way but they were all intact and the channels that run from one to the next were fine. Some of our pebbly tracks are in a bad state now, and any future heavy rain is only to make the erosion worse so we'll have to find a way of restoring the surfaces, while also using local source material (an obligation because it is a Site of Special Scientific Interest). We are thinking of everyone in the villages affected and we wish everyone luck on the clear-up job ahead, within homes, communities and also in the council teams who will be repairing our infrastructure. Do get up on the heaths and enjoy the wildlife and scenery if you can.

As I wandered along our tarmac track and made my way down to the ford, I found it impassable on foot or by vehicle, the water deep and wide and the whole area turned to ponds and new beaches of pebbles. And we lost both footbridges along here! The one by the ford had slipped its stands and was sitting just down at a jaunty angle. When I went to the south end of the stream, just before it leaves the common, I found the bridge 2m high, above a beach of pebbles at the edge of a field, maybe 30 feet down, and round a few bends.



By a stroke of good fortune we'd actually booked our friendly local digger driver to do a job for us the day after the storm, and so he was able to restore the ford and the nearby footbridge

immediately. But the one at the south end needs a rescue mission first. It forms part of a Devon County Council footpath and for now, you'll need wellies.

If you do go for a walk on Aylesbeare, or any of our commons, please do keep your dog on a lead. We ask this during the breeding season above all else, and this is for the sake of ground nesting birds but also small mammals and reptiles. Speaking of the smooth snakes earlier (and we hope you saw us on BBC Breakfast!) I'd also like to bring your attention to adders - they're very much moving around now, and they have a venomous bite. Most years we hear of dogs being bitten so this is another good reason to keep them on a lead.



Help Save Salem Chapel As a community Heritage Centre Questionnaire Survey Outcome

Thank you East Budleigh! We received 105 responses to our East Budleigh History Group questionnaire on a potential Heritage Centre in Salem Chapel and over 30 people turned out in the pouring rain for the questionnaire feedback meeting on Monday 24 April.

At the meeting, there was a very positive discussion in support of the Heritage Centre and potential community uses for Salem Chapel. The meeting fully acknowledged the concerns for road safety with increased use of the Chapel, given its location on a road junction and lack of pavements and parking. The Heritage Centre proposal itself envisages light foot, bus and cycle traffic and does not require dedicated parking.

The primary aim of the questionnaire was to help the East Budleigh History Group determine the feasibility of the Heritage Centre. We took the opportunity to broaden the questionnaire to facilitate free-format suggestions of other potential uses of the Chapel and for people to express their views, which they did.

In summary, the meeting was in favour of the use of the Salem Chapel for a community-run Heritage Centre but concluded that it was not feasible to seek ownership of the building due to the ongoing maintenance costs, which could be considerable over time. The Heritage Centre would need another owner like the Friends of Friendless Churches to take ownership and responsibility for maintenance. Significantly, a number of those not in favour actually wanted to see the Chapel open but were not in favour of some of the suggested commercial uses.

Here is the questionnaire survey outcome. These findings have been shared with the Historic Chapels Trust and the Friends of Friendless Churches.

- 1. Is it important to you that the Chapel is saved for community use? YES 85%. NO 15%
- 2. Would you be interested in visiting the Chapel? YES 86%. NO 14%
- 3. How important do you think it is to have a Heritage Centre in East Budleigh? Not important:7%, Slightly important:13%, Important: 20%, Fairly important: 23%, Very important: 37%
- 4. Would you like to see a heritage Trail marked in the village? YES 91%. NO 9%
- 5. In addition to exhibitions to Sir Walter Raleigh and Roger Conant on the upper gallery, what additional services would you most like to see the Heritage Centre offer on the ground floor?
- 62% Cream teas, quality coffee, light refreshments, high quality ice cream
- 60% Adult education classes, 39% After school clubs, 39% A well-being centre, 37% Other, 33% Tickets for local event, 28% Internet, 11% Wine store, 8% A beauty/nail bar, 3% Dry cleaning
- 6. If the Chapel was run by the community as a Heritage Centre would you use it?
- 7. What kind of facilities would you like to see in the outdoor space?
- 69% nature trail, insect hotel, hedgehog house, bird tables
- 54% catering tables, chairs parasols, 46% dog bowls dog treats, 45% cycles racks, 24% other

- 8. What additional income generating ideas would you support?
- 63%. Solar panels on the roof out of sight 24% or on the ground, 26% Other
- 47% Let the school room commercially for office use 32% for Airbnb 9% for residential use 9. Would you be interested in helping a community Heritage Centre:
- 52% Buy a share, 50% Make a donation, 29% Volunteering, 21% Fundraising, 19% Provide professional services, 16% Join the steering group, 9% Make a loan, 7% paid work
- 10. 44 responses provided their contact details.

The next step is for the steering group to send formal proposals to the Historic Chapel Trust for the use of the Salem Chapel as a Heritage Centre but not taking responsibility for ownership.


