We had a bumper crop of scarecrows again this year with lots of chuckles along the street as folks enjoyed the humour. There were lots of reminders about the link with the 400th anniversary of the death of Sir Walter Raleigh (paving the way for the dedicated special events later this summer) as well as other more current issues.

We set records this year for the number of ducks racing in the brook, the number of bacon rolls consumed and in fact we sold the last cream tea just as the kitchen closed at 4pm on Sunday.

It was lovely to see so many family dogs adorned by their rosettes after the dog show on Sunday and the number of people wandering amongst the classic cars and bikes up in the Vicarage garden.

There was a chance to be fascinated by the exhibitions of buttons and animal skulls and displays of arts and crafts in the church hall. Once again the owls and hawks and bug handling stalls were enticing and further down the village in the cool of the school there was an exhibition by local artists that generated a lot of interest.

The bell tower was open for trips to the top to enjoy the magnificent views over the village and East Devon countryside, to see the newly gilded weather vane whilst also giving an opportunity to learn about church bell ringing and hand bell ringing.

Meanwhile the Village Hall was throbbing with people browsing the stalls and enjoying refreshments. There was music and chatter throughout the day; the sound of folks enjoying a family outing.

The weekend ended with Songs of Praise in the Church and the packing up of the knitting exhibits ready for transport to Moldova by the charity CR2EE.

At the time of going to press, it appears we have raised around £4,200 which is another record breaking total and a huge contribution to our fundraising aims this year.

View from the East Budleigh vicarage...

What a fantastic service we had on Wednesday 13th at St. Peter's for my institution. Everybody played their part, the hymns were sung loudly, and there was a palpable sense of hope and expectation in the air.

Louise and I, including my daughter Claire and my mother and father in law, David and Linda, were bowled over.

Bishop Robert in a lively and humorous sermon talked about many things but to my mind kept coming back to three main themes; relevance, unity in diversity, and mission.

We all need to ponder what it means in practice now that the dust is settling.

We are a community of equals and each in our own way should have a common factor binding us together – the saving grace of God made flesh and blood in the life, death, resurrection of Jesus Christ and the pouring out of God's Spirit on us his church.

We are a body made up of many different people with different strengths and gifts but we are one "Raleigh Mission Community" where St. Michael's, All Saints and St. Peter's are all equal constituent members.

Now I've just conducted my first service at St. Peter's this morning, so the nerves have subsided slightly because nobody walked out, objected to anything, or threw communion wine at me so I'm guessing that it was at least OK?

Of course it won't all be plain sailing and there will be battles ahead, which is to be expected because when the Spirit starts to move in a church, our opposition takes notice and starts to make mischief. But as part of my sermon this morning said, we have to grow a backbone and stop complaining that we aren't as popular as we used to be, that society has rejected us and no-one is listening anymore and stand proud and live a distinctive lifestyle and do it courageously.

This is what the Bible calls "Holiness". And as Peter said in his first letter about us....

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

Snippets of old East Budleigh with Bicton by Gerald Millington...

During the 18th/19th centuries cider making provided a lucrative income for many farmers and other village people. Their smaller arable fields were cultivated as apple orchards. East Budleigh had a few farms in the village of which Hill Farm, Hayes Lane; Pulhayes and Wynards had orchards. The latter's trees were near the house in the High Street facing south in two fields covering 3 acres. Pulhayes Farm only covered 50 acres of land - no trees. To the south was another farm of 78 acres called Leatts Tenement which had the orchards, in 1868 they were grouped together. It is not known if the three farms had Cider Mills.

Villagers living in High Street, Middle Street and Lower Budleigh also had orchards behind their cottages. 16 are recorded in the 1790 Survey between ½ and 1 acre. Inns and beer houses sold cider and hucksters sold door to door.

 wonderful community.



Farms and fundraising. Last month the farm team enjoyed a very successful Open Farm Sunday welcoming over 400 people to Otter farm, for tours of the dairy to show them where their milk comes

from. Thank you to the many local businesses who supported this event helping us donate £120 to our chosen farming charity, the Farming Support Network.

Other charitable activities Clinton staff are taking part in over the next few weeks include an all-female team walking 10 miles for Hospiscare and eight cyclists who are riding in the Nello event for Force.

Around 200 pupils from seven local primary schools including Drake's and Otterton have been working on a project to learn about food, farming and wildlife. They will come together at Bicton Arena early this month to compete for the Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group Kingfisher Award Trophy and prize money for their schools. Good luck to all competitors.

Heath Week 2018 Later this month the commons will be the focus for events once more as the Pebblebed Heath Conservation Trust join with teams from our heathland partners; the RSPB, the Devon Wildlife Trust and EDDC Countryside and gear up for another action-packed Heath Week

Starting on Sunday 29 July with the Family Festival Day at Woodbury Castle and continuing until Sunday 5 August there is something for everyone, whatever your age or whether your interest are in the heathland ecology, its history or in getting active outdoors. Choose from over thirty individual events, many of them free. Flyers will be available at libraries, Tourist Information, local shops etc. and full event listings and booking information can be found at www.heathweek.org or facebook.com/heathweek

Throughout the week join family friendly events (29 & 31 July, 1, 2 & 3 August) daytime and evening talks or guided walks (something every day) to learn about the landscape history (30 July and 3 August), how our grazing animals benefit the heathland habitat (31 July) or the everpopular Nightjar safaris (31 July and 1 August).

You can also join practical volunteers for a work party and lend a hand in the management of the heaths (Wed 1 August). Another new event for us this year will be our Dog's Breakfast (10am-12pm Saturday 4 August) which celebrates our work with Devon Loves Dogs and local dog owners to ensure they know why it is so important to exercise their dogs in this important place responsibly. There will be a short Waggy Walk and plenty of sausages for all our humans and canine friends!

Wildlife and livestock attacks Finally, and despite regularly reminding local people of the need to exercise their dogs responsibly in the countryside; several reports have been received of dogs worrying wildlife on the Otter Estuary and heifers, grazing Anchoring Hill above Otterton.

A number of our young cattle have bite marks and minor injuries. Estate staff will put up signs for visitors to highlight the serious impact harassment can cause livestock but need local dog walkers to do their bit too. Always ensure your dog is under close control and you both stick to the public rights of way. Anticipate and assume livestock may be grazing fields around any of the farms in the area at this time of year and do not ever allow your dog to chase and harass cattle.
