Dear friends,

As a brand-new curate (a trainee vicar) in Margate many years ago my first job that was given to me by the vicar was to go down to the seafront in my brand-new black shirt and clerical collar and buy an ice cream.

Some might say this has been my model of ministry ever since! It was a beautiful sunny day as I remember and the cars and coaches from London had disgorged their cargo onto the beaches and bars of North Kent's premier seaside town – all bunting and kiss me quick hats, loud music and candy floss.

I suppose the idea was to acclimatise me to Margate, get me used to being a visible representative of the church, and be seen doing something absolutely normal. There was method in his madness, therefore.

The first lesson then was that life was to be lived and enjoyed. Some clergy down the ages have gained the reputation for a dour, killjoy, attitude to life, but that is not anywhere reflected in the life of Jesus who was dismissed by his detractors as a "glutton and a drunkard" for having a strong preference for parties.

Of course the subject matter we deal with is serious – matters of life and death and ultimate meaning – but without a sense of fun, good humour and enjoyment of all the fun life can offer – that would be a one-dimensional view of life....and vice versa

As the Bible says, there is a time for everything. A time to be serious and there is a time to let your hair down. Knowing which time is which is important and when to mix one with the other occasionally.

Now Budleigh Salterton seafront is rather more genteel than Margate was but the same rules of life apply. If the opportunity presents itself, give yourself permission to just enjoy yourself.

Autumn Talk – Ian Blackwell: "The 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Arnhem" at 19.30 on Friday 6th September in the Church

September 2019 marks the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Arnhem, the culmination of Operation Market Garden in which thousands of Allied airborne troops attempted to force a passage towards Germany through Holland. It is also the story of Douglas Hill (Gerry Hill's father), who served with the 1st Airborne Division from February 1942 until March 1946, and who was at Arnhem from the first landings until escaping across the Neder Rhine on the last day of the battle.

Military Historian Ian Blackwell will outline the events of the Battle and Douglas' story.

Otter Valley Association - August and September Diary

Wednesday, 7th Aug. - 10.00am - WALK-Start: Four Firs car park (OS 115, SY 032 864), 6 miles, 3.5 hours "Reserve and Reservoir" From Four Firs we walk past the ever-changing gravel pits to Fryingpans, then alongside Hayes Wood to Shortwood Common. Return via Dalditch, Squabmoor Reservoir, and Devon Wildlife Trust's Bystock Nature Reserve. A moderate walk with two coffee stops part way round (so bring a flask). Walk Leader: Ross Hussey, 01395 227991

Saturday 10 Aug. 2019 - 10.20am - WALK Meet at Sidmouth Road bus stop in Honiton (near Tesco (OS115 ST 153 996) at 10.20 ready to walk about a mile to rejoin where we left off Stage 2 near Weston Cross. For most people, getting the 09.27 No 9 bus from Newton Poppleford which arrives at Honiton at 10.17 should work. Total distance including walking to Weston is about 11 miles and will take about 6 hours, including stops. "Otter Source to Mouth Stage 3-Weston (Honiton) to Newton Poppleford" From Weston we will take a rather noisy route along the old A30 before heading along guieter footpaths to Ottery St Mary. We are thereafter never far from the river as we go through Tipton and Harpford and finally reach Newton Poppleford. Although there will be an opportunity to pop into Ottery to buy refreshments, we suggest you bring a picnic. Please check the OVA website in case the bus or meeting point changes! Friday, 16th Aug. 10.40am - WALK Meet at Exmouth Train Station at 10.15am. Outward via train, dep. 10.23am, arr. Newcourt 10.39am. Weekday buses dep. Budleigh Salterton 0954, arr. 1010 Exmouth, plenty of time to get to the station and to use bus passes. We suggest that if you don't have a railcard, you travel in groups of 3+ to take advantage of a "Groupsave" train ticket buy a return from Exmouth to Digby and Sowton. "A walk from the train" Start at Newcourt Train Station (OS 192, SX 961 903), 10.40am, 6 miles, 2.5 hours plus lunch. The walk leaders will meet the train at Newcourt station. NB: no parking at Newcourt and the hospital park and ride is now closed to the public and is only for NHS staff with permits. A walk from the station over the Clyst River Bridge to the village of Clyst St Mary. Then through farmlands and fields to the village of Sowton and continue through the grounds of the medieval Bishop's Court Palace. After an optional pub lunch, a gentle half hour or so takes us to Digby and Sowton station for the train back to Exmouth. This is an opportunity to explore places we usually see fleetingly when travelling. The going is easy with only gentle climbs. It may be muddy in places if it has been wet. Is the Country Code something we have forgotten?

The Countryside Code which replaced the Country Code in 2004, applies to all parts of the countryside in England and Wales. Encouraging users to respect other people, protect the natural environment and to enjoy the outdoors by setting out responsibilities for visitors to the countryside as well as those who manage the land. www.gov.uk/government/ publications/the-countryside-code Respecting other people includes considering communities and other people using the outdoors and also remembering that actions can affect people's lives and livelihoods. Actions such as slowing down on small country roads keeps wildlife and people much safer, especially those foot, cycle or horseback. Gates are often closed to keep farm animals in, but farmers may sometimes leave them open so their livestock can reach food and water. Therefore, leave gates as you find them and follow signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates and if running or on a bike take extra care that swinging gates have latched behind you. Always follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on registered common land (known as 'open access land') such as the East Devon Pebblebed Heaths.

Protecting the natural environment is everyone's responsibility and alarm about the damage humans are causing the world's oceans and rainforests are concerns we are all familiar with. Protecting the countryside closer to home means taking care not to harm animals or plants

and leaving no trace of your visit. When out with a dog this includes ensuring it is not a nuisance to farm animals, horses, wildlife or other people. Fires can be devastating to people, property, wildlife and habitats – so be careful with naked flames and cigarettes at any time of the year. Small controlled fires are used to manage vegetation, particularly on the heaths in the winter months but if fire is seen this summer report by calling 999.

Despite this common-sense guidance it is remarkable how many incidents still occur each week. These individual actions may be small but they add up, costing farmers and landowners financially and in time needed to put things right.

Corsican pines forming part of the iconic

skyline on the coast path above the Otter Estuary were threatened recently when youngsters lit a fire in a den they had built. Some of the trees were damaged although the fire was quickly brought under control. The neighbouring field escaped the fire but part of the maize crop and irrigation pipes were damaged when fire engines had no choice but to use that route to reach the fire. Pebblebed rangers respond to reports of illegal motorbike or 4x4 driving and camping on the commons. Staff must return to campfires several times to damp down with water to reduce the risk of wildfire. When bridle path gates are left wide open on areas grazed by cattle and ponies, animals can stray onto busy roads a dangerous and time-consuming outcome caused by a moment's careless-

every week to remove litter. Some people are happy to bring food and drinks with them to beautiful places but then leave containers behind, to become an eyesore and a risk to wildlife and farm animals.

Most people are responsible and would not want farmers crops, woodland blocks or sites like the Pebblebeds or Otter Estuary SSSIs to be spoiled by litter or to go up in flames, due to carelessness but do we always follow all the other guidance too?
