

The rescue of the thirteen Thai children from a flooded cave system over two miles from the entrance to the caves has amazed and surprised the world.

It is a testimony to what can be achieved against seemingly impossible odds by people all working together to achieve a common aim.

As such it stands as a metaphor for any enterprise where we are united in a common aim, and all working together to achieve a common goal.

Their goal was to save the lives of those children. Our goal as a church is to "save" lives as well.

We are to save people from the fear of death, to give hope even when they are suffering and give worth, purpose and meaning to lives that otherwise might succumb to nihilism and pointlessness.

You can call this offering "healing" to people because we offer healing for their souls. This is our raison d'etre as a church and when we are all sure of what and who we are and what we offer people, we can all direct our efforts in the same direction and achieve great things.

I'm sure the rescuers in Thailand are exhausted, mentally and physically, and there was at least one diver who died in the rescue effort. But this will not overshadow the sense of joy that they all must feel now that all the children have been rescued.

This is the same joy that we should feel over just one person who we "rescue" and not only are we not alone because we have each other, we also have Jesus who promised us "I will be with you always until the end of the age".

Churchyard

Our Living Churchyard

You may have read some recent articles about Littleham Churchyard in the Budleigh Journal, one headed "Pensioner is 'heartbroken' at finding loved-ones graves overgrown", and another "The peaceful graveyard that offers 'a riot of colour and life'". This contrast of views is echoed here at All Saints, where we have had similar comments about our Living Churchyard.

Our Living Churchyard is not a council-owned cemetery, and unlike Littleham we do not employ a sexton to maintain the churchyard. We are dependent on finding funds from the Church's limited finances to meet the costs of hiring in people as well as on our wonderful team of volunteers. We also recognise that a number of people come into the churchyards and tend to the plots of their loved ones and extended families – thank you. We have also had a few requests to clear and maintain some plots (for a small donation) where family members visit on anniversaries, which we are happy to do as part of our monthly Churchyard Working Party.

Our Living Churchyard has been developing for more than 20 years - the biodiversity has changed over the years. We 'employ' teams from Community Payback to cut the grass around the Church and Church Hall and, in the past, strim/cut the whole Churchyard after the flowers have seeded. We are dependent on the weather and last year the rain prevented us completing the whole Churchyard. This year's weather has meant that the Churchyard is a savannah of tall grasses and seed-headed plants!

The safety of our visitors is of paramount importance but we also want to maintain our Living Churchyard so we are getting advice and guidance from a number sources including the Exeter Diocese Environmental Advisor on how best to do this.

Churchyard Working Party

The Churchyard Working Party will meet at 10.00 by the shed at the back of the old churchyard on the following Fridays: 17 August; 21 September; 19 October; 16 November; and 21 December.

Tools are provided. There are light and heavier jobs to suit all – everyone is welcome to come and help. We stop for coffee, biscuits/cake and a chat at 11.00, and finish between 12.00 and 13.00.

You do not have to work for the whole time – whatever help you can give will be greatly appreciated.

People often ask me as a priest about how to pray. They say things like, "I don't know the right language, I don't know what words to use' Perhaps they are right to be so cautious. What on earth do we say to such a God as this, what massive theological treatise must we study to make sure we get it right before we approach our heavenly father?

A couple of years ago just before Christmas I heard the most profound and complete prayer I have ever encountered. I had a very rare Sunday off and I was sitting in the congregation waiting for the service to start. Just in front of me was a delightful young family I didn't know, and they were obviously used to being in church. There were three young girls. The oldest two were quiet and studious and sat listening to the service as it began.

The youngest was different, she was chubbier with a mass of curls and a lively face with bright questioning eyes. She scrambled all over the seat and we played peep-bo for a while. When we started singing, she knew exactly what to do and she stood on the seat with her picture book in her hand and warbled her own pretty little song. She got well into it and was totally absorbed. As the hymn came to an end she was swaying and singing her little heart out. Her final burst came as the organ sound drifted away. LA-LA GOD, she sang, LA-LA GOD. It made me feel warm inside and I beamed approval at her. She gave me a quick quizzical look and then ignored me.

A little while later, it suddenly hit me how reverently, how openly, how trustingly that little girl had offered her prayer to God. All the hymns in the world, all the great majestic prayer words in the world, all the most glorious musical works are no better in God's eyes than her La-La God. When prayer becomes hard for us, when we feel that speaking to such an awesome power as the God who sent his son as a baby in Bethlehem and watched as he was put to death on the cross, all we need to offer is our own equivalent of that little girls La-La God.

I just want to remind us all that talking to God in prayer can be long hours of communication in silent meditation, it can be participating in glorious musical works, it can be joining in regular prayer groups and it can be many, many other ways. All of them are valid and important. But when the going gets rough, as it will sometimes, God will understand and respond when it is simply La-La God. AMEN






Importance of the colours - purple for loyalty and dignity, white for purity, and green for hope. Members were encouraged to wear the colours "as a duty and a privilege". Selfridges and Liberty sold tricolour-striped ribbon for hats, belts, rosettes and badges, as well as coloured garments, underwear, handbags, shoes, slippers and toilet soap.

The 1918 Representation of the People Act gave the vote to women over the age of 30 who were householders, the wives of householders, occupiers of property with an annual rent of £5, and graduates of British universities. All men over 21 got the vote in 1918.

Very close to the village I saw this family of probable polecats. Also in several places near us the shy & elusive white admiral butterfly can now be seen feeding on wild bramble flowers.

As I write this the full heat of the glorious summer is still upon us. Groups have been happy to visit the farm and the heaths and volunteers to work, although we have sought shadier locations and planned ice-cream stops into the longer days!

When was the last time you cut your lawn? Hot weather results in slower grass growth, which is great if you want to ditch the mowing and head to the beach. Not so great, however for our dairy cows, who are almost exclusively grass fed during the warmer months.

Because this food source is short supply, the milking herd are being kept inside for longer periods to enable them to receive supplementary food. Outside, in the heat, flies can also be a problem causing stress especially in young animals. Livestock sheds are designed to be airy and cool with access to food and water at all times. When we get some rain the cows and heifers will be out in the fields again, turning the sunlight energy in the grass into milk for us.

Last month like many, staff on the Pebblebed Heaths were saddened to see the devastating wildfires in the north of the country and smaller fires here in Devon. Like other areas of moorland and heathland across the region we have been alert to the risk of fires for many months now. Our rangers and *Devon and Somerset Fire Service* remain poised to respond to situations that could devastate habitats and cause a serious risk to firefighters and the public. Camping, fires and BBQs are prohibited anywhere on the commons and we ask people to be careful when extinguishing cigarettes and take all litter home with them. If you see fire or smoke, phone 999 immediately.
