Thank you to everyone who attended and supported the Friends open air Cream Tea Concert with a wonderful performance by the Budleigh Male Voice Choir. Over £700 was raised and we are enormously grateful to the choir members for putting on such a great show. It was another glorious sunny afternoon, fortunately with slightly lower temperatures than during the heatwave. It seemed that everyone enjoyed the delicious scones and drank copious quantities of tea in order to hydrate in the summer warmth.

By the time this magazine is published, I hope that some of you will have enjoyed the talk by Ian Blackwell about Roger Conant, the historical figure from East Budleigh who travelled to join the Pilgrim Fathers in the US and founded the settlement, later named Salem, in Massachusetts.

Our next offering for your interest is a talk by Paul Kurowski entitled 'Lunacy via Croquet and Walter Raleigh to All Saints' Church East Budleigh'.

Dr Thomas Nadauld Brushfield was a true polymath ... a pioneer in the treatment of lunacy, he retired to Budleigh Salterton in 1882, and was involved in the development of Salterton's social life, including croquet. He was keenly interested in the history of East Budleigh, Sir Walter Raleigh and All Saints' Church was his spiritual home - he provided a detailed account of our Church and the history and stories that surround it. The talk, in two parts, will cover Dr Brushfield's life and the history of All Saints' Church.

Paul's talk will take place on Friday 11 November at 7pm (doors open 6.15pm) in the Church. Tickets are $\pounds 5$ ($\pounds 4$ for Friends subscribers) and will be available in the shop and East Budleigh Garage or on the door.

Thereafter, the very popular, Exeter University Chapel Choir will be returning on Saturday 10 December to perform a Carol Concert in the church. Refreshments will be available. More details to be published in this magazine in November.

Meanwhile the funds raised are being put to good use in the maintenance and future-proofing of our beautiful church.

So, we hope we may see you at some of our autumn events and will keep you posted with further fundraising initiatives that may be of interest.

T t was a time of reflection at All Saints to commemorate the life of Queen Elizabeth II.

The Rev Martin Jacques presided at the 9.30am Service at All Saints on Sunday 18th September which was a family (non-Eucharistic) Memorial service for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The order of service included hymns, prayers and a reading. It ended with a rendition of "God save the King" in recognition of the accession to the throne of King Charles III.

The All Saints church bell ringers and flag officer undertook special arrangements over the weekend under "Operation London Bridge".

The death of the Sovereign is one of the rare occasions when fully or half muffled bells are sounded – a technique to create an echo by fitting pads to both or one side of the bell clapper.

The All Saints flag played a role in marking the passing of Queen Elizabeth and the accession of King Charles. This involved flying the Union Flag at half mast first but raising it again the next day at 11 am to mark the Proclamation of the new Monarch. The flag then returned to half mast the following day at 1 pm and remained there until the day after the Queen's state funeral. This followed the set sequence in concert with church flags throughout the country.

Our Churchyards...

The Wood Wide Web

Autumn colours will be adding a touch of drama to our trees in the next few months. But while the scientific world has understood for hundreds of years why these leaf colour changes take place - it has only recently been discovered that amazing things are happening under the soil too...



Described by some scientists as a 'woodwide web', studies have found that trees are connected to each other through underground fungal networks where they communicate and share water and nutrients with each other in times of need. For example, if they are under attack by insects they will send distress signals to other trees which then have time to alter their own behaviour to protect themselves better.

Trees living connected together in forests have far longer lives than isolated trees.

Studies at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver have shown that particular trees in a forest use their deep roots to draw up water and make it available to shallow-rooted seedlings. These same trees also detect distress signals from other trees and increase the flow of nutrients to support them.

Until recently the western world has generally thought of trees as striving individuals, disconnected from each other and competing for limited resources such as water, nutrients and sunlight. Now, with an ever-increasing body of scientific evidence, this idea is being replaced with one where trees have evolved to live in interdependent, co-operative relationships. A woody wonderland indeed...

(For a marvellous read on this subject look up the book 'The Hidden Life of Trees' by Peter Wohllenben.) Interesting fungi - the Yew tree by the Porch has had an interesting, yellow fungus "chicken of the woods" (Laetiporus sulphurous). It is a thick, fleshy bracket fungus, bright creamy yellow with bands of orange when young, fading to cream with age. It has succulent, soft and moist crumbly flesh. The upper surface is velvety, and underneath it has very small pores.

It has a strong 'fungusy' smell. It is inedible when found growing on a poisonous tree, like yew.





WINNING ON PRICE!

In these days, when all of us are trying to watch the pennies and budgets are ever more stretched, are there ways that the village shop can help? We know that many people are struggling with increased costs to their household bills at the moment and there can be a misapprehension that the village shop is never going to be competitive with the big supermarkets – but there are ways in which we really can help.

Believe it or not there are ranges where we beat the likes of supermarkets like Tesco (price checked on 13^{th} September 2022):-

- ★ Heinz canned soups Tesco sell at £1.40 ours are £1.09 or 3 for £3.00
- ★ Duracell batteries Tesco pack of 4 AA are £4.25 only £3.99 at the shop.

If it has been a while since you have visited the shop you may be surprised to see that we also have a really good range of value priced products across canned goods, biscuits, snacks, household items and baking. We are not just a shop for all your lovely local and luxury products – we really do try to have something for every budget.

Save fuel, reduce your carbon footprint - you don't even need to get in your car and use petrol to do your shopping. Take a wander down, do your shopping, enjoy a coffee and a sit down outside before you wander back home. You never know who you will meet for a chat en-route.

Don't forget that, for our villagers who are housebound and unable to get here, we do still offer a telephone ordering and FREE delivery facility. Just phone on a weekday morning and we will aim to get your order to you that afternoon.

LOYALTY CARDS

We are so proud of our loyalty card system, it really is fantastic value! We know that every shop these days seems to have some kind of loyalty scheme and our purses are bursting with them – but ours really is worth having. Every time you spend £10 in one shop (not including tobacco products) you get a stamp on your card. When your card is full, you get £5.00 off your shopping. So an £80 spend gets you £5.00 off. I am just going to do the Tesco comparison again – in store shopping gives you 1 point for every pound spent – so spend £150 and you will receive a voucher for £1.50.

If you forget your card anytime – we will happily stamp your receipt so you can bring that in next time and have those transferred onto your card. Some customers use their full card straight away – others save them up for a big Christmas shop – its entirely up to you.



RSPB Aylesbeare Common

As it's now the end of the summer season, we wanted to look back and give a bit of an overview of the activities and work that's been going on at the reserve over the last few months. There were record temperatures and an extended dry spell but we've been fortunate here in that by and large our work was unaffected and we were spared any uncontrolled fires. We were always on alert, especially by mid August, because heathland is a tinder box when the ground and vegetation is so dry. But it's been fantastic weather in many ways: we had a very successful Heathweek and some fantastic nightjar viewings.

We deployed a new implement to make sure our main fire breaks were all clear. It's a Ryetec flail mower, unusual to have its own hopper-collector. This was thanks to funding through the Farming in Protected Landscapes scheme which was administered via the East Devon AONB. Being able to cut and collect the material at once is something that has many benefits in application in heathland management but this was especially good for the fire breaks because we could remove all the arisings, without leaving the dry flammable material behind.

The existing fire breaks and paths are largely kept open and free from encroaching vegetation, thanks to the almost year-round grazing by ponies and cows. We've been able to graze Aylesbeare and Harpford Commons extensively ever since the permanent perimeter fence was put up in 2014. They like to graze at the sides and because they eat it, they're also taking away the material for us.

Thirty cows have spent the summer grazing on Aylesbeare, wearing the NoFence collars. The Dartmoor and Exmoor ponies which we look after all year were taken to other sites that we manage, including some very special and tucked away sites in the Blackdown Hills, the Stockland turbaries. They will all be brought back to Aylesbeare Common to overwinter.

These grazing animals are one of our main habitat management tools, they do an excellent job in some pretty hard locations, in all weathers. In July, we cut our hay fields and baled them to provide supplementary food for the ponies during the winter. And in the late summer we did something slightly different – green hay. We mowed and collected from some local donor sites with good mix of perennial flowering plants. This was then spread immediately on some of our fields, including an orchard, so that the seed might be transported and drop on our sites and hopefully germinate from next year. We spread it around with the help of volunteers.

Bracken management as ever has taken up a significant part of our work in the late summer. We control it by cutting (mowing or cut by hand in places), rolling (which crushes the stems and causes them to die) and spraying. We have also had to spend much time in repairing livestock fencing on some of our sites, which in some cases is all sadly coming of age at once! The fence posts do eventually rot at the base but we keep up the momentum in replacing them – you may have seen the main pedestrian gate in to Aylesbeare, closest to Joney's Cross car park, had to be replaced not long ago.



The RSPB team in East Devon is based at Aylesbeare but we manage sites in and around the Pebblebed Heaths and further afield such as Fire Beacon Hill in Sidmouth. We are currently in the process of putting seven of our sites into a large new Countryside Stewardship application and our hope is that this extra funding will help to support our work for the next 10 years. It's ambitious, we've committed to do a lot of work! But it's the first time we'll have had so many sites under stewardship.

PS. If anyone has any creative ideas or inventive uses for heathland litter, once we've cut and collected it (this could be gorse scrub, and bracken in the summer) then do get in touch! It's one thing cutting and removing a lot of material, but another to work out what to do with it all.

Her Majesty's enduring commitment will be long remembered by the national charity and by CPRE's network of local branches, including ours here in Devon. We are all mourning someone who has been so much a part of the life of the nation for so long that it is hard to imagine public life without her.

Since becoming our patron 70 years ago, the Queen has taken a keen interest in the charity's work, sending regular messages of support and encouragement. Throughout this time, she demonstrated her unequivocal love for the British countryside, helping CPRE celebrate its 80th birthday and other significant occasions. On such visits, she was always keen to spend as much time as possible chatting to our volunteers about their local countryside and the rural issues that impacted their lives.

We bid you a fond farewell, Your Majesty.

East Budleigh with Bicton Parish Council

Bird flu has been detected in a number of cases across Devon, prompting warnings to not touch dead or injured birds when out and about.

So far in 2022, there have been 13 cases where 23 wild birds tested positive for avian influenza. Up until the week ending Sunday 4 September, there have been:

- · Five birds (three findings) in East Devon breeds included mute swans and herring gulls.
- · 17 birds (nine findings) in Mid Devon breeds included geese and herring gulls.
- \cdot One herring gull found by Devon County Council.

 \cdot Cornwall has also seen 11 cases, where 25 birds tested positive. Breeds include gannets, herring gulls, Canadian geese and pheasants.

A number of dead birds have washed up on East Devon beaches, including Exmouth. The animals were collected by East Devon District Council (EDDC) officers who have informed DEFRA. In the meantime, EDDC has issued the following guidance, although the risk to public health is very low:

If you find any sick or injured birds:

- · Do not touch or pick them up.
- · Do not touch bird droppings.

• Keep dogs away from them. Instead, please report it to EDDC, which will collect and dispose accordingly if found it is on public land. The criteria for reporting to Defra now asks for reports if there is, one or more dead bird of prey or owl, three or more dead gulls or wild waterfowl (swans, geese and ducks) or five or more dead birds of any species.


