Dear Friends,

The Spirit was good natured and positive and there was a determination to enjoy ourselves no matter what. It was a reminder, if one were needed, that beyond the continuous diet of doom, gloom and despondency that we get fed in the TV, newspapers, social media and radio there is also a deep well of decency, kindness, joy and community spirit.

We also voted to adopt two new mission partners, following the retirement of the Sharlands. The first is Wendy Yong of Interserve, who works in Cambodia with her Cambodian husband Yong. Wendy grew up here and her father still lives in the Old Vicarage. The second is Helen Kisakye of CMS Uganda who works with children at risk and in furtherance of educational opportunities for girls.

Loaves & Fishes Lunch

The Loaves & Fishes Lunch was started in December 1999 by Sally Rogers, Mary Leat and Sue Waddington on a voluntary basis to provide a midday meal once a month to the elder members of St Peter's Church. All were welcome in the Peter Hall, and no one was turned away. A home cooked meal of main course and dessert was provided, plus a glass of sherry or juice, and a raffle to follow. Extra helpers laid tables, handed out meals and helped in the kitchen. It became a social occasion for friends from St Peter's church and the town. Numbers of diners started around thirty and grew to a maximum of eighty at the December lunches. After food costs and expenses any money remaining was sent to the charity Send A Cow in Africa. The Covid pandemic resulted in closing down the lunches in March 2020, and our wonderful cooks took the opportunity to retire, after twenty one years of voluntary service.

In September 2021 the lunches re-started in a different format with Jennie Stogdon as our cook on a paid basis, and volunteers assisting her in the Hall. The lunches take place now on the second Thursday of each month, in the Peter Hall, and numbers range from 25-30 on average. Anyone is welcome to join us, however we must know in advance, to be able to advise the cook of the numbers she will be catering for, a change from the original idea. It is still a social occasion for all who attend St Peter's and the local community.

<u>ADVANCE WARNING:</u> The CARPARK at St Peters will be closed for 8 weeks from 18 July to 11 Sept. In that time it will be extended along the south, provided with proper drainage and completely re-surfaced in durable, porous pea gravel. The dangerous slabs will go entirely. It will end up larger, looking far better, be much safer and an ongoing source of funding for all time. It will also allow us to increase our hire charges. We realise that this will cause a lot of inconvenience, especially as parking outside is restricted to an hour by the council. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout, but may be through the West Doors, or even North Door for the Hall. Would those with mobility issues please let Fran in the office know so that we can arrange a special rota of drivers to assist.

When the car park reopens in September there will be a new parking regime and careful policing. Parking will always be available for services and church events (on a first come, first served basis), but parishioners wishing to park at other times will need to buy an annual sticker for £60.
