Dear Friends,

As we get older and more set in our ways it gets increasingly harder to "turn over a new leaf" and determine to do better. To do so, we have always needed examples to inspire us to do so and people have

always elevated ordinary people to the level of heroes and heroines, put them on pedestals, and sought to be more like them.

There are many who revere politicians, businessmen and women, sportsmen and women, philosophers, writers, anyone who has overcome great handicaps in life. It is the same reason why Christians revere the Saints, seeing them as primarily an example to be followed however imperfectly.

Last month Queen Elizabeth died and there can be no greater example to us of a faith quietly but passionately held, of a belief in duty and service to others, of absolute fidelity and an old-fashioned belief that you don't wear your heart on your sleeve but always behave with dignity and stoicism.

The Chalice for the Laity

The diocese have now directed that the Chalice should again be offered to the Laity. There is no obligation to receive under both kinds. The Church has always taught that the fulness of the Sacrament is conveyed by either consecrated element. If you are at all uncomfortable just come up, receive the Host and pass back to your pew.

If you do wish to receive the Chalice, you should do so by drinking directly from it. The medical and diocesan advice is strongly that there is a slight risk of cross contamination if the wafer is dipped into the chalice, both to oneself and to others. There is no risk in drinking direct as wine is a strong disinfectant. *Martin Jacques*

Music at St Peter's

Friday lunchtime concerts will return to St Peter's for an Autumn series during the month of October. The series will begin on October 7th with an organ recital by the distinguished former organist of the Chapel of the Royal Hospital Chelsea, Ian Curror, whose programme is entitled "Heroic Belgians" and will feature music by Franck, Peeters and Jongen. On October 14th we welcome "Pieces of Eight" formed from within the well- known local choral group, the St David's Singers. They are directed by Mark Perry who is a member of the choir at St Peter's and who also assists with organ playing. The programme will be very varied featuring sacred and secular favourites from the 16th to the 21st century. The concerts on October 21st and 28th will both be organ recitals. Stephen Tanner includes music by Fauré and Parry together with two movements from Widor's 6th Symphonie, whilst Stephen Bell from Somerset will offer a programme by Campbell, Bach, Howells and the contemporary Canadian composer, Denis Bédard.

All concerts are at 1.30pm and tickets are available on the door at £7 or at a special season ticket price of £25 for all four concerts. Stephen Tanner
