

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE REVD. MARTIN JACQUES



Happy New Year!

January is the season of Epiphany in the church, perhaps my favourite season because it captures the sense of excitement of what the Christmas event actually means!



It means that humanity and divinity are not separate after all – and the fullness of life that is promised to us is realised when we fully know that unity – the unity modelled in the life of Jesus Christ.

The story that is used to demonstrate this new way of thinking and being is the story of the water turned into wine. A deeply symbolic story at the marriage feast, representing the final marriage between God and his people, and how the water of our ordinary existence is turned into rich intoxicating wine when God is allowed to suffuse it with His Spirit.

Seeing the importance of signs and symbols and metaphor was what first allowed me to see beyond the surface meaning of John's gospel and see deeper into the Christ mystery. It raises the turning of water

into wine from what might be seen as a party trick into a symbol of life-changing and life-enhancing significance.

### St Peter's Budget

The PCC has approved a budget for the year 2023 which would result in a financial loss for St Peter's of £24,095. This will substantially eat further into our diminishing reserves.

The Diocesan parish contribution in the budget of £88,702 is in line with the figure quoted by the Diocese. This has reduced by £5,438 from 2022 due to a lower number reported for participants (those regularly attending services). The charge this year is £887 per annum per participant. This equates to an average of £710 plus gift aid for an individual and £1,420 plus gift aid for a couple. The Diocesan contribution which pays for the training, salaries, pensions and housing of clergy makes up about 47% of the whole of our costs for a year.

Although efforts will be made to restrict costs and increase fundraising the church is very heavily dependent on Planned Giving from the congregation which has reduced in recent times. During 2023 the regular congregation will be asked to review their level of giving in order to avoid the budgeted level of losses and to help to return our church's finances to a sustainable level. # **News from Exmouth Food Bank**

In November we fed 770 people and distributed 309 parcels. Sadly, these are the highest figures we have recorded since the Food Bank began. The current demand is more than double the number of people we were supporting the same time last year. Fortunately donations of food and money are keeping pace with this demand and, due to the amazing generosity of local people, the Food Bank remains in a strong position to be able to respond.

The Food Bank was founded in November 2012 (and the three RMC churches were involved from the beginning), so a significant milestone has been reached. This was recognised with a traditional afternoon tea for current and previous volunteers.

#### PCC News

The 2023 APCM (Annual Parochial Church Meeting) is called for Sunday 21st May at 11.20 after the Eucharist.

The Diocesan Quota has been reduced to £88,702, due to lower reported congregations averaging 100 per week since Covid. That means that overall we must raise £887 per head of the regular congregation, or £17 a week. Some already give well above that, while many obviously can manage far less.

The Carpark should, at last, be truly finished by the time you read this. The flagpole should be up again too on a new base and after careful protection from rot. We still have to do extensive planting of trees and shrubs, under a planning condition, to replace those lost for the extended carpark. There will also be solar-lighting installed, but timing of that is not yet certain. We are looking again at the possibility of a solar installation on the Peter Hall roof to generate serious amounts of electricity for the church and/or feeding back into the grid as a step towards meeting the Zero Carbon policy of the Diocese. *Christopher Briscoe, PCC Secretary*
