

April view from The Vicarage...

Dear friends,

In the midst of a pandemic, coming hot on the heels of floods and associated climate panic, a three year Brexit impasse, terrorism, unending strife and wars in various parts of the globe, a social care crisis, one wonders where the next panic is coming from to rattle our nerves and sense of wellbeing.

The Church Matters...

All Churches in the RMC are open; however, all Sunday and midweek Services are cancelled until further notice.

Joint Meeting of the PCCs of the Raleigh Mission Community (RMC)

There was a meeting on Wednesday 18th March – the focus was on the Coronavirus (Corvid19) pandemic and how the Church will respond to this developing situation.

Public services are suspended, but this does not mean that 'the Church of England has shut up shop'. In fact, it is precisely at this time of national crisis that as Christians we need to reach out to our neighbours in their need. Within the constraints set out by the Government, we will find new ways of serving our communities, new ways of being Church.

Our church buildings are one of the glories of Devon. Although we cannot hold public services for the time being, all three churches in the RMC will remain open.

All Annual Church Parochial Meetings (APCMs) are cancelled and postponed until new advice is issued – probably the Autumn. In the meantime, the existing PCC members and Officers will (are expected to) continue.

The Church of England website has special prayer resources for those who are ill or in self-isolation, prayers to be said with children at night and simple forms of Morning Prayer and Night Prayer, which can help sustain people

during the weeks when we are unable to gather in church. The Diocese has a range of resources to help you stay connected and able to 'do church differently': https://exeter.anglican.org/resources/coronavirus-guidance/coronavirus-resources/

Within the RMC all worship services are cancelled including the Budleigh Partnership services, the Good Friday Walk of Witness and the Easter Sunday beach sunrise service.

Funerals, baptisms, and weddings can go ahead subject to limitations on the number of attendees, ie, only close family in attendance.

We will develop our Pastoral Care support to people recognising that we will not necessarily be able to make visits – a lot of our Pastoral care members are in the 'at risk group'. We will develop an umbrella support approach whereby we can keep in regular contact with people, get medications and shopping. We recognise that loneliness can be a significant issue for people on their own / self-isolating.

We will keep producing the weekly Pew Sheet and have them in the churches and other community places.

A basic safeguarding training for all PCC Members will be rolled out once the RMC can hold such sessions.

As things are developing fast, we will keep the website as up-to-date as possible: check the "Latest News" and "Daily Prayers" on the Home page at www.raleighmissioncommunity.org.uk.

The Budget for 2020 was discussed and we recognise that the income will be significantly reduced. We recognised that there are a number of works to be done in the Church which will be progressed.

We started discussions about making our Church more welcoming and accessible and will review what we can do on a monthly basis.

Whilst we will not be holding Services until further notice, All Saints' Church will be open every day for everyone: visitors ... people who would like time for quiet reflection and / or prayer.

As at 19th March, as there is room for "social distancing", we are continuing with:

Tuesday Morning Prayers – people can meet for prayers at 09.30 on Tuesdays.

Thursday Silent Meditation - please arrive in time to settle by 18.25, so that, after a brief welcome and reading, we maintain silence and when the clock strikes 19.00 simply leave, in silence.

These are lovely opportunities to spend 30 minutes in the calming atmosphere of the Church - whenever you feel able to, come along.



WHAT'S NEW!

TIDEFORD SOUPS - we now stock a range of their delicious soups. We have tested many fresh soups over the years to see what would fit best with the shop and these are a fantastic addition. Needless to say, we will make any new volunteers very welcome, particularly for deliveries, as some of our current team of volunteers will be precluded from working.

Roger Conant 400 celebrating an East

Devon Pilgrim: Exciting developments have continued apace since the last piece regarding Roger Conant was published. The group has now expanded with several new members coming on board to assist in bringing wider recognition to Roger Conant. Collectively we have sought out various persons, groups and associations to expand the profile.

The following is an article provided by a member of the 400 group: East Devon MP Simon Jupp has paid tribute to a group of local residents who have set up a link between their village and an American city founded by a Devon-born settler four centuries ago. The Conant 400 project in East Budleigh has been set up to coincide with Mayflower 400, the British Plymouthbased organisation which is commemorating the 400th anniversary of the arrival of the Pilgrim Fathers in the New World. None of the Mayflower Pilgrims came from Devon, but the 1620 voyage was followed during two decades by many other groups of people in a phenomenon known as the Great Puritan Migration. Among them was Roger Conant, the youngest son of East Budleigh's miller, who sailed to America in 1623 and three years later founded the city of Salem Massachusetts.

Conant initially joined the Plymouth Pilgrims, but apparently found them too strict for his liking. He has been admired by Americans for his attitude of tolerance and conciliation at a time when the early settlers faced so many dangers. Prof Stanley Roberts, chair of the Conant 400 group, said that positive contact had been made with City of Salem officials and with Salem State University, and that various

ways of commemorating Roger Conant were being explored. The group has also been in contact with Tourist Information Centres in East Devon to discover how the area can benefit from Mayflower 400 away from Plymouth. Simon Jupp, MP for East Devon said; "East Devon should be proud of its Pilgrim, Roger Conant. He was a leader with vision. I congratulate members of East Budleigh's Conant 400 project for their initiative in developing transatlantic links which I hope will benefit local tourism and

education."

Clinton Estates to trial ideas for future UK farming and environment policy.

Our rural landscape and its managers will face significant changes over the coming years, not least of which is the uncertainty around the scale and targeting of future farming and wildlife support, post Brexit. Challenges include the phased reduction of the Basic Payment Scheme (BPS); which have supported agriculture for many decades. These payments will be reduced from existing levels today to zero by 2028. The publication of the government's 25 Year Environment Plan and policy changes in the forthcoming Agriculture Bill suggests that future financial support for farming from government will be based on a clear demonstration of public benefit, described as "public money for public goods".

In 2018 Defra announced that they were looking to trial and test new ideas for an Environmental Land Management Scheme (ELMS) between 2019-2021. These ELMS trials will help shape the replacement for existing farming and environmental support. Clinton Devon Estates was keen to influence thinking on this and we submitted a proposal to use parts of the Estate, the first based around the River Otter and the other at Beer, to co-design alongside stakeholders and farmers what a future ELMS might look like.

With support from the Westcountry Rivers Trust and the Centre for Rural Policy Research, Exeter University with a broad array of civic and environmental partners including East Budleigh with Bicton Parish Council, East Devon AONB, the Otter Valley Association, Budleigh Health Hub and the Environment Agency, we have now begun a two-year project to design bespoke schemes for these two local catchments. We hope this work will show how it is possible to support the local farming industry and economy whilst enhancing what is currently most cherished about our local landscapes and wildlife.

Key features of the trial include: ensuring management plans for individual farms compliment others in the catchment whilst supporting agricultural productivity and innovation; reducing environmental risk; maximising wildlife, supporting habitats and other 'ecosystem services'; increasing local understanding and support for agriculture and farmers whilst adequately rewarding farmers for the many public benefits they provide.

Countryside Learning in all seasons.

Despite the cold and wet end to winter, plenty of requests for educational visits meant that over 300 primary school pupils, from across Devon, visited Otterton to take part in activities at the mill and along the river. Those learning about food and farming, took part in activities to explore the crops and other food produced in the Otter Valley and saw where for centuries, wheat has been milled into flour. Others studying rivers started the day at the mill and then followed a walk downstream to Ottermouth, spotting signs of human and environmental change, including the most recent signs of beaver activity.

Drake's School welcomed David White to showcase his amazing photographs of village wildlife. Each class also took part in activities to learn how to encourage and watch common birds in their school and gardens. Devon Birds kindly donated £100 for bird feeders, seed mixes and books to support the children to identify and learn more about their local birdlife.

Please note: The litter pick planned for Saturday 4 April has been cancelled.

As always when the end of our winter habitat work is fast approaching, the past month has been a busy one for our Aylesbeare team. Along with our scrub clearance work - the removal of the encroaching tree species we mentioned in the last issue – we have been focusing on maintaining the access tracks across the Aylesbeare and Harpford Commons and at our Fire Beacon Hill reserve outside Sidmouth. This has involved widening the tracks in many cases and carefully removing large overhanging limbs. Although much of this work is done to allow horse-riders and our tractors and vehicles to navigate safely around the sites, it does have the more important outcome of improving the access for the fire service in the event of an emergency.

We have also spent several weeks re-widening many of the firebreaks we have created across the heaths in past years, where gorse and small trees have grown up and rendered them too narrow or enclosed. While these fire-breaks won't prevent a fire from starting, if a fire does happen to break out on the heaths (we hope that it won't) in dry summer weather, they should prevent the fire from spreading too far and allow the fire service to contain it more effectively. The work the fire service does with us to work towards hopefully limiting severe heathland fires is invaluable.

We also have a big thanks to say to the local scouts who joined one of our regular Sunday work parties — everyone did an excellent job in clearing a large dense section of holly on Aylesbeare Common. While we all love holly — especially around a certain time of year that it's probably too early to mention — when it grows in large stands it creates such a thick understory that very little light can reach the ground

and other plant species struggle to grow there. Selectively removing – or thinning – the holly opens up areas to allow other plant species to colonise, subsequently supporting a larger number of animal species, particularly our more specialist heathland invertebrates who can't tolerate the thick shade that a dense holly stand creates.

Outside of Aylesbeare, our annual birdwatching course has started at Dart's Farm, again run by one of our wonderful volunteers and one of our own staff members. If you missed the course this year, don't fear, you can register your interest early or book onto the course when it rolls around again. It's an excellent opportunity to learn how to identify the birds you might see in your garden or on walks around the Commons, and also to learn a little bit about the biology of birds; including how species like the bar-tailed godwit fly 11,400km between Alaska and New Zealand without stopping, or about the somewhat dubious mating practises of the dunnock. If you are looking for other ways to engage with nature in your local area, the Aylesbeare team is always welcoming new volunteers, particularly for our regular work parties on Wednesdays or Sundays who help us with the practical habitat management of the heathland to ensure it remains a valuable site for our birds.

Finally, we have a new warden for the RSPB Aylesbeare team starting with us after Easter. He comes to us from the National Trust in Mid Devon and brings a wealth of practical knowledge that will no doubt benefit the wildlife of the Commons immensely.
