July view from the Vicarage...

Dear friends.

The biggest event for the Raleigh Mission Community in July is the Budleigh Music festival which draws hundreds of people to St. Peter's (as the biggest venue) and because one of the concerts is to be broadcast by the BBC this year, tens of thousands of listeners.

A secular event of course, but there is something profoundly spiritual about music and I include all genres of music in that.

Music speaks to us in a way that other media can't, stirring deep emotions and connections. In church this is why nearly all Christian denominations feature music strongly in our worship. Who hasn't been moved by a particular hymn, either by the sentiment expressed, the connection it evokes, or the tune which haunts us and transports us to another place.

And even though fundamentalist forms of Islam have tried to outlaw music, the Sufi (liberal, mystical) strain of Islam has a long association with hypnotic rhythmic music designed to transport a person to another state of consciousness.

And the spiritual dimension is not confined to a narrowly defined "religious" canon of work either. I have always found spiritual uplift in all kinds of musical genres from pop and rock to rap and reggae.

One of the most spiritually rousing pieces of classical music I know is Lark ascending by Vaughan Williams. Although secular in intent, it raises my heart to God because it "speaks" of nature, of ascent, and to me, of resurrection. It has also been described as a quintessentially English piece of music which also speaks to my sense of patriotism and love and hope for our nation.

If music be the food of love....play on.

The Church Matters

The First Joint Meeting of the PCCs of the Raleigh Mission Community (RMC);

29 members of the three Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) within the RMC attended the first joint meeting on Wednesday 22nd May. The intent of these meetings is to: work together, avoid duplication, improve communication and make ongoing improvements to what we do and provide.

There were comments about the current type of services provided and suggestions made for some changes. We finalised arrangements for the Archdeacon's Visitation on 3rd June at St. Peter's – this is where the clergy and churchwardens are 'sworn in' for another year. We discussed running Alpha Courses and the RMC buffet meal on 29th July.

The Electoral Rolls were reviewed: Otterton had a net gain of five but the other two had net losses.

We talked about GDPR, Safeguarding, communications between the RMC and the Diocese and the website.

The future meetings are on Wednesday: 24th July, 11th September and 6th November in 2019 and 22nd January and 18th March 2020.

We then went into our separate PCC Meetings ...

East Budleigh with Bicton Parochial Church Council (PCC) Meeting;

Richard Bunting chaired the Meeting – we started by welcoming and officially coopting John Robertson on to the PCC.

The Meeting agreed that the Churchyard finances should be accounted for separately and ratified the use of £47,700 of restricted funds (legacy money) for the North Aisle ceiling repairs.

The Parish Giving Scheme will be introduced to streamline the processes involved.

The Meeting agreed a budget of £20K for West Access Conservation (WAC) to undertake the necessary maintenance and Quinquennial Report works recognising that the Friends would contribute funds towards this work.

We discussed the required improvements to the sound system and Mike Scrivener and Paul Kurowski would meet with the proposed contractor to finalise the works and the costs.

Maria, John and Kate will meet with the Village Green team to discuss the suggested beer festival.

The proposal to incorporate a bike ride and picnic into the Historic Churches Day on 14th September will be discussed further at the next PCC meeting.

An application for the CPRE's Devon's Best Churchyard competition will be submitted by 31st May.

<u>Scarecrow Festival</u> - Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th June

A huge 'thank you' to everyone who made a scarecrow or two ... once again we reckon that there were around 200 scarecrows in the village. We were concerned about the weather and other events happening in the area at the same time but hundreds of people came to join in our fun. Some of the highlights for me included:

- an amazing 96 people returned completed Venue Trail forms to claim their prize – a special mix provided by Toffee Nosed;
- we had our biggest ever Duck Race on the Saturday;
- the wedding of Karen Gunner and Ian McCabe (the organisers of the Classic Cars);
- the six rally cars that zoomed up the High Street;
- the delicious mocktails served in the Church Hall:
- the huge number of entries in the Dog Show;
- the wonderful Raleigh Federation Art Show in the Salem Chapel; and
- the Songs of Praise on Sunday evening in the Church bedecked with all the knitting.

This event could not happen without everyone who volunteered – not just manning stalls, Church, Drake's School, the raffle and the kitchen but donating books and bric-abrac, making cakes including an extra shift on Saturday night to replenish the 'sold out' tables, and demonstrating handbells and the Church bells. A massive 'thank you' to everyone who helped to make this a great event for all our visitors.

Whilst the Friends organise the weekend, many other local organisations, eg, W.I., East Budleigh in Bloom, the East Budleigh Craft Group, Salem Chapel, Drake's School and East Budleigh Football Club, support, join in and raise funds for their causes. These organisations raised around £630 for their causes.

We have been promised one or two more donations ... as at Monday 17th June, we have raised over £4,700 at this year's Scarecrow Festival - this is more than last year's record breaker!

<u>Autumn Talk</u> – the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Arnhem: Friday 6th September in the Church at 19.30

This September marks the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Arnhem, the culmination of Operation Market Garden in which thousands of Allied airborne troops attempted to force a passage towards Germany through Holland. It is also the story of Douglas Hill (Gerry Hill's father), who served with the 1st Airborne Division from February 1942 until March 1946, and who was at Arnhem from the first landings until escaping across the Neder Rhine on the last day of the battle.

Tickets will be available in the Community Shop and East Budleigh Garage in August: £2 for Friends and £3 for >12s.

Our Churchyard

Our Churchyards can be good for you ...

Research led by the University of Exeter, published in Scientific Reports and funded by NIHR, found that people who spend at least 120 minutes in nature a week are far more likely to report good health and higher psychological well-being than those who don't visit nature at all during an average week. The study found that it didn't matter whether the 120 minutes was achieved in a single visit or over several shorter visits. It also found the 120-minute threshold applied to both men and women, to older and younger adults, across different occupational and ethnic groups, among those living in both rich and poor areas, and even among people with long-term illnesses or disabilities.

Our Churchyards are havens of peace and tranquillity and wonderful places to slow down, look around and enjoy nature: the grasses, flowers, ferns and lichens; the birds and their songs; and, occasionally, other creatures such as voles and slow worms. Many dog owners enjoy the opportunity to walk through the Churchyards.


There must be an army of moles underground ... it feels like every time the grass has been cut, they're deliberately burrowing and making molehills all over the grass! The molehills are most disruptive in the Garden of Remembrance: particularly where the moles come up in the cut outs in memorials, this tips vases and jars of flowers over then the wind takes over and blows things around and makes the Garden look very untidy. As we only

have volunteers, the Garden gets tended to once a month - the soil over the flat-lying memorials needs clearing carefully, then the memorials washed and everything put back in place.

We live in this wonderful village and it is worth slowing down sometimes to appreciate what we have and enjoy the nature around us.

RSPB Update - warm greetings from RSPB Aylesbeare Common! It's a busy time of year for us so just a quick update this time – lots of infrastructure repair and maintenance as we get deeper into the grazing season and the weather is very much keeping us on our toes. Some sites already have cattle grazing on them – doing their bit for conservation and the local area. Remember to read any notices around the grazing sites as they will give vital information about approaching and managing your time around the cattle.

We've also been busy creating and managing areas of bare ground. Bare ground is so vital for heathland and for a large variety of invertebrates and reptiles. We have been controlling the bracken by rolling and cutting it to create this bare ground and by doing this we hope to encourage new and exciting species to our sites as well as maintaining the ones we have already.

If you would like to get to know the sites we manage a little better then come along to the Heath week celebrations. A week of events from walks to mountain biking to Archaeology tours or practical conservation days and behind the scenes access to some of the sites we manage in partnership with other organisations like Clinton Devon Estates and Aggregate Industries. Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) or County Wildlife Sites

Did you know that If you have just one fifth of a hectare of your garden devoted to wildlife, where weeds and nettles are allowed to grow, where hedges are not trimmed except once in a while, where you do not spray but encourage the honey bees, bumble bees, caterpillars and butterflies to thrive, you too can become an official SSSI in the county of Devon. There are more than 2000 such private sites in our County of Devon totalling over 30,000 hectares of biodiversity land, which is 5% of Devon.

I have just become one of those small private wildlife sites. Devon has more SSSI private sites than any other county in England.

I live in Yettington and own just a few acres which my few old sheep graze to keep the grass down and yes they have learned to enjoy eating nettles, they eat the leaves and bark of the willow trees to relieve their arthritic joints.

I have a small fresh water lake that is fed by the stream coming off the Commons that also runs through East Budleigh.

My land borders on the old reservoir which is now home to a family of beavers and a family of polecats .

Even at my small bit of paradise I see and hear three kinds of owls (the Barn owl trust is putting up a barn owl box shortly), three kinds of woodpeckers, a host of songbirds including Cirl buntings, but they of course change from season to season. There are herons and little egrets that fish for brown trout or eels. Wild duck and geese who happily mix in with my flock of domestic geese. There are birds of prey as well as pheasants and red-legged partridges .

My Labrador dog found a rare dormouse scuttling about in the grass who was rescued by me when it decided to climb up my trouser-leg!

There are grass snakes who love swimming in the lake. Frogs, newts and toads, slowworm and tiny common lizards who all live safely here.

In the late afternoon or evening there are many bats who hunt the midges over the water although I do not know what kind of bats.

My kind neighbour has been feeding and encouraging a family of hedgehogs for the past year, some who have now dispersed onto my land and made a nest underneath my chicken house.

A swarm of wild honey bees has been living in the stone walls of my barn for the past 20 years.

Because my small fields are ancient grazing fields, the richness and variety of the grasses, herbs and wild flowers allowed all my horses to live well over the age of 35 and my few sheep are now all well into retirement too.

Chances to learn on and about the heaths

The East Devon Pebblebed Heaths have been shaped my man since prehistory, when turf cutting, burning and grazing helped turn the once densely wooded area into the open landscape we love today. 'The commons' are semi-natural and without continued management, this habitat can quickly revert to scrub and wildlife including species that are rarely found elsewhere would suffer.

Thousands of people visit the commons of the Pebblebed Heaths each day and public support is vital in protecting and managing this threatened environment.

Over the past few weeks, the Pebblebed Heath Conservation Trust (PHCT) have welcomed over 400 local primary pupils to spend a day out of the classroom learning about the history of the commons, its ecology and how the rangers use tools like machinery, controlled burns and grazing animals to help them manage the heath for special wildlife species. Groups were transported in a new bespoke covered trailer and resources were commissioned to support schoolteachers. Around 300 Post-16 students will also undertake biology and environmental science fieldwork this month.

Youngsters learn they have full and free access to the Pebblebed Heaths on foot and that horse riding and cycling by individuals is permitted by the landowner Clinton Devon Estates too. We hope they'll also remember why there is need for responsible use of this special and

shared space. Overnight camping, fires and barbecues are not allowed nor is metal detecting or the flying of drones.

Mountain bikers are welcome if they don't modify trails and tracks. Dog walkers should keep canine friends close by and always pick up, all of which helps makes the heaths a safer and pleasanter place for everyone.

Our Friends of the Common group ensures the PHCT continues to develop with public support.

Finally whatever your age if you're keen to discover more about the Pebblebeds then look out for Heath Week www.heathweek.org between 28 July and 3 August. Each day reflects a different aspect of the Heath, from wildlife to recreation, history to volunteering and getting involved. Organised by PHCT, RSPB, DWT and the countryside team at EDDC with support from businesses, wildlife charities and local organisations promises over 25 events during the week to celebrate everything that is special about the heaths.
