In the church calendar it also marks the giving of Christ's Spirit on the feast of Pentecost on the 9th June so mirroring the energy and optimism of the season. One hopes that the light of the Son breathed on us chases all our cares away just as effectively as the light of the Sun. That correlation between the "Sun" and the "Son" has been celebrated since the earliest days of the church. Did you know that traditionally all church altars face East? That is so that symbolically the minister at the altar in the East end of the church faced the rising sun as he celebrated Holy Communion. In those early days of course, the presiding minister faced away from the congregation and towards the East.

The symbolism might have been mostly lost now but the light and warmth of Christ rising every day meant that every day was the day of resurrection as spiritually of course it always has been!

This is amplified on the feast of Pentecost of course as we celebrate God's Spirit being poured out in order to invigorate and energise us to become God's people in order to spread the gospel of freedom and love to a needy world.

The Church Matters

Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). 21 people (plus 5 'apologies') attended these two meetings – more than last year and not just because the Vicar and Associate Priest made up the numbers!

At the APM, Marilyn Hobbs and Paul Kurowski were elected as Churchwardens for another year and will be 'sworn in' at the Archdeacon of Exeter's Visitation to St. Peter's Church, Budleigh Salterton, on Monday 3rd June.

At the APCM, Rev'd Martin thanked everyone for the warm welcome to him and Louise following their move from the Northeast. Rev'd Karen's first impression of All Saints at her Licensing Service and thanked everyone for her warm welcome and hospitality ... apparently we all like to eat!

There will be a booklet produced and available in the Church in late May / early June. It will highlight the Church's Activities encompassing "Reaching out into the Community", "Sharing our Faith with Others", "Caring for Others", "Enhancing our Worship" and "Looking after our Church" ... you do not have to come to Church to get involved.

Rev'd Martin was pleased to note that there had been no safeguarding incidents last year.

Following the Electoral Roll renewal process, our numbers are down to 63. A reduction in numbers does not affect how much the Diocese expects for our Common Fund contribution.

Despite a number of initiatives, the Church is still running at a deficit. A Parish Giving Scheme will be introduced which will speed up Gift Aid handling and mean that such monies come to the Church quicker.

In future, our PCC will meet with St. Peter's PCC and St. Michael's PCC in a joint RMC meeting covering aspects that affect all three churches and then we will have our PCC meeting to focus on the fabric, funds and specific issues relating to All Saints' Church – this started on Wednesday 22nd May.

Otter Valley Association - June diary Monday, 3rd June - 10.30am - WALK

Meet: Newton Poppleford Rec CP (OS 115, SY 088 899) at 09.30am to share cars or meet at the start point "Under the Viaduct" Start: Okehampton YHA car park (OL 28, SX 593 944) 6.5 - 7miles, around 3.5 hours plus lunch.

A stunning walk in clear weather. We start with a steep climb out of Okehampton which soon takes us up onto the quiet rugged scenery of the fringes of Dartmoor with views of the 2 highest points Yes Tor and High Willhays. Descending around the Meldon Quarry we pass the remains of a Copper Mine and walk alongside a river where we have a picnic lunch. We then return to Okehampton passing underneath the striking Meldon Viaduct and along the West Devon Way with glimpses of the nearby Castle. We end the walk with a climb back out of Okehampton with the option of tea in the station tearooms.

Forestry

Strength in the timber market continues and dry conditions meant harvesting could continue throughout the winter. However good weather also meant more pests, resulting in the earliest requirement to apply insecticide for pine beetle; six weeks earlier than any previous year!

In North Devon, roadside and farm tree inspections have been completed, moving onto those at residential properties to bring these trees into our routine inspection programme.

At Leaford Plantation, outside Knowle, problems were encountered recently with dog walkers who put themselves in danger by ignoring safety signage by entering an active harvesting site. Safety signs indicating the temporary closure of permissive access serve an important purpose and we ask that everyone follows their instruction and direction.

Bicton Arena

A successful neighbours forum took place recently where we were heartened that so many local residents felt reassured that we are committed to listening and working to find solutions to issues ease heavy traffic and noise from tannoy announcements at large events.

The April International Horse Trials which fell over the sunny Easter weekend drew a maximum number of competitors and a 50% increase in spectators. Last month saw the British

Show Jumping Spectacular followed by a Pony Club Tetrathlon event during half term. The only large event in June is the: British Show Jumping Pony Premier 21st – 23rd June. Arrivals Thursday 20th June (including large lorries). Local competitors will be travelling in daily. Most departures will be on Sunday 23rd June.

Clinton Farm Partnership
Spring calving, which takes place at
Dalditch Farm, will be completed by the
middle of the month and all spring
crops have been drilled and had slurry
applied. Recent improvements on the
farm include 5500 metres of new
fencing, water troughs and cattle tracks,
which makes moving cattle to new
grazing areas more straightforward and
reduces staff time.

The opportunity to enjoy local produce whilst reducing both food miles and single use plastic comes a step closer next month as a direct sale vending machine will be installed at Otterton Mill, selling pasteurised organic milk from the Clinton herd direct to local people.

Property and Land

The Estate has worked with the Parish Councils at Beer and East Budleigh to enable Devon Air Ambulance to have night landing sites in each village. Sales at both King Alfred's Way and Plumb Park are going well and planning permission was granted to develop a barn in East Budleigh and at Short Furlong in Beer. Work is ongoing to bring all residential and commercial properties up to higher energy standards, an EPC rating of E or above.

Over 100 allotment holders across the Estate were sent wildlife gardening leaflets and wildflower seeds and encouraged to plant a small area for pollinating insects which in turn provide food for bats and other species that feed on them.

Pebblebed Heaths

Recent bird monitoring suggests our Dartford warbler numbers (60 pairs) may have recovered better than hoped after the late snow of 2018 caused the population to drop from 100 to 30 pairs. Last year's long hot summer will have helped, as the birds could raise multiple broods. We have had a good response to a request to report adder sightings with both females and males being spotted across the heaths. A grid reference and a photo would be brilliant if you are lucky to spot one when walking on the

commons and will help us with our understanding of these special reptiles and how they use the heaths at different times of the year.

Countryside Learning

Look out for new signage on gates across the home farm, with details about the crops that are growing and other useful information. Over 300 pupils from local primaries will spend a day on the farm this month learning about milk production, the importance of soil and the vital role pollinators play. Primary and secondary schools will also spend time learning on the heaths this summer. To make the most of their time with us we are pleased to have new educational resources for schools to use before, during and after their visits and a bespoke trailer to transport groups across the site more easily.
