The Church Matters

"Our Church in 2025"

28 folk from the village spent a constructive and enjoyable afternoon at the All Saints Church hall on the 3rd February looking at the future for the Church in East Budleigh. Rev'd Martin Jacques was encouraged by the positivity of the discussions and the intent to take our local mission forward for the community.

Plans included, open air services, Songs of Praise, Open church sessions and family friendly events which will be developed further at an Away Day for the three churches in the Raleigh Mission Community to which everyone is invited on the 6th April. All Saints Parochial Church Council (PCC) on Wednesday 13th February

Marilyn Hobbs and Richard Eglin sent their apologies. Prior to the meeting, the reports from Peter Halford Head of Drake's School and Alan Murdoch from the Bell Ringers were reviewed. Geoff Aplin has taken over from Stuart Lovett as Churches Partnership Coordinator and asked for guidance on how to best serve the interests of All Saints Church. He provided feedback about the music in the Church and commented on the excellent number of people at the Taize service. He spoke about the Hand Bells Choir and that he had purchased a Size 19F handbell and hopes to get more. Rev'd Martin talked about "Mission" being widely defined Biblically to encompass worship, ministry, evangelism, fellowship and discipleship and that part of our Mission continues to involve 'Open the Book' at the schools and will include an Alpha course for the whole of the RMC. He stated that the information gained at All Saints' "Our Church in 2025" (see above) will be supplemented and honed at the RMC Away Day on 6th April into a Mission Action Plan to go forward together. Further Martin said that the Venerable Trevor Jones had proposed a Plan of Action to bring the three PCCs in the RMC closer together by having only four meetings in the year at the same time in the same venue followed by a plenary session covering topics across the whole of the RMC, eg, mission, safeguarding and pastoral care. The 'local' PCCs will retain responsibility for the finances and fabric of their Church Buildings. This will be trialled for a year after the Annual Parish Church Meetings in April. Maria presented the financial review of 2018 - there is a significant overspend as a result of the work in the Church, the improvements in the Church Hall, and part funding of the RMC Youth Minister. The 2019 budget was reviewed and approved. The Terms of Reference of the Finance Sub-Committee were reviewed and approved. This new sub-committee will review the Church finances on a monthly basis and provide feedback and guidance to the Standing Committee and the PCC. Paul presented the Churchwardens' Report - the current works are within budget and on time. Following the 2016 Quinquennial Report, there are works to be completed within the next two years. PCC approved: the proposal from West Access Conservation for regular maintenance services; the electrical work needed for the timer switch and lights in the Church; and the Churchyard tree inspection every two years. Mike Scrivener will get three quotes to upgrade or replace the sound system. Paul will progress the work for improved safety and access in and around the Churchyards as well as the long-term need for a future churchyard site.

The PCC discussed the General Data Protection Requirements and the plans to keep peoples' data confidential including the Electoral Roll updates in the next two months.

Margaret highlighted that the PCC needed to provide input into the RMC's Deanery Plan – Fran and Rev'd Martin are coordinating this activity.

Kate said that there were no safeguarding incidents since the last PCC Meeting. She highlighted the Diocese's safeguarding updates and said that she would be attending the Safeguarding Forum in March.

The PCC members are: Rev'd Martin Jacques; Maria Malinowska; Richard Bunting; Kate Ponting; Margaret Briggs; Richard Eglin; Jane Buckland-Wright; Jenny Hill; Christine Newall; Sue Pyne; Marilyn Hobbs; and Paul Kurowski, with Fran Mills as Minute Secretary.

North Aisle Ceiling

"Don't pick at it!" ... "leave it alone" ...

Working with our Church Architect and having exposed 15 rafters at the west end of the North Aisle ceiling, it was necessary to enhance the scaffolding to support the ceiling whilst the 12 rafters were being replaced. As the scaffolding extended the full length of the North Aisle, we decided to check the east end of the ceiling – this revealed another 11 rafters needing replacement. The Diocese approved the work and our existing contractors will complete the work in time for Easter all being well. Thank you for your patience whilst the work continues.



Friday, 1st March, - 10.00am - WALK Start: NT car park at Branscombe Mouth (charge applies) (OS 115, SY 207 882), 6.5 miles, 3 hours. Meet at Newton Poppleford recreation ground car park (OS 115, SY 088 899) at 09.15am to share cars or meet at the start point. "Branscombe to Beer" A popular coastal walk along the SWCP with fantastic cliff top views on the return journey. "In the Footsteps of Samuel Taylor Coleridge" Challenging uphill start to Hollow Head Cross and the views from White Cross, then descending into Ottery St Mary, the home of Coleridge. Lunch at the Volunteer Inn, followed by Town walk and a gentle walk back along the river Otter Walk Leaders: Iain Ure & Dee Woods, 01395 568822

Friday, 22nd March, - 10.00am - WALK Meet: Newton Poppleford Rec Ground (OS 115 SY 088 899) at 9.30am to share cars or meet at start point. "A springtime coast path and inland walk" Start: Small Car Park (off Grammar Lane) Weston (OS 115 SY 167 890) at 10am 6/7 miles 3.5 hours + optional stop for lunch at the end of the walk at the new café at the Donkey Sanctuary. The walk will take us along the side of Weston Combe to join the coast path. We will follow the coast path westwards towards Sidmouth initially with a steep stepped descent to the beach at Weston Mouth before climbing up past the Weston Plats and walking along the path as it descends and ascends past Salcombe Mouth & up Salcombe Hill Cliff. This section of path is steep in parts and can be muddy when wet, but weather permitting our efforts should be rewarded with stunning views along the coast. From the top of Salcombe Hill Cliff our route will take us inland for the return to Weston via Salcombe Regis. "Budleigh to Sidmouth – the coastal route" From Budleigh Salterton we follow the coast path all the way to Sidmouth and hope to get some wonderful views along the way. This walk is normally done in summer and the landscape will have a different feel to it in March. There's only one stiff climb, but the path may be slippery in places at this time of year. We'll break for lunch at Ladram Bay (bring a picnic or buy it there) and finish up at the bus triangle in Sidmouth. Friday, 29th March, 10.00am - WALK Start at Kennford, (OS 110, SX 914 859), 6.5 miles with an optional add on 2 miles. "Do ya ken Kenn? – a journey into the past through rolling landscapes and woods and along ancient tracks with stunning views" Meet at Newton Poppleford Recreation Ground to leave at 9.30am in shared cars to the outskirts of Kennford for a walk start of 10.00am. Parking in Kennford: travelling along the A38, just before the A38/A380 split there is a turn off to Kenn and Kennford. Having turned off, turn immediately left towards Kennford and then turn left before the sign for Kennford and the phone box to park in the road. We leave the noise of the traffic behind as we follow country lanes and paths and pass through Kenn. Following the River Kenn and then a tributary, we ascend gradually to a tree-flanked lane climbing upwards with magnificent views (weather permitting!) to Exmouth, the estuary and Exeter. We follow a secret path to join St. Andrew's Lane that dates back to the Iron Age and leads us back to Kenn where we break for lunch at The Ley Arms. After this we propose a visit to the interesting St Andrew's Church. From here there is an easy 15 minute walk back to the cars. For those wanting the "add on" we will continue up the churchyard to get stunning views of Haldon and the Exe estuary before joining the Old Dawlish Road through the old village of Kennford and back to the cars. It would help, although not essential, if you could let us know if you are interested in this walk so that we can advise The Ley Arms on potential numbers for lunch. On 15th January, the 10 volunteers of the Churchyard Working Party marvelled at the snowdrops and primroses that were out already! Drains were cleared as far as an arm's length, the Christmas tree was 'sorted', mole hills were raked out, the Church Hall gutter cleared, fallen branches cleared, graves tended, old ant hills removed, paths swept and the Church Hall border weeded.

On 15th February, we had 11 volunteers. There was a lot of tidying up to do, eg, fallen branches, weeding the Church Hall patio and border, clearing ivy off graves, and edging borders. The work in clearing ant hills, mole heaps and delineating graves has meant that we've been able to in-fill the sunken grass path in the old churchyard that runs parallel with Yettington Road. As we had strimmed/cut and cleared the tall vegetation in the old Churchyard last year, we were 'rewarded' with lots of snowdrops, primroses, crocuses, daffodils, celandines, stitchworts, daisies and speedwells.

Thanks to all who help maintain the attractive environment around the Church and Church Hall.

The Churchyard Working Party meets at 10.00 by the shed at the back of the old churchyard. The dates for Spring are:

Friday 15 March; Friday 12 April; and Friday 17 May.

Clinton Farms

Forage stocks are looking a bit tight, so the team are hoping the mild weather continues and that grass grows enabling an early turn out for the cows. Sadly, our milk price is reducing by just over a penny per litre although recent investment in a new parlour has reduced milking time by an hour, freeing up staff time for other farm tasks. Calving has started at Dalditch farm and will continue till early June.

Contractors and our volunteer hedge group will continue to rejuvenate sections of overgrown and sheep damaged hedges at Ashtree Farm using the traditional skill of hedgelaying.

River Otter Estuary

Walkers have been delighted that the footpath between White Bridge and Lime Kiln re-opened ahead of schedule. This was the culmination of a joint project between the Environment Agency, East Devon District Council, Bridge Civil Engineering of Chudleigh, and Clinton Devon Estates who worked together to organise repairs after the path was washed away. We are grateful to our volunteer wardens Doug and Joan Cullen, who kept walkers informed of the alternative route. Join Clinton Devon Estates and the Otter Valley Association for the Spring Litter Pick on 23 March 1100-1300. Meet at Lime Kiln car park. FREE car parking and equipment provided.

Pebblebed Heaths

The MOD contractors should complete their repairs to the grenade range on Colaton Raleigh Common this month. They have undertaken track repairs and are bringing in some stone using pebblebed material sourced from Uffcombe. The main access route is via Warren car park, but warning signs will be deployed on all the tracks that cross their access route and the staff posted in the carpark will be able to give people further information.

Forestry

In the plantations adjacent to Castle Lane in Exmouth thinning work continues and we hope to invite local schools to get a closer view and teach them about forestry and sustainable timber production.

Land and Property

The show home at King Alfred Way, Newton Poppleford is now open and house sales at Plumb Park at Littleham are going well. The team have been working hard to bring the EPC ratings of our rental properties up to an E or above. Ensuring older properties are energy efficient brings its challenges but this important legal requirement is one we also know improves properties for our tenants. The Estate continues to work with farming tenants during Brexit, keeping them informed and supported to ensure their businesses remain viable in an uncertain future.

Bicton Arena

Over the winter Sheep have been grazing the parkland, keeping the grass down and employing their 'golden hooves' to sort the divots in the turf. During the quieter months providing an opportunity for riders to jump the cross-country fences on the all-weather arena, was a popular one. But now these jumps have been moved to make way for dressage and show-jumping competitions. Preparations are in full swing for the coming season, the Bicton Horse Trails are the first major competition and start on 19 April. Yettington and East Budleigh residents are once again invited to join the team from Bicton Arena at our Neighbours Forum on Tuesday 26 March at 1900. We will report back on any issues/actions from last year, give an overview of the season ahead and respond to questions and queries. Do join us if you can.


