Dear friends

We are so lucky to live in this beautiful part of East Devon during this lockdown. Imagine living in a tower block in London where they may have closed the parks. The good weather we have been enjoying would be seen as a curse rather than a blessing, so let's be grateful for small mercies.

When we do go out for our daily exercise, people are friendlier (generally) than they were before which is pleasant, perhaps because of the sense of a bad situation shared I suppose.

True, there have been surreal situations as well for example with funerals with no-one present except me being live streamed to relatives. The churches, being closed alongside thousands of other ventures nationwide is very strange indeed though necessity is the mother of invention and people in all sorts of situations are finding new ways of operating.

I'm sure some of you have found, like me, that a daily routine however flexible helps a bit and having meals at set times so we don't all graze all day is very necessary, especially for me.

The enforced isolation has of course produced unexpected benefits as well. I notice nature more, the birds singing, the squirrels bounding around, and I have been forced to slow down a bit and think about what I really miss and what I really need. In normal times we tend to get what we want and not what we need. In these abnormal times we can take more time, think about what we normally do, and what we actually need.

This period of enforced isolation is not good. But even so, some good could come out of it if we let it.

The Church Matters...

All Churches in the RMC are closed until further notice.

From the Church of England: The Archbishops have asked all churches to close with only a small number of exceptions. This is both to reduce travel and to help to model best practice in maintaining social distance. Following on from this it will be necessary to make some basic checks on your building to prepare it for being locked most of the time. For many of us this will be a difficult thing to do. We will miss the communal worship, the companionship, the opportunity for visitors to encounter God in our churches. The building will, of course, remain as a beacon of hope. Every reduction in the amount of travel makes a contribution to slowing the spread of Covid-19.

Government and Church guidance is clear; people can only meet with members of their own household. People have been told to stay at home and only make journeys that are absolutely necessary, such as shopping for essential items and to take daily exercise. The Church must take a lead in following this in order to slow down the spread of the virus.

We have put up the CoE notices in the Church's noticeboards to explain that the Church is closed and why.



Parochial Church Council (PCC)

As a result of the coronavirus pandemic, the Diocese of Exeter / Church of England has stated that:

- 1. All Annual Parish Meetings to elect Churchwardens and Annual Parish Council Meetings have been postponed and, subject to the situation at that time, must take place by 31st October 2020;
- 2. All Churchwardens and PCC Members remain in office until the end of the next APM and APCM this applies even though some people may have been in office for more than three years.
- 3. Under the Bishop's instrument, the Churchwardens' term of office continues until 31st January 2021 unless before

that date another person has been admitted into office at a Visitation as a replacement churchwarden – the Visitations will take place between 1st November 2020 and 31st January 2021.

The latest set of Coronavirus FAQs from the Diocese of Exeter included "Should we still hand deliver our Parish Magazine?" – the answer gave a number of reasons why local delivery of a hard copy of a parish news was not promoted and that "parishes are encouraged to look to digital communication, and telephone calls to keep in touch" ... "any vital printed communication should be sent through the post".

We have put posters up to highlight that the Parish News is on-line and the websites to go to – thanks to the Parish Council, East Budleigh Village and W.I. East Budleigh with Bicton websites for including the Parish News.

We have e-mailed the website details to all those that we have contact details for and have permission to contact.

We are aware that, having to produce only an on-line version, some people will miss out on their familiar orange, monthly dose Parish News – if there is anyone that you are aware of, please let them know.

EAST BUDLEIGH WITH BICTON PARISH COUNCIL

When the Coronavirus emergency began, the Parish Council, after consulting with the Community Shop, delivered leaflets around the Village with information on who to call for assistance. We set up a list of over 50 wonderful volunteers and families and arranged assistance for residents whenever they got in touch. The clerk continues to act as co-ordinator for the area, receiving information from the Authorities and posting it on the Council website. The normal work of paying bills and looking for ways to support the Parish continues.

Our volunteers were very keen to help, so those with Hygiene certificates cooked cakes which were distributed to many older or infirm residents on the Easter weekend. Another group of volunteers are now sewing Scrubs for Care Homes. Further initiatives within the permitted limits are being considered. 

Parish paths







Bad path!

Good path

This Spring and probably well into the Summer we are being told to take exercise once a day near our homes and for most people that means walking. Fortunately, we have an excellent network of paths and lanes around East Budleigh that gives plenty of opportunity to enjoy the beautiful countryside without going very far from home.

Our footpaths and bridleways are public rights of way and therefore maintained by Devon County Council (DCC). To encourage local input to path care, reporting of problems and suggestions for improvements, DCC gives a small grant to our parish for work over and above the routine annual maintenance, such as clearing undergrowth, way marking and minor repairs. The Parish Council appoints a volunteer to coordinate these tasks and for East Budleigh with Bicton parishes, that person is me.

Once DCC's contractors have cleared new growth from the paths in June, I generally go out and cut down small areas of rapid regrowth, particularly nettles and brambles that can make walking on the paths unpleasant. This summer I'm not allowed to do so because of the Covid-19 regulations, but contractors can be called in as and when needed. This will require extra vigilance in reporting problems requiring action by DCC and I'm asking everybody that uses the paths to assist me in this.

You can help me keep our paths in good condition by:

- reporting obstructions on paths and damage to gates/stiles preferably to me
 (Jon Roseway on 488739/ marilyn_jon@tiscali.co.uk), or directly to DCC on
 their website (https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/ and then click on the 'public rights of way' icon)
- carrying a stick and/or secateurs to beat back and cut down encroaching plants
- picking up litter (if safe to do so) bagging your dog's poo and taking it away with you

Our Churchyards

Prior to the coronavirus lockdown, 11 of us completed most of the jobs listed for the Churchyard Working Party:

- · daffodils were dead headed
- \cdot hedges, brambles and branches were cut back
- · borders were weeded and mulched
- · molehills were spread;
- · slabs were re-laid
- · dog water bowls were placed by the Church entrance and the Church Hall we have a number of bird boxes and bird feeders in the Churchyards ... a highlight was the installation of a magnificent bug hotel donated by Bicton College see the photo on page 25.

A number of the Churchyard benches were delivered to people's homes for some 'tender loving care', ie, sanding and oiling / Ronsealing. We think that this helped two of our volunteers avoid going 'stir-crazy' in the lockdown!

We received a bench from the Cuddigan family in memory of Patrick Cuddigan – the family also provided a donation towards the cost of new signposts and a tree to be installed later in the year.

Church of England (CoE) Guidance

The Diocese of Exeter has been providing a regular Newsletter update during the Covid-19 pandemic – we have been following this guidance, eg, on 3 April:

- · We are not allowed to tend the churchyard unless it is for security or safety reasons – so no cutting the grass and other gardening
- · Visiting and tending graves is not considered an 'essential activity'

The Churchyard Working Party

As a consequence of the CoE's guidance, we will not be holding a Churchyard Working Party until further notice – we will be contacting regulars and updates will be on the RMC website.

When we can re-start, there will be lots to do and you will be very welcome to come and join us for a couple of hours of "green gym" - there will be jobs for all ...

BioBlitz

Tuesday 2nd June is the date for our "BioBlitz" when we will try to record all the living species in the Churchyards. Given the current circumstances, we have already scaled down our aspirations.

We will review what we can do in May in light of Government and CoE advice and let people know – watch out for posters on the noticeboards ...

CPRE Devon's Best Churchyard 2020 Competition

Given the coronavirus pandemic and situation, in mid-March, we contacted CPRE Devon to check that the competition was still going ahead and were told "We've already received a number of entries into the competition and we'd like to continue to receive them, but obviously we won't be able to go out and judge at the moment, which I'm sure everyone will understand. I spoke with Ivan yesterday about it and we are keeping it all under review."

We submitted our Entry Form on 31 March – we received the following acknowledgement:

"Many thanks ... We will keep you posted as to what we do about it this year, because obviously we can't currently visit any churchyard. Let's all hope things improve from this current nightmare situation. Best wishes Penny Mills"

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

The Community Shop has had to take drastic measures to keep our invaluable service running, while doing our very best to keep staff, volunteers and customers as safe as possible in this challenging time.

The shop is closed to the public, but we are so grateful to our management team who are taking stock deliveries and orders then organising our free delivery service around the community (or collection from outside the shop). We are currently getting up to thirty orders a day, so it is working really well.

We are very fortunate in having a good number of volunteers who can help with deliveries and other tasks on request.

Our local suppliers are working really well, and we are getting in good supplies of fresh vegetables, milk, meat and bread. Customers can order any meat from Arthurs, for delivery on Monday or Thursday. If you want to order bread from Vicky's or Ryders, just let us have a day's notice.

There will, of course, be occasional gaps on the shelves, but overall we are meeting demand from customers really well. It is a shame we haven't been able to supply newspapers, but will obviously resume normal service as soon as we are allowed. We can't wait to get back together with volunteers and customers!

Who pays the vicar?

Timeless. Sitting solid on top the hill. Yesterday, today, tomorrow. Enduring. All Saints is a place of succour and solace inside, and outside a peaceful place of wellbeing and to walk your dog.

Have you ever wondered how All Saints keeps going and who pays the vicar?

Well, to start, All Saints does not have a whole vicar but 20% of a vicar. I like to think that 20% is his head and heart rather than his knees, but who knows! So we share the vicar with the other two churches, St Peters in Budleigh Salterton and St Michael's in Otterton which together make up the Raleigh Mission Community. This is good news because All Saints could not afford a whole vicar. One day a week suits All Saints just fine. The really good news is that we also get 20% of the associate priest who works three days a week for the three churches. The clergy take the 9.30am service each Sunday in All Saints plus baptisms, weddings and funerals as well as providing a structure of guidance and support for the Churchwardens, Parochial Church Council (PCC), pastoral team and the 150 volunteers who look after All Saints.

Interesting, but who pays the vicar? The Church of England pays the vicar from the Common Fund to which all its churches contribute each month. The Common Fund covers modest clergy salaries, housing and pension costs and the like. All Saints pays into the Common Fund pro rata based on the number of people who participate in the services at All Saints at least once a month. To be precise, the contribution is based on the average participants over the last three years. For All Saints this is currently 36 people. In fact, All Saints pays a little extra towards the cost of a vicar in a parish where they cannot afford one, hence the name Common Fund.

Currently All Saints contributes £1,674 each month. This is paid 100% by personal donations from the congregation alone. No funds are received from the government or central church. We have people who pay monthly by standing order, by direct debit to the Parish Giving Scheme which automatically claims back tax from the government in gift aid, by donations in envelopes and direct into the collection plate, or a mixture. Paying the Common Fund secures a Vicar for All Saints and keeps the church alive rather than a forgotten museum, so good value. The continuity of 800 years and more is a significant achievement.

The vicar and associate priest play their part in leading the services, baptisms, weddings and funerals. There were 3 baptisms, 5 weddings and 7 funerals last year. The charges for weddings and funerals are set by statute each year to cover the basic cost of providing the service. Some of these fees are collected by All Saints on behalf of the central church but the majority is received by All Saints. Last year, All Saints received £11,675 in fees for weddings and funerals. There are many options of services available to meet all requirements so there is a good selection to choose

from to customise what you want and can be much less expensive than the non-church options.

The PCC also raises funds from the hire of the church hall, the Village Café and some events.

These fees and fundraising events help to pay for the church running costs (£4,962 in 2019) and the upkeep of the churchyard for all to enjoy. The regular management and maintenance has produced a peaceful haven for people and wildlife. Last year the churchyard costs were £5,779. All Saints received a £500 grant towards the upkeep of the churchyard from the East Budleigh with Bicton council.

Who does not pay the vicar? In addition, the Friends of All Saints raises funds from the Scarecrow Festival, talks and Christmas musical events towards the upkeep of All Saints the Grade 1 listed church building. None of these funds are used to pay the vicar. The Friends events are very well supported by the village and funds raised are used alongside occasional restricted legacies to maintain the condition of the church buildings. Last year this was funded £10,000 by the Friends of All Saints, £7,500 by the Trustees of BK Hutton, £6,723 by a VAT reclaim grant on church repairs and £42,632 by the Dr Price legacy. It was a very expensive year due to the emergency work required on the North Aisle ceiling which was found to be in a dangerous state.

Today, in the middle of an extraordinary pandemic, the church doors remain closed as directed in order to stop the spread of the virus. All weddings have been postponed. There is no income from weddings and the heartbreaking but necessary restrictions on funerals are taking their toll.

Today, just the 25 people who donate monthly by standing order and the Parish Giving Scheme are paying for the vicar, and there is a £424 per month shortfall. Any reserves will run out quickly if the pandemic is extended. So far there are no schemes available to furlough the vicar. So if you are a member of the congregation please keep filling your envelopes or kindly put your contribution away in an envelope for each week and bring with you when the church doors open again.

To help fund the general shortfall caused by the church closure, anyone can make a donation by cheque payable to "PCC All Saints East Budleigh" or by bank transfer or by standing order to PCC All Saints East Budleigh at sort code 30 94 36 account number 0060 1276. LAUNCH OF NEW TELEPHONE SERVICE



The PGS is delighted to announce the launch of a new telephone service, designed to enable prospective donors to set up a regular Direct Debit donation to your parish **over the phone**.

How will it work?

The service will go live on **Monday 27th April 2020** and will operate weekdays between 9 - 5pm.

Please encourage prospective donors to set up a regular gift to your parish by calling our dedicated telephone line:

0333 002 1271

One of our administrators will take them through the sign up process – this normally takes around 15 minutes. They will need to have the following information to hand:

- Personal bank account details
- The name of the parish they wish to donate to
- They will need to confirm if they want to increase their gift in line with inflation each year
- Confirm if they are eligible for Gift Aid
- The PGS code for All Saints East Budleigh is 150 615 005

What happens next?

Donors will receive written confirmation (by email or post) of their Direct Debit, including details of the parish they are supporting, the amount of their gift and the date of their first donation.

Please note that if they currently give to the church via standing order, we advise them to wait until receiving the confirmation letter from PGS before attempting to cancel it.

How will our parish be notified of the donation?

The parish's Planned Giving representative will receive a monthly statement, detailing the names of those who have donated (unless they choose to remain anonymous) and all the gifts given through the PGS.

What if they need to change their donation?

before lockdown is over and have been helping to plant seeds in the garden and to cook our meals. I can also bake a chocolate cake now, all by myself.

On Tuesday evenings we have had a night off cooking to get our pizza from the van which parks by the shop and on Thursday at 8pm we stand on the doorstep and clap to say thank you to the NHS. I can see and hear our neighbours clapping as well.



When this is all over, I can't wait to catch up with my friends and family and get back to school.

East Budleigh Community Shop 2020 Wildlife Calendar April Factsheet





Scientific name: Phasianus colchicus Family: Pheasants and partridges

1Pheasants are large, long tailed birds common to the UK, where they are commercially bred. It is thought that the Romans introduced them. The nearest genuine wild pheasant is found in Romania on the Danube Delta.

2Adult male pheasants (cocks) have rich chestnut plumage with golden, black and pale blue markings on their body, which is 60-89 cms long. They have very long tail feathers that are golden brown, barred with black. Under-parts are lighter with dark markings.

3The female (hen) is less showy with duller mottled brown plumage and about 50-63 cm long including a tail of around 20 cm.

4Pheasant chicks leave the nest immediately and fly short distances after 12 days. They fledge at about 9-10 weeks. Juvenile birds have the appearance of the female with a shorter tail. Young males begin to grow bright feathers about 10 weeks after hatching.

5The birds prefer fields and farmlands with brushy cover, though they also inhabit woodland undergrowth and some wetlands.

6During courtship male pheasants will perform a dance around the female with their wings trailing on the ground. Once the female begins to incubate eggs he will ignore her.

7Nesting occurs between March and August peaking between April and June. Pheasants lay up to 14 olive coloured eggs, which are incubated for 22-25 days with no help from the male.

8Males establish harems of hens—as many as a dozen female birds. Each spring a male delineates and defends his territory and his harem from aggressive rivals. Encounters like these can lead to vicious battles.

9Young pheasants grow up quickly and can fly within two weeks. They will remain with their mother for six or seven weeks. In the autumn they form flocks with which they will live until the following spring.

10These birds are most comfortable on the ground, where they forage for grains, seeds, berries, insects, and, occasionally small animals.

11They can fly and launch themselves airborne with an abrupt, noisy take-off, running from trouble but their flight is merely a short-distance 50 metres dash for cover.

12Did you know they make wonderful pets? When we see wild pheasants we associate them with game shooting. With their beautiful plumage, they are a great addition to any aviary and are happy to live with other birds such as chickens and ducks.

Doing today what is right for tomorrow

The Rolle Estate Office and Bicton Arena closed weeks ago but where possible the rest of the Estate remains open and operational. All necessary adjustments have been made to ensure that the health and safety of tenants, employees and visitors as well as livestock welfare is maintained, despite this unprecedented and very challenging situation we find ourselves in.

Many staff are now able to work from home but for the farm team this isn't an option as cows and heifers still need to be fed and looked after. The team at Clinton Farms has successfully adapted their entire milking operation to ensure staff can meet social distancing requirements whilst keeping the milking parlour running and caring for hundreds of cows, every day. Our milk vending machine at Otterton Mill has seen sales double since the pandemic began and we have reduced the cost to a pound per litre to further support local communities at this difficult time.

All communities across the Estate seem to have established calm and organised systems to meet the needs of the most vulnerable and isolating. By working alongside these local resilience networks, Clinton Devon Estates have been exploring ways to offer both practical and financial support to many of these projects. Contact us if you think we can help.

Many people are making the most of their daily exercise to explore local footpaths, bridleways and even roads whilst the traffic is reduced. Take a moment to check any off -road routes on a map or phone app

beforehand and please don't put those living in rural properties, farm workers or their livestock at greater risk by taking shortcuts or detours especially into farmyards and fields. Signs were installed recently on 30 gates across the farm to remind anyone who might be less used to exercising on farmland about the importance of this. With increased footfall, it is vital that everyone sticks to Rights of Way and always picks up after their dogs EVERYWHERE they go. This initiative has already reduced the number of walkers wandering across the farm and should hopefully keep our cows happier and healthier as well.

Although many recreational sites across East Devon have closed, the East Devon Pebblebed Heaths remain accessible for air and exercise. Government guidance is clear about the need to stay home as much as possible, but there has never been a more important time to contribute to mental and physical wellbeing of local people enabling them to escape for far-reaching views and relative solitude. We have received thanks from many who value this aspect of the heaths, more than ever including several from key workers grateful for the chance to get outside after a long shift.

The Pebblebed Team hope to continue to support public access whilst managing the site for wildlife over the coming weeks. Vital conservation work includes keeping the heath safe from fire, improving habitats and surveying the rare wildlife. Our rangers are also monitoring visitor numbers and behaviour and staying alert for fly tipping and wildfire. Fourteen grazing ponies have arrived to help with vegetation management in Hawkerland valley so if you are out and about, remember to close gates and take extra care when driving between Joney's Cross and Hawkerland Road.



Hello from all of us at RSPB Aylesbeare and hoping this

edition find you all safe and well. While many of our RSPB visitor facilities have had to close due to COVID-19, as registered common land our reserve remains open for people to enjoy the natural world as part of their daily exercise. Here are a few tips for enjoying our reserve safely:

- Please DO maintain a physical distance of at least 2m from other visitors not a part of your household
- · Please DO wash your hands before and after enjoying the reserve
- · Please DON'T congregate on paths or near entrances to allow others to safely enjoy the reserve
- · There is NO car parking on the reserve As the breeding season kicks into gear for our ground-nesting birds we also ask visitors to keep all dogs on leads around the reserve. We know it is good to allow your dog some freedom but many of our birds are extremely sensitive to being disturbed by what they view as a predatory animal, and any disruption could cause their brood to fail. We are hoping that the fine weather will mean a successful year for our key breeding birds, with very early records showing like it should be good year, but prolonged dry spells do come with a heightened fire risk. We carried out a lot of work earlier in the year to widen the fire breaks across the heath and have

continued to do some maintenance using the tractor mower to ensure all our fire breaks are as effective as possible.

Our ponies remain out on the heath – they are all in good health and are picking up the slack for us now we are less able to undertake our usual habitat management works. The wildlife is also carrying on as usual, we've seen plenty of common lizards and adders on the heath, they are particularly sensitive to disturbance at this time of year so another good reason to keep your dog on a lead!

This is the time of year to dust off your butterfly ID skills as they are out and about soaking up the spring sunshine, orange tips, speckled wood, green veined white, brimstones, peacocks, red admirals have all been spotted.

We await our summer residents, but a few species have made that incredible journey already, swallows, house and sand martins have been seen on the river, wheatear, chiffchaffs, willow warblers seen on the reserve, as towards the end of the month we welcome the arrival of Nightjars one of our special visitors and probably my favourite bird,

If you aren't able to get out onto Aylesbeare during this time, check out the RSPB website or find us on facebook (@RSPBExeEstuary) to get your daily dose of nature and find new ideas to keep yourself and the family entertained while you're at home and in the garden.
