It is quite a feat to speak to a human being nowadays without negotiating what seems like hours of pressing buttons, being continually re-directed to the website (which wasn't working in the first place – which is why you are 'phoning), listening to music "on-hold", and being inadvertently cut off while nearly reaching the head of the queue.

I also get tired of being informed that things are continually changing "for our safety and convenience" – theirs mostly, not yours!

The de-humanisation of interaction between companies and their customers is in my view a retrograde step and provides cover for incompetency as well as saving them all a few quid.

There are of course many benefits to the technological revolution that we are living through, but as many people are now noticing, a lot of bad comes with the good to the extent that it appears that the nature of human beings is being changed, from much shorter attention spans, to depression, anxiety and many other ills associated with young people having access to hugely inappropriate material like hard-core pornography and "how – to" suicide sites.

And the worst of it is, we all of us feel absolutely powerless to do anything about it. I'm sure we all feel on our own trying to push a boulder uphill when even trying to fight against it.

What it has done to me is make me suspicious of all technology unfortunately, even though I know I use it every day to my benefit, but there comes a point when we cross a line and "enough" becomes "too much".

Of course, even the church has tried all of this, and has pushed "on-line" services and the like. I'm having none of it – it was all right during the pandemic but real face to face interaction, especially during communal worship is where I am and where I'll stay. Call me old-fashioned....

"Thank you for waiting. You are now number three in the queue".

There is no competition so no pressure – it is just great to put on a bit of a show for our visitors giving vent to your creative streak. In the past Scarecrows have ranged from simple to extravagant, funny, topical, satirical and everything in between!

We would like to extend our sincere thanks to Hugh, Malcolm and Trish who carried on the work of Sue over the last years, in making our large scarecrows that are displayed at the end of the village promoting the festival weekend. 

Gerard Fane-Trefusis 22nd Baron Clinton 1934 - 2024

We are sad to record the death of Lord Clinton aged 89, peacefully at his home in East Devon on 2nd April 2024. Born Gerard Fane in 1934, he became the 22nd Baron Clinton in 1965, taking on responsibility for 25,000 acres across three estates in North and East Devon, known collectively as Clinton Devon Estates.

He leaves his wife, Nicola, always known as Nicky, and three children, the Hon. Charles Patrick Rolle Fane Trefusis, who will succeed him, and daughters Caroline and Henrietta.

Lord Clinton made his home for many years at Heanton Satchville at Huish, before moving with his wife to East Devon around five years ago.

Much of his childhood was spent with his great grandfather, Charles Trefusis, 21st Baron Clinton, his father having been killed in action in Flanders shortly before the evacuation of Dunkirk in 1940, when Gerard was five. After National Service with the Royal Scots between 1953 and 1955 he trained as a land agent, inheriting his title as the 22nd Baron Clinton from his great grandfather, who died in 1957. The title was in abeyance for eight years and Lord Clinton took up his seat in the House of Lords in 1965.

During his lifetime Lord Clinton secured the long-term sustainability of the 700-year-old Estates - the largest in family ownership in Devon - turning a traditional landed estate into a leading land management enterprise fit for the 21st century, and helping Clinton Devon Estates to win numerous awards under his stewardship. A firm believer in traditional farming and the importance of food production, to the end of his life Gerard Clinton kept an open mind, and his modernising efforts reflected changing times. Clinton Devon Estates comprises farmland and forestry in North and East Devon including woodlands of national importance, the 2,800-acre Pebblebed Heaths and Otter Estuary in East Devon – now designated a National Nature Reserve – and Bicton Arena, at East Budleigh, a leading equestrian venue in East Devon.

Knowing a strong economy was essential for rural communities to thrive inspired substantial new investment in business parks and commercial and residential property in East and North Devon, providing jobs and homes for many hundreds of local people. He built on the achievements of his predecessors by providing land for primary schools, sports grounds, allotments and open public access, as well as many miles of permissive paths. He set up a charitable trust which contributed substantially to local causes over many years.

Although content and grateful to leave the management of day-to-day operations to others, with his wife Nicky's tireless support Lord Clinton took a detailed and sympathetic interest in everything that went on in North Devon, and in the energetic and committed people who made it all happen, whether still active or long retired. Their personal loyalty to the Clintons was correspondingly intense. As Gerard himself remarked, "There are two families really: the family who own the Estate and the family who work there."

Lord Clinton saw himself as a countryman first and foremost, and took a close interest in the tenanted and in-hand farming enterprises on the Estate, particularly the Devon Red Cattle. The culling of his herd during the foot and mouth crisis of 2001 caused him enormous distress.

He was also a passionate forester, spending hours inspecting the Estates woodlands, which he saw as both an environmental asset and, when the time came, a crop of sustainable timber to be harvested. In 2019 he unveiled a plaque to mark the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Forestry Commission – in the same North Devon wood where his great grandfather had planted the newly created Commission's first trees.

The family motto is *Tout vient de Dieu* – Everything comes from God. Gerard Clinton never forgot to express his gratitude, for what he had been lucky enough to inherit from his great grandfather and the indispensable contribution of the very many individuals whose hard work over more than six decades had enabled him to be "a trustee for life" of the Clinton Estate so that he, in turn, might pass on a thriving estate to the next generation.

He will be remembered with admiration and great affection throughout Devon and beyond.

EAST BUDLEIGH WITH BICTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council now has three vacancies. Please consider joining us. We are looking for people who care about the village and are prepared to work to keep it as a special place in which to live and work. Currently, some Councillors are having to wear several hats in order to cover all the interests of the Parish. We need someone who, in agreement with the Council, would liaise with Highways about matters affecting traffic, roads and verges. We also need a person to participate in the Landscape Recovery Group. Landscape Recovery aims to deliver nature recovery at scale as well as contributing to national environmental priorities including achieving net zero carbon, reducing flood risk and improving water and air quality in the lower Otter valley catchment area. Another outstanding role is for someone to report back on matters concerning Drake's School. A parent would be very welcome. If you are interested in our "Resilience" and preparedness for any Emergency, you might want to assist Councillor Tresidder who keeps the drains cleared, issues sand-bags and advises residents how to stay safe. In addition, all Councillors have their say on all planning applications and make recommendations.

Almost all adults living in or near the parish are eligible to join, in which case, if you apply and there are sufficient vacancies, you will automatically be co-opted onto the Council. We meet ten times a year at 6.0 pm on the third Monday of the month, with occasional additional Planning Meetings. Business is usually concluded within two hours. Sad Update on Salem Chapel

Sadly the EB Heritage Centre has been advised by the Historic Chapels Trust that they have not found a new owner for Salem Chapel despite strenuous efforts these last 12 months. They have exhausted their list of potential owners which included Friends of Friendless Churches, English Heritage, the National Trust, Landmark Trust, Clinton Devon Estates, Devon Historic Buildings Trust, Bicton Botanical Gardens, and Bicton College.

The next step is to consider the possibility of community ownership, now that reopening the chapel for events has been successful. Given the expected £160,000 costs over 10 years, this is a non-starter. Historic Chapels Trust will also investigate other prospective heritage owners or private and commercial owners who will be vetted for both their financial and heritage credentials.

Any new owner will be obliged to open Salem Chapel to the public and maintain the building in good order. Initial works to rectify the frontage subsidence due to water ingress etc will be completed by HCT this summer at a cost of £23,000. It is hoped that community events will be able to continue under any new ownership.

Our Churchyards...

A Feast for a Queen

As spring unfolds, queen bumblebees awaken from their hibernation, seeking out the delicate pollen and nectar of early-blooming flowers. Distinguished by their larger size and shaggier appearance compared to other bees, bumblebees boast superior adaptation to cold climates, making them the first buzzing heralds of spring. The queen bee will meticulously scout for dry sanctuaries to establish a nest—be it a vole hole, the base of a grass tussock or crevices in a stone chest tomb. Within these dry nooks she creates a thimble-sized waxen pot and fills it with a precious concoction of pollen, nectar, and eggs which initiates the summer cycle.

The old English word for bumblebee is 'dumbledore' and in the United Kingdom, 24 bumblebee species exist, yet only eight are commonly encountered. 18 species of bumblebees species are social species – living in nests of up to 400 individuals. Unlike honeybees they do not swarm, only the queen can sting, and a nest only lasts one season. They can beat their wings up to 200 times per second!

Churchyards, cemeteries and gardens can be sanctuaries for bumblebees, with many dry nesting opportunities and an array of bulbs and blossoms. Species of bumblebees with long tongues can enjoy deeper flowers like foxglove, while those with shorter tongues need short, open flowers, with nectar within easy reach such as dandelions and crocus. Take a leisurely stroll on a warm day, and behold the bustling activity of these industrious pollinators!

Nature in Our Churchyards

As the weather warms and we get more sunshine, our Churchyards are beginning to bloom even more - the Primroses are still flowering, Ox-Eye Daisies are shooting up, Crow Garlic stalks are proliferating, see how many other flowers you can spot and let us know.

Churchyard Working Party

Despite just 7 volunteers on April 19th, we successfully completed the priority tasks. The next three month's Churchyard Working Party dates are Friday: 17 May; 21 June; and 19 July. All are welcome so come and join us and we will find a task to suit you - we supply tools. We start around 10.00 and finish between 12.00 and 13.00 with a coffee break at 11.00 ... biscuits and/or cake as well!

If Fridays don't work for you but you would like to help, please let us know and we can find you a suitable task or two. Six of the Churchyard benches need sanding and re-varnishing - if you think this is something you could do (it needn't be all six!) please let us know.

Do visit and enjoy the Churchyards – wonderfully welcoming, peaceful places for quiet contemplation and mindfulness, and a haven for wildlife ... and photography.

Boundary between Southernhay and the Public Footpath leading to the Recreation Ground

Thank you to everyone for your patience whilst we replaced our old chain link fence, concrete posts and the ivy-covered fence and removed some non-specimen trees (male holly with no berries, elder, hazel and bay-laurel), from within our garden, to create a new boundary between our garden and the Public Footpath. Thanks also to the Parish Council for its support and allowing us to replace the broken kissing gate and fix the handrail.

A huge thank you to everyone who stopped for a chat about: the size of the project; the couple doing the work for us; and the overall improvements. Rob, Kate and we certainly appreciated the very positive feedback.

In answer to a frequent question, the work was completed by Hartnell Gardens (www. hartnellgardens.co.uk) who undertake garden development and maintenance. Rob trained at Bicton College and has more than 20 years' experience - he was very empathetic in helping us develop the scheme and executing the work.

We have planted 152 bare root mixed thornless hedging trees consisting of nine native species: Salix Alba, Conus Sanguinea; Viburnum opulus; Fagus Sylvatica; Fagus purpurea; Acer campestre; Corylus avellane; Viburnam lantana; and Euonymous europaeus Once the hedge has grown taller and bushed out in about two to three years, we will remove the bamboo screening and support structure to provide a more natural environment.

A couple of things that we learnt: the holly and bay-laurel grew into and subsumed some of the chain link fence and a gate, and caused a concrete post to fracture; and once the elder had been cut down below ground level, the roots continued to seep liquid, hence it looked like there was a pipe leak at the top end of the footpath.

Isn't nature wonderful!

EAST BUDLEIGH HISTORY SOCIETY

The East Budleigh History Society is joining with the Conant 400 Group in putting on the Elizabethan Evening in the Village Hall.

East Budleigh is unusual and maybe unique in having two historical figures in the village who are associated with the Americas, but did you know:

That Sir Walter Raleigh never himself set foot in North America, even though the capital of North Carolina is named after him. He did go to South America though, which ended badly for him!

That Roger Conant founded a settlement which eventually became Salem Massachussetts, but he can't be blamed for the association that the town has with witches, because the infamous witch trials happened years after he died. Unfortunately though, his statue there makes him look a bit like some kind of wizard, and stands in front of the Witch Museum!

Also, that there is no connection between Salem in the US and the Salem Chapel in East Budleigh. Roger Conant would have attended All Saints Church, where his father, (like Walter Raleigh's father before him), was a churchwarden. Roger Conant left England in 1623, and the Salem Chapel was not built until 1719, as a place of worship for Dissenters or Nonconformists, who did not want to belong to the Church of England. East Budleigh Community Shop

Newsletter No. 162 - May 2024

NEWS FROM YOUR SHOP

A big thank you to all our customers for bearing with us lately as we change our supplier for fresh fruit and veg. We thought it would be helpful to explain what is happening and the changes that this means for both you and your shop.

Our previous supplier gave up this round and when we looked around, we couldn't find anyone else who could supply pre-weighed and packed items for us. This has had some great consequences and a little inconvenience. We are now getting a daily delivery (on weekdays) from Westcountry, who have supplied our milk for some time. Most of their produce is unwrapped with just a few items in punnets (eg blueberries and cherry tomatoes) and we are bagging some items for sale such as new potatoes (300g) and carrots (500g). Most other items are sold singly, such as bananas, lemons, baking potatoes, apples etc. This has enabled us to drastically reduce our plastic packaging, which we know customers will welcome.

We have to juggle ease of sale for our volunteers and best solutions for our customers and this is where we have settled for now. This means that all the fruit, vegetables and salad are coming in daily as fresh as we can possibly get! Our stock will be smaller but if you would like anything else just let us know the day before and we can get any amount for you from Monday to Friday. In an emergency we can even order before 11.00am and have it in for you that afternoon. This is great, as previously we were having just one delivery per week so stock had to last a lot longer and this inevitably led to a high wastage rate on some items.

One inconvenience is that buying every day from a wholesaler, the prices are variable and so we are having to adjust cost against setting price daily. We can't, therefore, guarantee a particular price on a product and so you will need to check if it concerns you before you buy or at the till. I hope this helps explain things but as always, if you have any questions, do come and ask one of us in the office.

One final note on our butchers and we are delighted that The Butchers @ Topsham are back with us (the butcher is the same chap that worked for Arthur's and he has taken on the business). He is delivering meats, flans, turnovers and pasties on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and he's even managed to reduce -yes, reduce, the price of the pasties! Fantastic news!

Thank you for sticking with us. We really appreciate your business. Keep buying local and keep supporting your village shop!





The main aim of the walk is to try and spot silver- studded blues. They are most likely to be on the wing from mid-June to mid-July. They are a small butterfly only found on a limited number of sites across England. They have a complex life cycle and are easily missed, especially the females which are brown and tend to be static, waiting for males to find them. They are fairly frail flyers and don't like windy days. We would hope to see several other heathland butterflies as well.

The walk will be led by Lesley Kerry who recently retired from monitoring the silver-studded blue for The Pebblebed Heaths. She was co-ordinating volunteers and has been reviewing habitats and collecting information on silver-studded blues for many years before retiring from the role. She will be assisted by Geoff Porter who is the Natural Environment representative for the OVA.

We aim to repeat the walk on Tuesday 9 July and both dates are weather dependant. The size of the group will be limited and we will maintain a 'reserve' list.

Spring greetings from RPSB Aylesbeare Common.

RSPB Aylesbeare Common

Writing this in the middle of April, it's been another month of weather highs and lows, with regards to rainfall, temperature, and wind. Whilst constantly wittering on about the weather may seem like just adhering to the ultimate British stereotype, the elements do have a fundamental effect on our work. As Spring begins to creep back, along with some familiar ornithological faces, we have begun our breeding bird surveys. From about March until June, we make 3 to four visits, breaking up Aylesbeare and Harpford commons into four blocks. We record all bird species but we especially track the heathland species like the Dartford warbler, the stonechat, linnets and yellowhammers. Unfortunately, due to their stature and choice of habitat (that is, exposed heath with only a few trees for shelter), these little fellows are far more susceptible to weather; thus windy, rainy, and unseasonably cold mornings make for fruitless surveying, and so far this year our windows of opportunity have been few and far between.

On favourable days, we start at 6am, recording all birds from song, call or sight. It can take many hours, but is also some of the most rewarding work we do, and serves as a good reminder for why we labour away on the reserve the rest of the year. There is nothing quite like seeing the early sun's rays catch the vibrant reds and chestnuts of a male Dartford Warbler in breeding plumage, as he declares sovereignty over his particular gorse bush, or seeing a flock of linnets, with their distinctive notched tails, silhouetted against the pale morning sky. Though it may be hard to believe out on the common, Linnets are a red listed species, with their numbers falling by almost 60% from 1970 to 2014, and are still in decline according to the latest BTO Breeding Bird Survey. Thus seeing these finches, although not the most colourful bird to look at, always sparks some excitement for me, and counting up to 30 individuals on surveys brings a sense of hope.

The RSPB staff team, with our residential volunteers, surveys our main reserve and we have a wonderful group of survey volunteers who cover our other sites, some of whom have been doing so for many years. On the subject of volunteers, as many of you will know, we couldn't do what we do without their help, and over the coming year we would like to make a push to encourage more people to join our volunteering team, especially the practical side of things and the work parties. Our mid-week volunteer work parties can be satisfyingly hard work, with a lovely group of people, and it might sometimes feel like the sunny days make up for the rainy ones but, in truth, the rainiest and wettest days can make for the most long-lasting anecdotes! At this time of year, a day spent working on the reserve, people come across caterpillars and beetles and butterflies and flowers that can be overlooked on a walk.

We'd love to welcome new people to our groups on a Wednesday and a Thursday, and in many ways the best way to get involved is to get in touch and we can invite you out to see if it's for you.

Last but not least, we want to let you know that Vlad, our estate worker of the last nearly 17 years and a familiar face to all regular visitors to Aylesbeare common, has finally retired from the RSPB! His input especially with the pony grazing, and an impressive tally of hours in the tractor, has had a huge impact on the heaths and we are extremely grateful and lucky to have worked with him. There isn't a lot Vlad can't mend after some tinkering and resourcefulness, but his way with the ponies is where he stands alone. As well as so much tractor driving, he's also made sure our machinery is well maintained and it will be hard to replace him, but that's what we need to do, and we are now looking for someone to fill this vital role for the reserve. If you or anyone you know is looking for a unique opportunity like this, please do get in touch with us to discuss further. But Vlad will be sticking around for work at certain key times over the next year so he's not completely said goodbye yet.
