Dear Friends,

What will stop that decline and restore hope within us is not to collude with that sense of pessimism but to become agents of Joy in the very message that we believe and seek to promote. We must inhabit the good news that we preach.

We sometimes sing 'We have a gospel to proclaim' and the primary proclamation of the gospel is ourselves. How we live our lives and encourage, bear with, and treat our fellow human beings is the very best advert there is for the truth of the gospel. It is the verifiable evidence of the Joy within us that transcends all and any setback or frustrations that happen to us.

We have no control over things that happen to us. As a community the only control we have is how we react and respond to events.

The future is bright because we shine with the light of Christ and that light will never be put out. We can go forwards with hope in our hearts, a smile on our faces, and with joy in our hearts. That is the Christian way – that is our way.

Stewardship 2019



We have been conducting an annual Stewardship Campaign for the last three years to try to eliminate the shortfall of income over expenditure. However, whilst we are most grateful to those who responded positively, we still have a long way to go. The PCC has now agreed a budget for 2019 which forecasts that our expenditure will exceed our income by £20,863. There is no significant abnormal expenditure included in the 2019 budget. The costs in the 2019 budget all fall within 'normal' expenditure. The shortfall of £20,863 is the difference between our annual income, which this year includes an expected legacy of £10,000, and our normal annual expenditure. Although this is a significant

improvement on the shortfall of £66,000 quoted three years ago this level of shortfall continues to be unsustainable in the long term. Unless we are able to eliminate this shortfall our reserves will eventually be exhausted. We must also continue to be aware that the church building is expensive to maintain and that we must be in a position to carry out any necessary repairs when the need arises.

As always our costs are kept under close scrutiny. Unfortunately we were not in a position to continue to employ a Youth Worker when James McAdam's contract ran out at the end of 2018. We also continue to work to increase income from sources such as the letting of the church and hall and to raise funds through the activities of The Friends of St Peter's.

However, the largest part of church income still comes from the generous giving of the congregation. The only solution to avoid our reserves from being exhausted is for regular giving to continue to be reviewed and increased. We will have to review this each year until our normal income covers our normal expenditure. You will therefore be seeing a 2019 Stewardship Campaign over the next few months asking all of the congregation again to review their level of giving. This will culminate in a Stewardship Day on 2nd June. Again we don't imagine that the whole of the problem will be solved this year and we anticipate that the levels of giving will have to be kept under review annually in order to put our finances on a stable footing. We, as members of our church family, remain responsible for our church and its future. Please reflect prayerfully about how you can contribute.

The Friends of St Peter's - the active fundraisers for our Church!

The delayed Friends AGM was held in The Peter Hall at 3pm on 26th February. At this meeting concern was expressed about the loss of membership. The Friends' role is to raise money to repair the fabric of the church but recent deaths and the loss of Friends who have moved away have not been matched by new Friends. It was agreed that we need to raise the profile of the Friends with much greater publicity.

The Chairman, Christine Channon, pointed out that the Friends' Committee was very small and when it came to putting on events were very dependent on Friends of the Friends. She also pointed out that every member of the Committee had suffered health problems during the year. She was delighted that Sandy Stewart had agreed to join the Committee but hoped that others would also offer. Good wishes were sent to Iris Cooper for a speedy recovery and thanks expressed to Fran Mills for taking the minutes of the meeting.

Several events have been booked for 2019 and others are awaiting confirmation. Cards will be circulated in the next few weeks.

Wine Flagon

Part of our church silver, used every Sunday at the Eucharists, is a Wine Flagon - see picture left. Most of you do not normally see it up close as it is only used to dispense the Communion Wine into the chalices



see it up close as it is only used to dispense the Communion Wine into the chalices at the altar This is a lovely piece of solid silver which dates from before St Peter's was thought of, let alone built. On the bottom is the following inscription - 'Belonging to Budleigh Salterton Chapel 1838.' This is clearly part of our heritage which we should treasure. If you are not familiar with our past, the Budleigh Salterton Chapel, no longer there, was in West Terrace near Chapel Street and was the only place of worship for the C of E in the town. St Peter's is it's successor dating from 1897. This flagon was given to St Peter's at the turn of the century.

Sadly at some time in the past, though not recently, this flagon has been dropped. This has meant that the base has been distorted slightly and it now does not stand evenly

but wobbles. And the lid is bent. We have consulted an excellent silversmith about whether he could repair it. But as he lives in Colchester he has only at present seen a photograph of it. But he says he can fix it, but cannot provide a firm price until he can see it. At present his estimate is between £350 and £400. We are also asking a more local silversmith whether he could fix it for a lower price.

Clearly this is a considerable sum to spend when on thie previous page the PCC is also appealing for increasing contributions from the congregation anyway. The PCC also think that as it dates from before our church was built it ought to be restored to its former condition. They are therefore asking whether anybody in the congregation might like to contribute towards the cost of doing this. One member of the PCC has already agreed to give £100. Are there any others prepared to do something similar?

As many of you probably don't know what is being discussed here, the flagon will be available for you to look at and handle after the 10am service on Sundays 10th and 17th March in the Coffee area. David Waddington will be pleased to show it to you.
