Military Historian Ian Blackwell has researched the lives of the 183 East Budleigh men who are known to have served in The Great War. 29 of them died during the conflict and their names are on the Memorials; another six names could have been added.

# WW1 CENTENARY COMMEMORATION/CELEBRATIONS

## PROGRAMME FOR EAST BUDLEIGH 9-11 NOVEMBER

As part of the Nation's tribute, East Budleigh will be marking the centenary of the end of WW1 with commemorations and celebrations over the weekend of 9-11 November. The programme for the weekend is as follows (subject to minor change), and we hope that many people from the village will be able to join in all or some of these free events.

A central part of the weekend will be an exhibition in the Village Hall, which will feature general information about WW1, together with more specific information about the men from East Budleigh who were involved. Parts of the exhibition have been designed to be of interest to children and younger people, and there will be some artefacts relating to WW1 that have been kindly lent by people in the village. The programme of events is:

### Friday 9th November

Children from Drake's School and Mill Water School will be making poppies in the Village Hall in the afternoon (this won't be a public event, come and see the results on Saturday).

### Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> November

The Village Hall will be open from 8.30 am to view the WW1 exhibition and the display of children's poppies. From 10am until 5pm there will be hot and cold drinks and nibbles available, and some special events:

2pm – A 45-minute **Presentation** by Stephen Jones – 'The Story of WW1'

3.15pm – A 45-minute presentation by Mo Sandford - 'My Great War Story'

4.30pm – 5.05 pm - come and hear Budleigh Salterton Male Voice Choir (including WW1 songs and audience sing-along)

### Sunday 11th November

9.30am – Remembrance Day service in All Saints Church

10.45am – Gather at the War Memorial for reading of the names of the village 'Fallen' from WW1, readings, wreath laying and 2 minutes' silence at 11am.

3.15pm – 5.15pm – Come to the Village Hall for a celebratory afternoon tea and the chance to dance to some classic WW1 tunes and more modern numbers. Tea and cakes provided by East Budleigh with Bicton WI. Do come in period dress if you can.

7pm at All Saints Church – there will be activities in line with what is happening nationally:

- the Last Post
- Candle lighting in church
- Bell ringing

Entry to all the events is free – you will just be asked to pay for refreshments.

Any funds raised during the weekend will be split equally between the Friends of All Saints Church and SSAFA (Soldiers Sailors Airmen's Families Association – the only military charity to have provided assistance to needy Service people and their Families during WW1, enduring to this day).


You do not have to work for the whole time – whatever help you can give will be greatly appreciated.

### Budleigh Salterton Reserves beaten at home by East Budleigh

The close rivalry between Budleigh Salterton Reserves and East Budleigh First team resumed after a few years, with the two teams this season contesting for points in the Macron Devon and Exeter League Division Three, writes SpursTom.

From their respective league table positions it is plain to see which of the two are having a successful season so far.

- East Budleigh arrived at Greenway Lane knowing that the home team will be wanting to cause an upset, especially in a local derby.
- Kicking downhill with the wind at their backs in the first half, several times the Robins ran the show, but were unable to take advantage of the opportunities presented to them.
- Unfortunately, they were made to rue not taking their chances when, just after the half hour mark, they failed to clear a corner and Daniel Atkinson headed home, giving East Budleigh a 1-0 half-time lead.
- Within two minutes of the start of the second period the home side were awarded a penalty that Alex Wicks drilled pass the Jays' goalkeeper Mark Bown to equalise.
- Budleigh ought then to have gone 2-1 up, but they made a mess of the final pass and, once again, they were made to pay when East Budlsigh substitute Liam West scored in the 66th minute.
- The outcome of the contest was put beyond doubt with two goals for the visitors between the 76th and 80th minutes, firstly from by Liam Matthews and then from George Harris firing past Simon Savage in the Robins goal.
- Regardless of how well East Budleigh may have played, hesitancy and too many misplaced passes by Budleigh Salterton led partly to their own downfall, and a 4-1 defeat.
- It gets no easier for Budleigh Reserves, for next Saturday they travel for their next league game to Exeter-based Winchester against whom they were dumped out of the Devon Senior Cup last month.



Some of you may have seen David White on Countryfile on Sunday 30th September - we asked David for his memories of the day .....

A day I will remember ...

Jane and I were asked to be at Bystock pools by 8am, where I was to be interviewed, on camera, as one of the selected finalists in this year's Countryfile Calendar Competition. We arrived in good time and were introduced to a team of five people including John Craven. He would be interviewing me. John was helpful and friendly throughout the time we were there. He was good at explaining what was planned each time we prepared for another scene. He did, however, choose to spring an unexpected question at me from time to time. It was one such occasion when I realised I would need to show and use my camouflage mask to clarify the point I was making. At that time, I was unsure who was more surprised – me at the question or John at my response.

It was quite early in the interview John also sprung on me the surprise that I had won the Judges' Choice award for this year. It's hard to explain just how surprised and delighted I was at that time.

John then asked about how my interest in wildlife arose. He was also keen to know what sightings I had seen where we were at Bystock pools. He next asked me about other local places I visited. I told him that I frequently visited the River Otter. Beavers, otters, kingfishers and water rail were among the many species of wildlife I had seen there. During all this time I had assumed that we were adding information to the main event, which was being chosen as the Judges Choice on this occasion.

Suddenly, and without warning, John said that he had another surprise for me. He was delighted to tell me that I was also this year's overall winner chosen by the voting viewers. My initial reaction was that I must have misheard what he had said! Very quickly I came to realise the true purpose of their visit and that all the previous activity had been building up to this moment. I have no clear recollection of the next few minutes!

John then asked what advice or tips I could give to viewers who might be interested in entering their future photography competitions. I answered almost on autopilot. I now realise I should have mentioned the word "luck". Then stressed that when luck happens; you make certain you don't frighten or stress any wildlife creating a golden opportunity. In addition, it's no time to start thinking about how the camera works! Be very familiar with the relevant settings, in order to capture the best possible images with the available light at that time.

Finally John told me he had one further surprise for me, a framed photograph of my winning image. At that point, he asked Jane to join me, and we shared what I can only describe as "My Magic Moment"!

### East Budleigh with Bicton WI - October 2018 meeting report

Our secretary Betty welcomed everyone to the October meeting in the Presidents absence. This is to be her last evening with us as she is moving away from the area, Betty will be greatly missed. We sang Jerusalem, followed by the speaker for the evening.

The talk for the evening was "Beavers on the river Otter", by Mark Elliot from the Devon Wildlife Trust. When it was realised there was a population of beavers, of unknown origin, living on the river Otter the government wanted them to be removed. The Devon Wildlife Trust proposed a five-year trial to monitor the beavers' effects on the landscape. This was approved by Natural England in February 2015 on condition that the beavers were shown to be healthy Eurasian beavers and free of non-native diseases. Following the test results, the beavers were re-released on the River Otter in March. The beavers have increased in numbers and there are now 6 families, and they have spread to others areas of the river Otter. They have to be monitored constantly to ensure they don't leave the river Otter or cause any problems. This was a most interesting talk prompting numerous questions from our members.

Updates followed from our usual groups including craft, walking, swimming and skittles.

The next meeting will be on November 13th and the talk will be "Wine tasting" by Sidbury Vineyard. The WI meets on the second Tuesday of the month 7-9pm at East Budleigh Village Hall. New members are always welcome, come along as a guest and enjoy an evening of fun and friendship.

### Looking after the heath for people and wildlife

Since 1930 when the heaths were dedicated to the public for 'air and exercise', the seven commons owned by Clinton Devon Estates have been used by both local people and visitors to East Devon for that purpose.

Over 60km of trails cross the East Devon Pebblebed Heaths offering varied terrain whether on foot, bike or horseback. The Pebblebed Heath Conservation Trust who have managed the site since 2006 encourage all visitors to understand and respect the sites' ecological and cultural heritage features. There are a few simple guidelines such as taking litter home, not camping or lighting fires but now three new codes of conduct have been developed by the PHCT in partnership with the RSPB, Devon Wildlife Trust and the South East Devon Habitat Regulations Partnership with input from the local dog walking, mountain biking and horseriding communities

As land managers we have a legal obligation to ensure that activities taking place on the heaths are regulated to ensure that the wildlife and habitats of the Commons are not adversely impacted and to avoid problems with other users. We are delighted that sixteen local dogwalking businesses have obtained licences to operate on the heaths, understanding our need to ensure responsible, sustainable use that is in line with our conservation objectives. They all hold public liability insurance and will uphold and promote our Pebblebed Dog Code. Visit <a href="https://www.pebblebedheaths.org.uk/your-visit/">www.pebblebedheaths.org.uk/your-visit/</a> to see if your dog walker is one of them. Individual dog walkers don't require a licence. However, we hope they will follow the Dog Code too.

Many people also enjoy exploring the heaths on horseback or on bicycles. 'Love to ride, love the heath' is the headline message for two more codes to compliment the success of our Dog Code. The Pebblebed Bike Code and Pebblebed Horse Code have been developed by the Pebblebed Heaths Conservation Trust, in partnership with the RSPB, Devon Wildlife Trust and the South East Devon Habitat Regulations Partnership with input from the local mountain bike and horse-riding communities.

Areas such as the scheduled monument at Woodbury Castle should only be explored on foot, but mountain bikers still ride over the earthworks of the external ramparts. Some areas are particularly sensitive to damage and erosion, so following the Pebblebed Bike Code will help keep them in good condition for all to use and enjoy far into the future.

Car parks and track repairs undertaken periodically. The nature of the underlying geology and restrictions about the materials we can use, mean that some improvements only last a few months, at best, before the surface settles and ruts and puddles reappear.

The grenade range on Colaton Raleigh common is also undergoing maintenance. Stone on the impact area has been removed, to be replaced next month. After the work is complete the Royal Marines will be able to resume training in the facility. The work is arranged by the MOD but impact on the heaths will be monitored by the PHCT. The waste aggregate will not be going to landfill as Clinton Farm Partnership have agreed to take this material, for track improvements of their own.




