Dear friends,

"O come sweet June, my lovely June, the month when first the roses bloom.

A wondrous, colourful display. By sunlight kissed throughout the day. So chasing all my cares away."

So starts a lovely poem by Valerie Dohren. It speaks of energy and optimism and colour. That is usually reflected in our mood because sunshine affects us in a positive way just as dark gloomy weather can have a depressing effect on our mood.

In the church calendar it also marks the giving of Christ's Spirit on the feast of Pentecost on the 9th June so mirroring the energy and optimism of the season. One hopes that the light of the *Son* breathed on us chases all our cares away just as effectively as the light of the *Sun*. That correlation between the "Sun" and the "Son" has been celebrated since the earliest days of the church. Did you know that traditionally all church altars face East? This is amplified on the feast of Pentecost of course as we celebrate God's Spirit being poured out in order to invigorate and energise us to become God's people in order to spread the gospel of freedom and love to a needy world.

Copies of the complete plan will be available for you to view in the community shop, the pub, the mill, the church and also on our Village website. We would encourage you to take a look at the main document during the 6-week consultation period.

We are keen for everyone in the parish to share their views with us. It does not matter if you are new to the village, if you did not fill out the original questionnaire or come to the sessions in the village hall. This is your opportunity to influence local planning policy for Otterton parish. The plan will be used to make decisions about planning applications for both new and existing buildings and outlines the best and most distinctive parts of the parish that we wish to preserve. We will consider all of your comments carefully and amend the plan where necessary. It would be equally helpful to know if you are happy with our plan and have nothing else to add.

HISTORY OF OTTERTON.....Did you know?

In 1853 the Rolle Estates and the Otterton Vestry petitioned for a police constable in the Village. It was stated that "a large proportion of the inhabitants bear a bad character, many of them appearing to live well without any visible means"; they "plunder by night and cause malicious injury to property, such as breaking gates to pieces, cutting down and carrying off railings, lopping trees for firewood and robbing gardens". Annually all the fish in the salmon hatch at the Mill were stolen. A constable was eventually installed in a police cottage in the village, with a clink, costing the Parish £60 per annum.
