The rescue of the thirteen Thai children from a flooded cave system over two miles from the entrance to the caves has amazed and surprised the world.

It is a testimony to what can be achieved against seemingly impossible odds by people all working together to achieve a common aim.

As such it stands as a metaphor for any enterprise where we are united in a common aim, and all working together to achieve a common goal.

Their goal was to save the lives of those children. Our goal as a church is to "save" lives as well.

We are to save people from the fear of death, to give hope even when they are suffering and give worth, purpose and meaning to lives that otherwise might succumb to nihilism and pointlessness.

You can call this offering "healing" to people because we offer healing for their souls.

This is our raison d'etre as a church and when we are all sure of what and who we are and what we offer people, we can all direct our efforts in the same direction and achieve great things.

I'm sure the rescuers in Thailand are exhausted, mentally and physically, and there was at least one diver who died in the rescue effort. But this will not overshadow the sense of joy that they all must feel now that all the children have been rescued.

This is the same joy that we should feel over just one person who we "rescue" and not only are we not alone because we have each other, we also have Jesus who promised us "I will be with you always until the end of the age".

HISTORY OF OTTERTON......Did you know?

On Sunday 1st August 1920 our War Memorial was unveiled by Lord Clinton and dedicated by the Vicar, Rev'd Grimaldi. On the previous 4th June, those who had returned from the 'Great War' held a Church Parade. 31 men marched down Fore Street to the Church, headed by the 1st Otterton Troop Boy Scouts Band, with 4 side drums, bass drum, cymbals and 12 buglers. Later, Sports were held in an adjacent field. A postcard shows the village ladies and girls, dressed in their Sunday frocks, lining up for a race.
