View from The Vicarage

Religious integrity that extends to every corner of our life rather than being corralled into a certain compartment, together with being able to discern priorities and understand the Spirit behind the law, courses through the entire New Testament.

Jesus accuses the Pharisees of observing tithes that they were required to give by the law whilst at the same time neglecting Justice and defrauding the poor is one of the examples Jesus uses to lampoon the Pharisees (Luke 11: 42-46). He then accuses them of exhibiting pride and having a love of attention and deference whilst actually being spiritually dead inside and likens them to an unmarked grave.

In Matthew's gospel (23:27) in a similar vein he calls them "Whitewashed tombs". It's an accusation that stings because in moments of weakness we can all start thinking "Is that me?" I wear a collar, sometimes robes, I can talk the talk, but can I walk the walk?

Does my love of God have substance in that it meaningfully impacts upon my whole life and actions? Self-examination can be an uncomfortable but necessary thing. We are supposed to examine our consciences at the confession in the liturgy, but while it is an essential element of the liturgy, in my experience it is all too brief to be anything but perfunctory. This kind of examination is more fitting to our private prayer lives when we have time and space to think more expansively about our walk with God.

So I'll end this reflection to encourage that disciplined personal dialogue with God as part of our spiritual life. It can be uncomfortable, but it is when we feel uncomfortable that we know that the Holy Spirit is working!

THE RALEIGH FEDERATION – from Carron Saunders, Executive Headteacher

- We currently have 61 children on roll.
- The Autumn Term Topic is "Who am I?" For the older children in particular, their focus in this half term is WWI. They have already written some heartfelt and moving poems and prayers, which they will read in our school's short Remembrance Service, at which one of our children will also play The Last Post.
- The children are benefitting hugely from our new ICT equipment. This includes:
- (i) Using their Ipads to photograph/video many aspects of their learning.
- (ii) Using the laptops to research and record some of their work.
- (iii) Coding lessons using the new Raspberry Pies.

 The teachers, too, are benefitting from a system which aids collaboration with Drake's C of E School through easier and swifter communication. For example, members of staff can save their planning documents onto the server for colleagues from both schools to access immediately.
- On top of the on-going teacher assessments across the curriculum, all children from Years 2 to 6 have recently undergone more formal assessments in Reading, Writing and Maths. These produce age-standardised scores for each child, which help to inform the teachers and Senior Leadership Team of their current attainment. Early in the school year, this enables us to put into place appropriate interventions for particular children as necessary and provides additional information for teachers and parents to discuss at parents' evening.
- In Sports, some of our children have recently participated in Football competitions (some Y3/4/5/6) and Bikeability (all Y5).

CLINTON DEVON ESTATES

Last month our Countryside Learning Officer worked with the Raleigh Federation and with Mill Water School, which is based at Bicton. Pupils from Mill Water brought their apple press and a huge bag of apples which they'd harvested from the orchard at Bicton. The Mill Water pupils acted as experts showing the Otterton pupils how to wash, chop, pulp and juice the apples before everyone got to taste the fruits of all that hard work. During the day the children explored the parkland at Bicton Arena learning about trees, bats and collecting acorns, conkers and autumn leaves.

Please can Otterton residents be mindful of the need for agricultural vehicles to have access to fields, and park considerately. Our agricultural tenants are finding it increasingly difficult to access fields from Maunders Hill, due to how some cars are parked. Access requirements can be quite seasonal but might include daily stock checking. All our tenants and their contractors will also be respectful of parked vehicles. Thank you.

<u>HISTORY OF OTTERTON</u>......Did you know?

Brooklyn Cottage in Fore Street was built in the late 17th century and became a malthouse/beerhouse with an orchard behind producing cider during the 1700s. It was run by 3 sisters, Deborah, Mary and Anne Simons, born in Otterton, who remained spinsters throughout their lives. They were daughters of Revd William Simons who was Vicar of Otterton from 1721 to 1782. Deborah died in 1799 and her sisters gave up the lease the following year. It is believed Brooklyn continued as a malthouse to the 1840s when Thomas Tedbury, maltster, was living there.
