At the last meeting of the Parish Council much time was spent on discussion to try and ease the ongoing traffic issues in the village. This includes the large deliveries to Ladram Bay, the use of the village as a cut through for folk travelling to Sidmouth and parking in inappropriate areas by some residents. To keep the village safe it is essential to keep walkways and chevroned areas free to enable pedestrian passage. Councillor Claire Wright continues to seek agreement for a 20 MPH speed limit in the village but to make this work all aspects of road use must be considered.

Diary dates: **10th November** - the Parish Boundary Walk led this year by Cllr John Fudge will leave the Green at 9.30 a.m. All welcome to join in for part or all of this beautiful walk in the local countryside.

11th November - The annual Remembrance Day service at St Michael's will be followed by the planting of a remembrance tree at Stantyway playing field where the names of the fallen will be placed on a commemorative plaque near a seat which will provide a place for quiet reflection.

1st December - The Reindeer run will take place throughout the village on 1st December starting at 10am. Please be advised that this will cause some disruption to the bus service both in and out of the village.

The next Parish Meeting will take place on 5th November commencing at 7.30.p.m and is, as always, open to all residents.

CLINTON DEVON ESTATES

Recreation and responsibilities: In 1930 the Commons were dedicated to the public for 'air and exercise' and since then have been used by local people for that purpose, whether on foot, bike or horseback. There are a few simple guidelines such as taking litter home, not camping or lighting fires but now three new codes of conduct have been developed by the *Pebblebed Heath Conservation Trust* in partnership with the *RSPB*, *Devon Wildlife Trust* and the *South East Devon Habitat Regulations Partnership* with input from the local dog walking, mountain biking and horse-riding communities.

We are delighted that sixteen local dog-walking businesses have obtained licences to operate on the heaths, understanding our need to ensure responsible, sustainable use that is in line with our conservation objectives. They all hold public liability insurance and will uphold and promote our **Pebblebed Dog Code**. Visit www.pebblebedheaths.org.uk/your-visit/ to see if your dog walker is one of them. Individual dog walkers don't require a licence. However, we hope they will follow the Dog Code too.

Car parks and track repairs are undertaken periodically. The nature of the underlying geology and restrictions about the materials we can use, mean that some improvements only last a few months, at best, before the surface settles and ruts and puddles reappear. The grenade range on Colaton Raleigh common is also undergoing maintenance. Stone on the impact area has been removed, to be replaced next month. After the work is complete the *Royal Marines* will be able to resume training in the facility. The work is arranged by the MOD but impact on the heaths will be monitored by the *PHCT*. The waste aggregate will not be going to landfill as *Clinton Farm Partnership* have agreed to take this material, for track improvements of their own.

<u>HISTORY OF OTTERTON</u>.....Did you know?

In 1800 the licensee Mr. Palmer of the New Inn, Fore Street, Otterton changed its name to The King's Arms in honour of King George 111. A mundane board with that name appeared on the inn frontage. 190 years later I was asked by the licensee, the late John Collingwood, as to The King's Arms sign and I advised The King's Arms of King George 111. The sign was eventually removed in 2013 to be replaced by the present mundane sign. Does anyone know of its whereabouts as it is of Otterton heritage value and kept safely by the village to be displayed elsewhere in the future. (See Otterton Website for picture)
