Dear friends.

What on earth could be happening in church in April? – oh yes, I remember, it is Easter!

I say "happening in church" but actually Easter happens everywhere and is a celebration and extension of our understanding of life, which is revealed though what happened on that first Easter Sunday, as being not constrained between the parameters of physical life and death but lived against the infinite horizon that is God.

The eternal cycle of life and death is now life, death and NEW life. You can see that cycle writ large in nature which embodies the scientific truth that nothing can be created and nothing can be destroyed - it simply changes into something different.

What we do in church is celebrate that eternal truth that was revealed to an incredulous world on that first Easter morning when Jesus' tomb was found empty, and his disciples experienced him as alive in a very real (but different and mysterious) way that defies explanation.

Having your perspectives changed so hugely affects the way you see and experience everything. It will also change the way you think and act.

Seeing and experiencing the world from God's perspective, all troubles, strife and turmoil are transient and yet they all mean something because the nature of God is Love.

Knowing you are loved unconditionally is a life-changing thing both when experienced from another human being and even more so when experienced from God. You become a more confident, courageous and humble person who is free to live their life fearlessly.

Easter is much more than what happened to Jesus on that first Easter morning. It is about you and what it means to be fully human.

Such are the challenges we face in keeping the shop viable and able to serve you all.

Meanwhile, the shop has a new fruit and veg supplier which has improved the quality of the stock and enabled us to reduce our prices, so take a look when you are next in the shop.

A number of shop volunteers will be undertaking defibrillator training that is being offered in the Village Hall at 3pm on Monday 25th April. We encourage all those who can, to attend.

www.exmouthringandride.org.uk - Email edctg@btconnect.com: Tel: 01395 26 66 62 Office hours 10am to 1.30pm We are a partnership with Devon County Council, East Devon District Council, and with the Parish/Town Councils to provide transport for people with a mobility problem who cannot access the nearest bus stop or public transport so they can be as independent as possible. We have 2 x 8-seater minibuses and a wheelchair accessible car for individual journeys. The minibuses have seats that can be removed to accommodate wheelchairs, small steps and a passenger lift. The journeys have to be booked a day in advance. We pick people up at their front door and return them there, with help from the driver, and we charge a return fare. There are timetabled journeys for shopping. We arrange trips to local pubs, restaurants, coffee, seafronts, silver screen. We advertise our timetable in the Community Shop.
