As a brand-new curate (a trainee vicar) in Margate many years ago, the first job that was given to me by the vicar was to go down to the seafront in my brand-new black shirt and clerical collar and buy an ice cream. Some might say this has been my model of ministry ever since! It was a beautiful sunny day as I remember and the cars and coaches from London had disgorged their cargo onto the beaches and bars of North Kent's premier seaside town – all bunting and kiss me quick hats, loud music and candy floss.

I suppose the idea was to acclimatise me to Margate, get me used to being a visible representative of the church, and be seen doing something absolutely normal. There was method in his madness, therefore.

The first lesson then was that life was to be lived and enjoyed. Some clergy down the ages have gained the reputation for a dour, killjoy attitude to life, but that is not anywhere reflected in the life of Jesus who was dismissed by his detractors as a "glutton and a drunkard" for having a strong preference for parties.

Of course, the subject matter we deal with is serious – matters of life and death and ultimate meaning – but without a sense of fun, good humour and enjoyment of all the fun life can offer – that would be a one-dimensional view of life....and vice versa.

As the Bible says, there is a time for everything. A time to be serious and a time to let your hair down. Knowing which time is which is important and when to mix one with the other occasionally.

Now Budleigh Salterton seafront is rather more genteel than Margate was but the same rules of life apply. If the opportunity presents itself, give yourself permission to just enjoy yourself.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Our draft neighbourhood plan has largely been in your hands for the month of July and we, on the neighbourhood planning team, have been eagerly waiting to receive your responses. The responses so far have trickled in, but we remain optimistic that we will have received many more by the end of the consultation period on Sunday 28th July. During the month of August, all the responses received from parishioners and other interested stakeholders (e.g. business and environmental bodies) will be carefully considered and the draft plan will be updated where appropriate. A record of all responses and the subsequent discussion will be posted on our village website. Once the plan and supporting documents have been finalised and approved by the Parish Council, they will be formally submitted to East Devon District Council planning authority. The planning authority will first ensure that the correct legal process has been followed and then formally publicise our neighbourhood plan for a further 6-week period.

News: We are pleased to be able to offer our customers the opportunity to purchase fresh organic milk from a milk vending machine installed by Clinton Devon Estate, located outside the Mill, with milk from cows at Otter Farm. Barney Tremaine, Farms Manager of Clinton Devon Farms Partnership which owns the farm, said: "We wanted to give local people the opportunity to buy our fresh organic milk produced only hours before by cows grazing on their doorstep. By cutting out the middle man and reducing

food miles, the milk will be as environmentally friendly as it gets and raise the profile of organic farming, which prioritises animal welfare."

The chance to reduce single-use plastic, food miles and support local farmers became even easier with the arrival of a milk vending machine outside Otterton Mill last month. Using glass bottles that are completely reusable and recyclable, you can fill up with fresh pasteurised organic whole milk, produced by local cows grazing the fields above Otterton.

Corsican pines that make up the iconic skyline on the coast path above the Otter Estuary were threatened recently when a fire was lit in a den built by youngsters. Although some of the trees were damaged, the fire was quickly brought under control. However, fire engines had no choice but to damage the growing crop and pipes for irrigation in neighbouring fields in order to access the tree line. HISTORY OF OTTERTON.....Did you know?

The present day King's Arms was built in 1889, replacing its predecessor which was first mentioned in 1711 and known as the New Inn until 1795 when the Palmers took over. They were licensees for 60 years. From 1900 the Coate family held the licence for 64 years. By 1888 the King's Arms had got into a filthy, dilapidated state. The Rolle Estate had hoped to evict William Wheaton, the licensee, and reopen as a Temperance Inn. After negotiations with George Vallance, the Sidmouth brewer, a new inn was built by the Estate and Vallance and he was granted a new lease and promptly appointed Wheaton as tenant, much to the Estate's annoyance.
