View from The Vicarage

I think happiness is overrated! A bold statement you may think but only because I think that people may say they want to be happy but actually they mean they want peace and contentment.

I take that slightly more nuanced view – and we may be just talking semantics here - in that I think a permanent state of happiness is unattainable and therefore unrealistic. What I think people call "happiness" is in fact what I recognise as contentment. Being content and at peace is what we all really want and can experience. Happiness and despair are both emotional highs and lows that appear and disappear at various times – hopefully transitory (certainly in the case of sadness and despair) and afterwards we return – God willing - to that more permanent state of peace and contentment.

At a Christian blessing in church, I don't wish people happiness, I evoke the blessing "the peace of God that passes all understanding", a state of mind / soul that Christians aspire to which has the power to transcend our physical, financial, and social constraints.

While we obviously do pray for physical, mental and societal healing, our "soul" can aspire to that divine peace that, crucially, doesn't depend on our personal circumstances.

Knowing that we are all simultaneously an infinitesimally small fraction of an infinite universe and yet intimately loved by the God of all things brings with it a sense of our honoured place in this world's rich tapestry. Not transient but eternal, apparently insignificant and yet personally known and treasured. These truths give Christian believers a peace that transcends all understanding.

So, I pray for you all that you experience contentment and peace in your life, no matter what your personal situation. The happy times and the sad times will naturally come and go and we can learn from them, but they are oscillations around a hopefully contented and peace filled life.

OTTERTON C of E PRIMARY SCHOOL

It hasn't been the school year that any of us could have imagined - bubbles, face masks, lockdowns, home learning, self-testing - and a lot of the children being off school for so long wasn't the plan that any of us had but the children and staff at Otterton pulled together and made the best that they could of the situation we were faced with. Despite everything, with the resilience and determination of the amazing children in our school there have been some magical moments and as the school year comes to an end, we are all thankful for each and every one of them.

The Sports Enrichment Day at East Budleigh was a huge hit with the children; they got to take part in different sporting activities, including Rugby with Exeter Chiefs, Football with Saints South West, Archery and Cycling. A huge well done to all the children for taking part and for demonstrating how brilliant you all are.

September will see some changes made at Otterton; our numbers will be such that we have had to take the difficult decision to move to a 2 class structure - Key Stage 1, made up of Otters Class (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and Hedgehogs which are our new Foundation Stage Unit children and Key Stage 2, Heron Class, which will be the children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. Whilst we realise that for some of our parents this was difficult news, the future of our school and the wellbeing of the children in our care are our priorities and this move means that we can offer ongoing stability for them going forward. We hope that in time, when numbers increase, then we will be able to return to a 3 class structure.

Our Foundation Stage Unit looks like it is going to be off to a great start with 6 children having currently signed up, this is an encouraging start and we hope that steady growth will continue. We would like to thank our local community for their ongoing help and support and hope that the links that COVID got in the way of can now begin to be re-established. We have some exciting plans in mind and hope to be able to extend a warm welcome into our school to some members of our community early into the new school year.

CLINTON DEVON ESTATES - from Kate Ponting, Countryside Learning Officer

Himalayan balsam has made its return. After many years of dedication from staff and volunteer pullers, the main river at Otterton and floodplain is yet to become a target area for clearance, as work has prioritised driving it from upstream tributaries. However good success in the upper reaches means volunteer teams are slowly getting closer. This year they have already cleared most of the Bicton stream and a 70-metre roadside section, at the bottom of Fore Street.

Employees from Highways England have also spent a day working beside the main river below Otterton. This section, although strategically indefensible (due to seed arriving from upriver) is perfect for groups who are less used to clambering about in stream beds and wet woodlands. It certainly helps keep views of the river more open in high summer.
