HISTORY OF OTTERTON.....Did you know?

In 1823 Mr & Mrs Lawrence opened a lace shop in Otterton. They bought sprigs of Honiton Lace from cottagers in neighbouring villages. In 1830 a branch was opened in Sidmouth which became their Headquarters. Miss Catherine Pidgeon was employed as manageress of the Sidmouth Branch. In 1861 she bought the Otterton business, Grocer, Draper, Honiton Lace Maker in Brook House and was there for many years, dying in 1927 aged 93.
