## **View from The Vicarage**

#### Dear Friends

Happy new year! That one refrain, which we all hear countless times, encapsulates something very special and positive about human beings, namely our undying optimism and hope for the future. No matter what may have gone wrong in the past or how much suffering anyone may have endured, our declared hope is that the new year will be happy. Or at least happier than what went before. "Happy new year" is a cry of hope.

One of the gifts of faith in God is that this faith puts flesh on the bones of the skeleton of hope. Hope is raised from a vague wish and changed into something like a certain expectation that the future is full of wonderful promise.

The birth of Jesus was a sign of this hope – a sign that God loves us and is not aloof from the world's suffering – but is involved and suffered alongside us.

#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

As trailed last month, the Otterton Neighbourhood Plan is now in the hands of East Devon District Council (EDDC) and they have started what is known as the 'Section 16 Consultation', which runs until 22nd January. This is the last opportunity for anyone (individuals or organisations) to pass comment on the plan before it is subjected to formal examination. EDDC will write to or email the consultation bodies and other interested parties as well as advertising the consultation in the local press (through press releases), on their website and on notice boards. We have also posted the plan on the Otterton Parish website. Navigate on the EDDC website to *Planning > Planning Policy > Neighbourhood and community plans > Neighbourhood Plans > Neighbourhood Plans being produced in East Devon > Otterton if you want to have a look or to comment.* 

The comments EDDC receive will be collated, posted on their website and passed to the examiner for consideration, along with the plan and supporting material, in late January. Our NP team will also get to see them.

The Examiner may ask for more details or decide to hold a hearing so issues can be explored in person. Once he/she is satisfied, a report will be produced and sent to EDDC. They will copy the report to us and upload it onto their website. It might be necessary to make further changes to the Neighbourhood Plan depending on the examiner's recommendations. EDDC can decide on several courses of action, from declining to consider the Plan through to accepting the Plan without modifications and will publish their decision and their reasons.

After that, assuming we have clearance, EDDC will organise a referendum in the Parish on whether to accept the plan. So you get another chance to exercise your right to vote!

#### **OTTERTON FILM CLUB**

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> January, Otterton Film Club will be screening the film "Belle", inspired by the true story of Dido Elizabeth Belle, the illegitimate mixed race daughter of a Royal Navy Admiral. Raised by her aristocratic great-uncle Lord Mansfield and his wife, Belle's lineage affords her certain privileges, yet the colour of her skin prevents her from fully participating in the traditions of her social standing. Left to wonder if she will ever find love, Belle falls for an idealistic young vicar's son bent on change who, with her help, shapes Lord Mansfield's role as Lord Chief Justice to end slavery in England. As usual this will be in the Village Hall starting at 7.30pm. Entrance fee is £2 for members, £6 for non-members and £3 for under 16s.

# <u>HISTORY OF OTTERTON</u>......Did you know?

Rosemary Cottage was divided into two in 1922 by Alfred Pratt, market gardener. The west side was called Rosemary Cottage and the east side Rose Cottage. During the 1920s and 1930s the two cottages and the Meeting House were, separately, continually changing hands between the Pratt and Baker families. Each time the price increased by £400, and they are joined again by Harold Baker in 1956. He then sold the 3 buildings for £25,000 in 1988. The Meeting House, which had not been used for its original purpose since 1903, was then pulled down.
