Dear friends.

What struck me most about all the street parties, events and concerts in Budleigh Salterton, East Budleigh and Otterton over the Queen's Jubilee weekend was the extraordinary sense of fun and community goodwill that exists and the need to let our collective hair down after a horrendous couple of years.

The Spirit was good natured and positive and there was a determination to enjoy ourselves no matter what. It was a reminder, if one were needed, that beyond the continuous diet of doom, gloom and despondency that we get fed by TV, newspapers, social media and radio, there is also a deep well of decency, kindness, joy and community spirit.

Yes, of course there are bad things happening in the world, but they are, in reality, dwarfed by the sheer weight of honest to goodness people going about their business doing honest to goodness things.

Rejoice and give thanks that we live in a safe, democratic, beautiful part of the world in close proximity to both gorgeous countryside and a lovely coastline, but more importantly than that, peopled in the main by decent, honest, kind people full of goodwill, trying to live their lives in as good a fashion as they can.

A BIG thank you to everyone who contributed in any way to making the Otterton Jubilee Party on The Green such a happy and positive community event. If you have any ideas for other community events and you would like to seek the support of the Parish Council, do come along to one of our meetings and tell us about your idea. The meetings are held in Otterton Village Hall on the first Monday of the month (except on Bank Holidays and not in January & August); you would be made very welcome.

The Parish Council is aware that Otterton is, in the main, a village of animal and dog lovers. Unfortunately however, there are some irresponsible owners who spoil things for other folk. Please see the following excerpts from a publication on responsible dog ownership issued by EDDC, and let EDDC know of anyone not following the rules:

- It is now a <u>legal requirement in East Devon to always keep your dog on a lead on roads and on pavements next to roads</u>. You should also keep your dog on a lead where there are other animals, for example when walking on a footpath through a livestock field.
- · Always carry a bag you can use to pick up after your dog. Take the waste home to your black rubbish bin or sack or use a litter or dog waste bin. Even better, train your dog to 'go at home'.
- Sign up to Devon Loves Dogs <u>www.devonlovesdogs.co.uk/joinus</u> It's a free membership scheme for dog owners
 and dog walkers. You will get helpful tips on where to walk your dog and how to care for our beautiful coast and
 countryside. Join one of the free, regular 'waggywalks' around the area. You can get a free goodie bag too!

Our Queen's Platinum Jubilee Tea Party was wonderful; we had lots of parents come to join us and everyone enjoyed some playground games, singing, dancing and of course cake! We held a cake competition and there were lots of fantastic (and delicious!) entries.

Heron Class have spent a morning at Stantyway Farm as part of the Kingfisher Award. Whilst there they took part in a variety of activities, including making flapjacks, bird watching and learning all about where our food comes from. They now have some time to undertake school-based project work before taking a display of what they have learned to Bicton Arena where a panel of judges will assess all entries and talk to the children about what they have learned from the Kingfisher experience.

The children in Heron Class have been taking part in swimming lessons and the Year 5 and 6 children have done their Bikeability course. Sports Day is coming up and we are excited about inviting parents to it this year, something that has really been missed over the last 2 years. The children have had a visit from Mrs Mason from the Dartmoor School Sports Partnership for a PE Impact Day; they spent time up at Stantyway Field playing Dartmoor 3 Ball. For anyone who is not familiar with this, it's a version of rounders that sees each team run the whole rounder every time 3 balls are thrown or hit. It's fast and energetic - a real test of stamina and the children had great fun!

We are looking forward to joining Drake's C of E Primary School for our annual Sports Enrichment Day where the children get to take part in a variety of special sporting activities with coaching sessions provided by different providers including Exeter Chiefs, Step up and Dance and Saints Southwest.

We are enjoying welcoming the new Reception intake for September; it has been lovely for them all to come together and meet each other and we can't wait for them to start their school journey with us and to watch them grow. The search is on for a new farming tenant with the inspiration and energy to take the next exciting step in their farming career. Dalditch Farm covers 237 acres between the Jurassic Coast at Budleigh Salterton and the Pebblebed Heaths National Nature Reserve. Currently run as an organic dairy unit as part of Clinton Devon Estates' home farm, the Estate has decided to consolidate the dairy operation at one location in Colaton Raleigh, so the farm, along with a Grade II Devon farmhouse, is available for letting. Stantyway Farm near Otterton was let in 2017 to tenants Sam and Nell Walker who have been able to maintain the farming tradition and support the Estates' ethos of conservation and stewardship of the land - a real success story which the Estate is keen to replicate at Dalditch.
