At the end of 2023 the Otterton Parish Council will be seeking a new Clerk to the Council. This role supports the Council administratively, handles all financial matters and completes the annual accounts and returns, attends meetings issuing agendas and taking minutes, and works with funeral directors, stone masons and families in connection with the Otterton Cemetery. The clerk currently works 8 hours per week. Salary will be dependent on experience. Good communications skills & a sense of humour are absolutely necessary, whilst experience in local governance would be beneficial but not essential as training is available.

View from The Vicarage

Dear friends,

It's amazing what you learn looking at Google. Fun fact: Apparently July was named July in 44BC by the Roman senate (what have the Romans ever done for us?) in honour of Julius Caesar. Before that it was known as Quintilis because it was the fifth month of the year which only started in March. Winter was deemed to have no months! Mind boggling.

It is a lesson that everything we think is timeless and changeless actually isn't.
