

View from The Vicarage

Dear friends.

The fundamental difference between the secular and religious outlooks on life is that for a non-believer, individuals are inevitably the centre of everything - we have to be, because there is nothing else! The religious outlook is that the centre lies elsewhere with a divine reality that is intimately connected to everything that exists. The ramifications of this central difference affect our ways of seeing and doing in quite radical ways, the most fundamental one being how we understand ourselves and the purpose of life.

Because the Christian believer expresses their belief using the language of relationship, the most common and radical phrase that is used in the Bible is that we are "children of God". This confirms that we are not the centre of the world and at the same time confers an innate dignity on all people. We discern our sense of meaning, security and purpose from that relationship.

We hear and read so much nowadays about well-being and mental health and while it is often tacitly acknowledged that religious believers are generally "happier" than those without belief, that is due in my estimation to the fact that we are anchored as human beings within a framework that allows us to flourish and also gives us the resilience to withstand the knocks and bruises that form an inevitable part of life.

We are humble enough to know that we don't and can't know all the answers to life's challenges and problems but secure enough to know that as we fumble towards the truth, we don't do so alone.

OTTERTON C of E PRIMARY SCHOOL

The last half term has flown by which just goes to show how busy we have all been at Otterton C of E Primary School. The Year 6 children, whilst not able to go on their usual residential trip, enjoyed 2 action packed days on Dartmoor, taking part in activities such as scrambling, caving and weaselling; a great time was had by all. The children in Dragonflies Class took part in a clay sculpting exercise with a local potter and produced some fabulous clay birds that, once fired, we hope will become a feature at our school allotment. The vegetable plants that the children have grown from seed are growing well and we hope to start seeing early signs of some vegetables soon. The Dragonflies children have also taken part in a litter pick; the equipment was kindly loaned to us by the Lions Club and lots of pieces of rubbish were collected and disposed of appropriately.

Our Ethos Group and School Council have chosen the charity Toilet Twinning as our charity this term. This works nicely with our school value of Compassion and the children have done some fundraising activities with an aim to raise enough money to twin a toilet block in either Malawi, Uganda or Zambia, the first being a "Wear Blue for the Loo" non-uniform day; they also have a sponsored walk coming up where they will walk 3.7 miles which is the distance that some children in developing countries have to walk just to find fresh water. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The result of the vote on our Neighbourhood Plan on 6th May was a resounding approval for it -91.5% of those voting were in favour, on a 47.9% turnout. This is well up with the results in other parts of East Devon since the first result (Lympstone back in 2015).

The final step in the process is the ratification of the vote by East Devon District Council's Cabinet – this will take place on Wednesday 9th June. Assuming they do so, the plan will be deemed 'Made' and will be in full operation.

Those of us who have been involved in getting the plan to this point would like to thank firstly everyone who voted in the referendum – it's good to know the plan has such strong support. Secondly, we would like to thank everyone who contributed to its production – whether by completing the village questionnaires in 2017, analysing results, participating in the traffic counts that year, or by commenting on the draft versions at the various later consultation stages. The help was invaluable! Monitoring of the plan in operation now passes back to the Parish Council.

Competing at Bicton International Horse Trials this month may be the last chance UK based riders have to impress the Olympic selectors, ahead of the Tokyo Olympics taking place later this summer.

Bicton Arena host their highest-profile fixture this month, between 10th-13th June, the first time Bicton have hosted a 4star event. Only the Horse Trials at Badminton and Burghley surpass this level being 5-star events, but as neither will run in 2021 this means Bicton will be one of the most significant horse trials in the UK this year.

It is thrilling to have an event of this standard and profile locally. The Arena team have a proven track record in putting on very successful 2 & 3-star events and have a socially distanced model in place to deliver a fixture for riders in these challenging times. As well as overseeing the event organisation, Arena Manager Helen West will also design the cross-country course, advised by Captain Mark Phillips.

Thanks go to the Arena's neighbours at Bicton Park for allowing additional land to be used so the additional distance required for the long cross-country course can be achieved without compromising on the flow of the route.

Although the competition will take place behind closed doors due to Covid-19 restrictions, spectators won't need to miss out on any of the action.
