#### **View from The Vicarage**

Dear friends.

The whole of March falls within the Christian season of Lent which is a time of sober reflection on what really matters in life and also a time of testing. This year those important subjects seem to have been exercising us for almost exactly a year now when we have all been thrown into the deep-end in one great extended season of soul searching and introspection. What my experience has taught me is that personal freedom, human contact and chance contacts are very important to me but I have also learned that slowing down, observing and listening to nature and walking regularly are things I have gained. Lent of course is a purely voluntary time of reflection that one chooses but the lockdown is a situation that has been forced upon us. Acceptance is a concept that looms large in Buddhism but also has its equivalent in Christianity too, and in fact all religions that genuinely seek after Truth. Knowing the difference between accepting what cannot be changed and having the courage to change for the better those things that can be changed was the subject of one of the best-known Christian prayers by Reinhold Niebuhr, well-loved as much outside Christianity as it is within it because it strikes a chord of truth within most people who hear it. The "serenity prayer":

God, grant me the Serenity to accept the things I cannot change...

Courage to change the things I can, and Wisdom to know the difference.

Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time;

Accepting hardship as the pathway to peace.

Taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it.

Trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His will.

That I may be reasonably happy in this life,

And supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Amen.


# **OTTERTON PARISH COUNCIL**

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

It still looks likely that our Neighbourhood Plan referendum will take place on Thursday 6th May. This is of course subject to government confirmation, based on pandemic conditions allowing an easing of restrictions. Other elections will be going on as well – for Devon County Council, and for Police and Crime Commissioner. Arrangements for voting will be made more Covid-safe than last time round, including more support for postal voting and an expansion of proxy voting if (e.g.) someone has to self-isolate near to the election date. # Walks, water and work afoot

Many paths, lanes and local routes are muddy with all the extra use they are getting from feet, hooves, bike tyres and paws. Warmer March weather and hopefully less restrictions might mean badly affected tracks can dry out and we can get out more easily and spot the first signs of spring. FREE pocket-sized maps to help you explore Mutter's Moor or the Pebblebed Heaths are available from Otterton Community Shop; these include all the tracks and trails which are not shown on OS maps and some mapping apps.

The River Otter seems determined to adjust its course into the flood plain south of the village. A temporary closure between Otterton Bridge and Clamour Bridge will enable *Devon County Council* contractors to reinstate the footpath. During the repair work, walkers can bypass the closed section via Park Lane.

Ground works for the restoration of the Lower Otter will commence this month. Drilling rigs to make detailed assessment of ground conditions may be seen and an aluminium trackway will be installed to allow vehicles to move up and down the site in all conditions. <a href="mailto:kate.ponting@clintondevon.com">kate.ponting@clintondevon.com</a>
