View from The Vicarage

Dear friends.

As we emerge from lockdown restrictions, it is a good time to open our eyes and really see the extraordinary environment in which we live. When you live in a certain place you tend to overlook what is right on your doorstep – because it is just "there".

This tends to be true of all places. When I lived in London many years ago, I never made use of the world-famous sights and sounds in which I lived, and nowadays have to go and see these places on special trips to the capital.

Because we all live in beautiful towns or villages, surrounded by gorgeous countryside, with the sea just a stone's throw away, it would be a crying shame not to really appreciate everything we have around us.

Appreciation of our environment leads to gratitude, but to whom can you express that gratitude? For a Christian, the answer is simple. Our world and everything in it is a "creation" which means it was created by something, but some "thing" can't create so that some thing becomes a someone and you end up inevitably expressing your gratitude to a personal God. That personal God has a will and a purpose for all our lives. There is a definition of eternal life in the Bible and it goes like this: "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." (John 17:3)

A lot of people find their way into faith through an appreciation of the world around them, through a creation narrative, and I count myself as one of them. I came to believe in God before I came to faith in Jesus as the image of that eternal God.

But it doesn't matter which route you take; the destination is the main thing, and a living faith in God revealed as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is the key to unlocking the world around you.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

We are now just days away from our Neighbourhood Plan's referendum on Thursday 6th May. It will take place alongside the elections for Devon County Council and for Police and Crime Commissioner. You should have your polling cards for these in your hands by now, and you will soon see our flyer about the plan through your letterbox.

Arrangements for voting will be made Covid-safe. There is also more support for postal voting and an expansion of proxy voting if (e.g.) someone has to self-isolate near to the election date. You can find out more on the government website: www.gov.uk/government/publications/may-2021-polls-delivery-plan/may-2021-polls-delivery-plan If you have decided to vote in person, please remember to bring your own pen to mark your votes! Our polling station will, as usual, be the Village Hall.

We encourage all residents to vote on the Neighbourhood Plan – we would really like to see a high turnout to give the outcome a clear mandate. It will be a simple yes-or-no choice on whether to accept the plan, with the outcome determined by a simple majority of those voting. The result will be announced on 9th or 10th May.

A big thank you to those Otterton Villagers who sponsored **Terry Tibbott and Malcolm Crabtree** in the 10th Anniversary **Hospiscare Men's Walk - Your Way** on Saturday 20th March. They completed the walk in just over four hours and raised £320. At the time of writing, on 24th March, the Walk had raised £64,700 from the 600 men that took part. There will be further funds to add to this total which is equivalent to 558 home visits from a Hospiscare Community Nurse Specialist, 1,034 hours of expert palliative care in the Hospiscare In-Patient Unit and 129 hours of bereavement support.
