View from The Vicarage

One of my favourite films is "Pulp Fiction" (not for the faint-hearted) and there is a line that goes "Just because you *are* a character doesn't mean you *have* character". Character is defined as the moral qualities distinctive to an individual. Behaviour displaying high moral qualities is called virtue and the cultivation of virtue is what is sorely needed in a world where the dominant traits appear to be lying, greed, self-interest, pride and deception.

Christianity is often reduced to simply being a moral code. I would counter that by saying that first and foremost it is a relationship with God framed by Grace, forgiveness, peace and service, but it would be disingenuous to say that the cultivation of moral virtue is not important. One aspect of the importance of morals is that they act as a sign of the presence of God's Spirit working within a person.

Good conduct is the result not so much of obeying a set of rules from outside oneself but as an inward response to the Grace one has received from God.

Actually, one of the best descriptions of good character I know comes from the poem "If" by Rudyard Kipling. What Kipling actually believed is open to speculation and we know he was influenced by many different religions, but he was certain of the existence of a personal God, and in his writings beautifully affirms the virtues of compassion, forgiveness and self-sacrifice.

In a fast changing and confusing world that wherever you look, people seem to be losing their bearings, Christ the anchor (anchored in God) is a much needed and worthwhile metaphor and example to follow.

THE RALEIGH FEDERATION – Otterton C of E Primary School

It has been a really busy half term at Otterton with sporting events, trips and some really great learning opportunities. Kingfishers class visited the Eden Project to complement their learning this term on Biomes and how plants and animals adapt to their environment. They took part in a 'Brilliant Botanists' workshop where they used data loggers to collect data about leaves and the physical conditions of Biomes. They also had a chance to explore and find out more about the plants and animals that can survive in the differing environments.

Several children took part in the KS2 Cyclo-Cross event at Bicton Arena. There were lots of competitors, all competing at once and despite it being quite a difficult course, with lots of uphill and downhill sections and tight bends, the children all did brilliantly with both the Year 3/4 Boys and Year 3/4 Girls taking third place overall in the competition.

Otters Class had an amazing visit from a crew from Budleigh Salterton Fire Station; the children really enjoyed exploring the Fire Engine and the highlight of the visit for many of them was being able to have a go at operating the fire hose!

Our lovely Toddler Group is going from strength to strength; it is really lovely seeing all the children getting along and watching friendships emerge. If you haven't yet attended one of our groups then you are most welcome to come along on a Wednesday morning 9.30-11am at the school (term-time only).

We are looking forward to another busy half term in the run up to Christmas, with productions, carol singing and a trip to the pantomime all on the calendar!

<u>HISTORY OF OTTERTON</u>.....Did you know?

Wheelwrights are not mentioned in the village until after the new Otterton Bridge was built in 1827. Sherman Robins and John Baker had been trading as carpenters and joiners in the 1840s, and in 1847 the latter took over the lease of Bramley Cottage and established the family wheelwrights business which flourished in Otterton until it closed in the mid 20th century. Sherman Robins also turned to making wheels and may have been with the Bakers. He died in 1888.
