View from The Vicarage

Dear Friends,

Did you know that there are official dates for Autumn? No, neither did I but apparently, they are from 23rd September to 22nd December, so we are well into the season now. The season lends itself to melancholy, and those of us of a certain age may recall Nat King Cole singing "Autumn Leaves". We speak metaphorically of being in the "Autumn of our lives". It is a time for reflection, looking back on Summer and looking forward to Winter and beyond that to the renewal of Spring. In the church this bitter-sweet season is reflected in the season of Advent (though that doesn't start until December), though nowadays it has largely been swallowed up in the headlong commercial countdown to Christmas.

The most significant festival in October is the Harvest Festival which we will celebrate on 6^{th} October in St. Michaels Church at 11am – all welcome obviously. Traditionally we celebrate the fruit of the summer and thank God for the Harvest and although most of us are fairly divorced from the land nowadays, this provides an excellent opportunity to re-acquaint ourselves with the natural cycle of the beautiful farming landscape we inhabit.

The social concerns of the 21st century also make an entrance of course when we consider all the people who don't have enough to eat, and a feature of a lot of modern Harvest Festivals is that any produce or money received goes to deserving causes. The natural cycle of the seasons is reflected in church practice and tradition. As it says in the Bible, "There is a time for everything, a time to reap and a time to sow..."

Several of the comments we received have resulted in changes to the objectives and policies within our neighbourhood plan; the changes made are intended to add clarity or strength to the plan. The comments form and our responses to it will soon be made available to view on the Otterton Parish website, along with the revised version of our neighbourhood plan. We also hope to display a hard copy of each in the community shop for viewing. The plan itself and the appendices will be presented as two separate documents. The original questionnaire and also the comments made by parishioners during the consultation period have highlighted some of the major concerns of those who live and work here. To take these concerns forward into action, it is hoped that parishioners with a particular interest in each topic will volunteer to form a separate focus group to tackle each individual issue. There were also many excellent suggestions for community activities and initiatives; it is hoped that some of you will be prepared to give up your time to make these happen. Details can be found within the Neighbourhood Plan Appendices. We remain optimistic that we will be able to present the final plan to Otterton Parish Council and upload onto the village website during the month of October 2019.

The Milk Vending Machine at Otterton Mill is now fully operational and can take both card and cash payments. The software and instructions have been improved for first-time users. Thank you for all your support and feedback so far. Children from *Otterton Primary School* filled bottles to share the local organic milk with their classmates and we were also pleased to gift every family at the school one of the re-usable glass bottles. Bottles are available for £2.50 or bring your own and the machine will dispense into your container of choice, in units of half a litre (up to 5 litres). The milk costs £1.50 a litre and is pasteurised but not homogenised, so it tastes just like milk used to taste!

Have your say on proposals designed to improve visitor access to the East Devon Pebblebed Heaths whilst protecting wildlife and habitats. A consultation will run from 23rd September until 4th November 2019 where we will be asking local people and users of the commons to let us know what they think of plans to improve visitor infrastructure across the heaths. To raise awareness of plastic usage and encourage recycling, whilst keeping our beach looking sublime, we've introduced the 'One Ton Plastic Challenge'. Help us hit our target of plastic collected from the beach and kindly deposit the waste within the large bin adjacent to our new sign on the slipway.

Have you spotted our newest marketing campaign, the #Ladramlorry? A 43-foot transporter travelling around the UK raising awareness of our fantastic 5-star park. The Lorry is owned by Greendale Farm Shop and will be making many 'green' deliveries including collecting paper recycling from the business park and transporting animal feed back to Greendale. Planning is now well underway for season 2020 and will include the installation of new solar panels in the winter to lessen our carbon footprint. These will be fitted to our key facility buildings and it is estimated will save a predicted 171 tonnes/year of CO2!

HISTORY OF OTTERTON......Did you know?

Blacksmiths have not been working in Otterton since 1990. (The earliest recorded in the village was in 1332). Richard Northcott came to work in Otterton in 1812, taking over the forge in 1830. The Northcotts built agricultural and dairy machinery, some of which survives in the Bicton Gardens Rural Museum. They had another forge in Primley Cottage, Bell Street in 1868 to 1899. In 1929 they sold their businesses to the Carters of Budleigh Salterton. The original forge building survives at the junction of Fore Street and Lea Road.
