Dear friends,

So begins a poem by John Clare about the month of October. Summer is behind us and who knows what winter might bring. That seems to induce a strong note of melancholy amongst people. As an introvert given to a melancholic nature all year long all I can say is “welcome!”

For me, melancholy isn't depression; rather it is a state of mind that sees beauty in fragility and vulnerability and can also be the result of harbouring a romantic desire for a perfection in people and relationships that is always elusive.

The truth is that we are all vulnerable and all fragile. ## OTTERTON FILM CLUB

Due to the reduced capacity of the Village Hall, this will be screened on Friday 9th and Saturday 10th October, both at 7.30pm. ## **CLINTON DEVON ESTATES – from Kate Ponting, Countryside Learning Officer**

### **Lower Otter Restoration and other river news**

Visit Countryside Learning at [www.otterton.com](http://www.otterton.com) for details of the Lower Otter Restoration Project's full planning application and your chance to comment.

Last month saw two separate incidents of injured swans on the river. Staff from the *Pebblebed Heaths Conservation Trust (PHCT)* captured an adult cob (male) from the estuary below White Bridge so a vet could repair a serious cut to his oesophagus, caused by a fishing lure. He made remarkable progress and was released less than a week later.

Sadly, soon afterwards a cygnet from the other swan family became entangled in fishing line and was also removed from the river to receive emergency treatment for extensive tissue damage. With its wounds healed and wing function restored, the youngster was returned and quickly accepted by the parent birds. Both birds are being monitored but are recovering well.

A much-needed sweep was arranged to pick up all the litter in the reedbeds and marsh before the winter. Volunteers from the PHCT and the Otter Valley Association recovered 21 bags of glass, metal and plastic, plus a large container of engine oil!
