We have so far held two meetings to discuss the responses and we are using them to strengthen our Neighbourhood Plan where appropriate. The responses and the amended Neighbourhood Plan will be published on the village website at some point in the near future and you will be able to view the changes that have been made.

We had hoped to review all the responses and have the plan ready for formal submission to East Devon District Council by the end of August; however, due to the number of last minute responses received, we have now extended the submission date to October 2019 so that we can do all the responses justice and continue to build on and improve our Neighbourhood Plan.

The Budleigh-Syrian Community Sponsorship is a local charity set up under the government's Community Sponsorship Project to welcome and support a family of Syrian refugees. The charity has satisfied all the government's criteria for this except one - housing. Without guaranteed accommodation, we cannot proceed any further with helping a Syrian family to resettle. We are looking for a two or three bedroom house, flat or annexe - with its own separate entrance -in Budleigh Salterton, East Budleigh, Otterton, Colaton Raleigh or Exmouth at a rental within the East Devon housing rates of £550 to £650 a month for a minimum guaranteed period of three years. Other communities in Devon have successfully helped Syrian families resettle, the nearest being Ottery St Mary. HISTORY OF OTTERTON.....Did you know?

During the early part of the 20th century, Otterton Mill was leased from Clinton Devon Estates by Henry Long, and Albert Rawlings was his Miller. Mr. Long also held Withycombe Mill – its millwheel now resides in Gardens behind the Imperial Hotel, Exmouth. In January 1929 Mr. Long received a letter from the Estate which reads "Mr. Dagworthy wants to fix up some temporary arrangement at the top of the Mill to see how much electricity he can generate off the wheel. This I understand will not interfere in any way with your use of the wheel at the same time, and your man (Bert Rawlings) will be in control as usual". The results of the experiment are not known, but the mind boggles at the fire risk!
