Andrei Rublev's icon of the Trinity recollects the visit of the three visitors to Abraham and Sarah. The Father (on the left) is garbed in blue and wears an outer garment of luminescent gold, an indefinable shade, unearthly and mysterious. The Son (in the middle), though earthly in the deep red-brown of his robe, is shawled in the blue of the heavens and marked with the royal gold of his Father's kingdom. The Holy Spirit is depicted in heavenly blue shrouded with the green of life. The son's eyes are fixed on the Father, interceding his hands raised in blessing on the Chalice and the Father's eyes are fixed on the Son listening. The Spirit awaits, fulfilling his role as the embodiment and articulation of the divine will, his eyes focussed on the chalice of the Eucharistic meal.

way Jesus is as He says in John's gospel "the way the truth and the life" and he asks us to follow Him as the example of a perfect human life. Human depravity, like the poor, will always be with us, but those who find the way to God know that all will be redeemed and we catch glimpses of the kingdom in small things and in small things we can see eternity.
